The Hindu University For Ceylon

President, Hindu Institute of Culture, Jaffna

The arguments for the early establishment of the Hindu University in Ceylon at Jaffna are based on the following:—

1. There is urgent need for the expansion of University facilities in the Island. This has been stressed by the University Council and the Vice-Chancellor of the University in their reports year after year and the Government is fully convinced of the urgent and immediate need to find more University places for the scholars that have qualified and are clamouring for admission to the University.

2. The Government had in its Throne Speeches during the past few years promised the establishment of a Cultural University in the North. In para 361 of its report the University Commission states as follows: "The Government appears to have accepted in principle the setting up of a Cultural University at the premises of the Ramanathan College and Parameswara College." This is substantially correct and Ministry Officials had been at the task of preparing the necessary Bill for the purpose which we are informed, is ready for presentation to the Parliament. Token votes had been provided in the last two Budgets.

3. The University Commission had also at the same time condemned

a. the set up and administrative machinery of the present Universities at Colombo and Peradeniya.

b. the pattern of the Privana Universities as not suitable for the purpose for which they were intended,

and have made definite recommendations for the radical alteration of the statutes of the present University, through the

organisation of a Grants Commission, the absorption of the Cultural Universities into the present Ceylon University in its new form and the establishment of campuses in Jaffna and Galle, to meet the immediate need for expansion.

In the same para i. e. 361 the Commission has also recommended as follows "We consider it desirable that a commencement be made by establishing a campus of the University of Ceylon at or near Jaffna and assisting the Campus to grow up into a University as soon as practicable."

The Commission had also recommended in Chapter VI provisions for the Higher education of the Bhikkus to replace the present Pirivena Universities.

4. While it is not our intention to differ from the recommendations of the Commission we would however stress the following points.

1. the present University needs considering remodelling according to our national needs and indigenous patterns of culture,

2. Higher education has to be enriched by the streams of Buddhist and Hindu Culture if our country has to break away from the domination of foreign ideologies, particularly Marxism.

3. Much greater emphasis has to be placed on Religion both in the State affairs and in Educational matters

4. the contribution from the Hindus of Ceylon would be material and essential for the growth of a United and independent Sri Lanka which could take a proud place in the comity of Nations

5. In the light of the

above considerations we would recommend that

a. an immediate commencement be made with the establishment of the campus of the University in Jaffna in the premises of Parameswara and Ramanathan Colleges

b. every effort should be made to prevent the infiltration of the bad features of the present University into the new campus and for that purpose give it near University status immediately as recommended in para 378 of the Commission Report.

c. Greater stress be placed on Hindu Civilisation, Culture and Religion and for that purpose the whole set up should be dominated by this aspect, as at Benares Hindu University and Annamalai University.

d. Faculties be provided for the Fine Arts, Music and Dancing as at Annamalai University in South India,

e. A Department of Home Science be started as at Nirmala College Coimbatore with stress on Hindu ideals of Home building.

f. A Department of Education be started for the training of teachers on Hindu lines

g. special arrangements be made for the higher Education and training of the Brahmin and Saiva Priesthood on similar lines as for the Bhikkus but with the essential alterations to suit the nature of Hinduism. (A separate memo would be submitted on this subject.)

THIRUKETHEESWARA THIRUPANI

The information that architects from India have again come to Ceylon to continue the reconstruction of one of Ceylon's most ancient and sacred temples, Thiruketheeswaram, is inspiring. This temple is said to be almost coeval with Hinduism as recorded in sacred books. It was so ancient that when Prince Wijaya, came to Ceylon, he found it already venerable and requiring repairs and himself got it repaired.

The onslaught of nature and advent of foreign nations like the Portuguese and Dutch brought destruction to the physical structure of the temple though its glorious sanctity was preserved in the immortal hymns of Thiruganasambantha Swamikal and Sunderamoorthy Swamikal. The pioneer of Hindu religious renaissance, Sri La Sri Arumuga Navalar of revered memory issued a clarion call to the Hindus to restore the temple and laid great stress on its restoration as a source of uplift for the Hindu people. His words were that "Thiruketheeswaram" was a "தேன்குளம்."

One of the founders of the Jaffna Hindu College and of the Jaffna Saiva Paripalana Sabha, Mr. Pasupathy Chettiar was also one who took active and great interest in the holy project. Inspired by the holy Thevaram and by the message of Navalar Peruman, the Nattucottai Chettiar Community in Ceylon with its usual piety displayed in several lands across the seas and with the assistance of other sections of the Hindu Community particularly from Jaffna, built a shrine a few decades ago on the ancient site.

About seventeen years ago, the Thiruketheeswaram Temple Restoration Society was formed as a result of the earlier

inspiration aforesaid and the earnest and persistent reminders of the Jaffna Saiva Paripalana Sabha and the late Shri S. ShivapadaSunderampillai reminding the Hindu public of the importance of the Shrines. The Management of the temple was given over to the Society by the Old and New Cathiresan Temples of Colombo.

The present Head of the Madurai Atheenam, Sri La Sri Somasundara Paramachariya Swamikal with characteristic devotion got the existing edifice repaired and the Kumba Abisheham was performed by one of Ceylon's great religious dignitaries Siva Sri Kumaraswamy Kurukal of Atchuvely

The lay out and plan of the future temple edifice was drawn by leading South India temple architects like Sri Sellakkannu Sthapathier who has now come to Ceylon again and his brother the late Sri Vaithianatha Sthapathier aided by Sri V. M. Narasimham, Engineer and Temple architect, with the advice and guidance of the late Siva Sri Iesana Sivachariya Swamikal of Palani, the eminent Indian Saivite divine and Siva Sri Kumaraswamy kurukal. Useful suggestions were given by the late President of the Restoration Society Shri Shivapathasunderam, the late Senator S. Natesan (Son in law of Sir Ramanathan) and the late Mr. Spencer Rajaratnam, Retired Judge. The Hindus of Malaya, many of whom were old pupils of the late Shri Sivapathasunderam urged by him, formed a Society there for the purpose of contributing their share towards the construction of the temple and have promised to build the Amman Shrine.

It is fervently trusted that the Hindu public (Continued on page 2)

**'CO-OPERATIVE' TO
BE CLEARED OF
ITS CONFUSION**

The noble intention of the founder Co operators several decades ago was as genuine as the theoretical enunciation of communism by the Red prophets of the past. Practice of a theory is liable to deviate far away from the original orbit and to expose itself to the cogent criticism that it had belied the significance of the precept which it was said to be translating into action. The world today woefully witnesses the tragedy of totalitarianism cleverly described as communism.

The Co-operative Movement in Lanka was in the early years of its inauguration a great inspiration to the people. The idea of combined co-operative effort for the common weal soon became a national spirit so much so that even the unexpected conferment of the status of independence on the people of this country was said to have been facilitated by the great strides of progress that was achieved during that period by this movement. It began to develop under the stewardship of the first Ministry and events were shaping exceedingly well till the first 'Coalition' Government of 1956 snatched power from the U.N.P. We do not wish to recapitulate the story of the later happenings lest we might kindle the wrath of the people who are day in and day out learning in the Press startling disclosures about the opening of C. W. E. depots and their closure at the whims and fancies of politicians. It must however be stated that in the North the story has been quite different. Com-

He Reveals the Mystery of Avatar's Incarnations

The Saint of Shirdi, who never left shirdi, had gone in his Sukshma Sarira and materialising himself had spent many hours in Chinchoti and Hyderabad and left a Ramandalu with the Raja of Chinchoti. This subject of extra-corporeal journeys was never explained by the Shirdi Saint since he had to maintain his disguise. We shall here narrate a similar incident in the life of Sri Satya Sai Baba. There was a family at Hospet, well known to Baba since childhood. The eldest sister was a teacher, the brothers were his classmates at Bukkapatnam. They had eard about the manifestation and had visited him at Puttaparthi. It was a year afterwards in 1941 that one evening a bullock cart brought Satya Sai Baba to their door. Their joy knew no bounds. The whole night was spent in talk, Baba lying down with a boy on each side of him, laughing and jeering at all the jokes with which they enlivened the conversation. The mother made preparations for an oil bath for Baba the next day and for a feast, but to her surprise she found in the morning the bed empty and Baba gone! In reality Baba never left Puttaparthi which was a hundred miles away.

Sai Baba of Shirdi from the age of twelve used water for his lamp and the water served the purpose of the oil! Once when Sri Satya went to Bangalore by car, it stopped for want of petrol. He immediately got the driver to bring some water from the neighbouring tank, put his fingers inside it and converted it into Petrol! and he went to his destination normally. On another occasion the plant in the ashram that provides extra current for special festivals stopped working for want of diesel oil. In just the same way Sri Satya converted water into diesel oil!

order viz. Matsya, Kurma, Vanaba, Narasimha, Varaha, Parasurama, Rama, Balarama, Krishna, and Kalki. Bhagavat Purana has 3 lists of incarnations in each of which Buddha's name also is found. Incidentally it may be mentioned that these are all Vaishnavites and do not include the Avatars of Saiva Siddhanta Shastras who it must be observed were not born of a human mother. So we shall confine ourselves to the Vaishnava avatars. In Vishnu Purana the following account of Kalki avatar is given, "when the practices taught by the Vedas and the Institutes of Law shall have nearly ceased and the close of the Kali Yuga shall be nigh, an aspect of the Divine Being who exists of his own spiritual nature in the character of Brahman (பரப்பிரகன்) and even in the beginning and the end.....shall descend upon earth. He will be born in the family of Vishnu Yashas, an eminent brahmin of Shambala.....endowed with the eight superhuman powers. By his irresistible might he will destroy all whose minds are devoted to iniquity. He will then re-establish righteousness upon earth; and the minds of those who live at the end of the (Kali) age shall be awakened and shall be pellucid as crystal, (i.e. clairvoyant). The men who are thus changed by virtue of the peculiar time shall be as the seeds of human beings (the survivors of the future cataclysm) and shall give birth to a race who shall follow the laws of Kreta (or Satya) Yuga, or golden age" as translated by Wilson. The word Shambala is identical with Sveta Dvipa or White Island, the abode of Vishnu even as Kailas is said to be the abode of Shiva. Sri Satya declared at the age of 14 that Sai Baba of Shirdi was of Bharadwaja gothiram and apas-thamba Satram and the details of his birth are given earlier. Sri Satya's parents were Vaishnavites.

A few years ago in California one morning a 'sun' (in addition to the usual sun) appeared in the
