THE NATIONAL SYSTEM OF EDUCATION

Higher Education for Hindu Priests

Buddhist Universities and Pirivenas formed an integral part of the educational system in Buddhist India. The opposite number of these institutions in Hindu India were the big Temple Colleges and Padasalas attached to the bigger religious foundations and temples in South India.

The above was reflected in the set up of Society in Ceylon also. Pirivenas flourished in South Ceylon and it is a credit to the Sangha that they survived even during the darkest days of foreign occupation. These institutions were essentially meant for the training of young Bhikkus in accordance with the Buddha's Teaching so that they would prove to be worthy members of the Sangha. The Government made its first contribution to Pirivena Education in 1875 for the purpose of enriching Oriental Scholarship in Ceylon.

Temple Schools flourished in North Ceylon and in South India. They languished in Jaffna under the foreign occupation and towards the latter period survived as stray institutions attached to the residences of learned priests attached to the temples. They received no assistance from the state. It was at this time that there appeared the great Hindu Revivalist Sri La Sri Arumuga Navalar. The Missions had organised a large number of schools and controlled education in the area. They actively opposed any assistance by the State to the starting of Hindu educational institutions. It was in the face of this opposition that the great Navalar started the Navalar Trust and the Navalar School for the revival of Hindu Education both for the priests and the laymen. The work was stupendous. He had to provide for the training of Priests and their education, as well as for the education of the

youth at the ordinary level, competing with the schools established by the Missions but with the proper Hindu background. Its main purposes were the promotion and propagation of the Saiva faith and the advancement of Tamil learning. Education was imparted free. It was later that the school was in receipt of government aid and was caught in the strait jacket of the lay school. The trustees provided for the education of the Priesthood and higher religious learning by the organisation of classes in Sanskrit and the Siddhanta Shastra during the week end. These classes disappeared under the late trustees until the school was taken over and administered by the Department along with Trust by a special Trust Board appointed by it with the Assistant Director as its Head. An effort is now being made to revive them,

The need now arises for the following

a. Higher Education in the Hindu Shastras and Culture.

b. The training of Brahmin Youth for the more effective performance of their duties

The Government has undertaken the first by provision of religious education at all levels from the Infant Class to the University. Provision has to be made for the training of the Hindu Priests who have the very important duty of meeting the religious needs of Society and keeping Hindu Religion, fresh and living in the country

The Universities Commission 1963 had devoted considerable attention to the Higher Education of the Bhikku vide Chapter VI of the Report. They had planned an Institute of Higher Learning for the Bhikkus with a special ad hoc advisory Committee for the purpose. It is presumed that in accordance with the National policy these suggestions

would materialise in due course.

We would plead for similar provision 'mutatis mutandis' for the Hindu Priesthood in the New Education Bill contemplated by the Government. A special commission composed of Hindus may be established for the purpose.

As an interim measure we suggest the following for immediate approval and action. As indicated above the Navalar trust was established for Hindu Education at all stages. The training of the Hindu priesthood for the more effective propagation of the Hindu faith was part of the purpose of the Trust.

SRI SATYA SAI BABA

HIS TEACHINGS

He has caustic remarks to make about gurus. He categorically states that only an Avatar has the right to say "I am God". The others just haven't that right. Let us examine the great truth embodied in this sweeping assertion. Socrates was a great American Philosopher. He seemed to have realised in a great measure that he was the eternal undying soul; he was almost notorious for stand-

ing not infrequently on the road or in the office for days and nights lost to the outer world in contemplation. Was he in Nirvikalpa Samadhi or just in very deep concentration? He was bold enough to take the draught of poison offered to him, but he died! Sri Satya was given poison but he did not die. What is the difference? Jesus would have declared that Socrates had not entered the Kingdom of God (Salokya Kingdom) however honest he might have been. A true philosopher is different from a true gnani, who has obtained the grace of Good.

A great Swami told the writer that he once had God-consciousness on the physical plane continuously for six months. He lost it but would get it later in flashes. According to Sri Satya Prakriti and Purushottama are not separable in as much as sweetness is not separable from sugar. He speaks from personal knowledge and not from shastras. Purushottama (God) had removed Maya (Prakriti) from this bhakta for the period of six months only.

It is His will. It is also not in the power of a bhakta to change his grace. Complete Sayujya is for the Purushottama to give and is not obtainable by human effort. This is an important teaching

In 1945 the writer, when he went for dharsanam to Ramana Rishi, asked him why a certain great saint suffered much from cancer, at which the Rishi in contempt quipped "Did his atma suffer". He was reminded that even a murdered man's atma does not suffer pain. He began to think, he got, excited, a phenomenon I learnt unknown in Ramana's life. Dr. Radhakrishnan, who was then not in the present elevated office, had just entered the hall with his family to get the rishi's blessings on the eve of his visit to Oxford. The Rishi tried to explain that the saint's tapas would have stopped the feeling of pain even as chloroform. The writer didn't proceed further since he knew more of chloroform than the rishi. It is indeed strange that one month later Ramana himself developed cancer. The writer, learnt after a few years that the saint referred to earlier had cancer, since he took upon himself the sins of a well known dramatist and playwright of his time.

In contrast to this, Swami Yogar of Jaffna was a very powerful yogi with great siddhis. He once had cancer in his chin. He cured it by his yogic powers. He did it so cleverly that many of his devotees were unaware that he even had this illness. But in his last days he suffered from a fracture in the neck of his left femur (thigh bone). He suffered much from the pain, and he told us so. He had also confided to a friend of mine, who was a great devotee that he (swami) had taken

MINISTERS— AS MESSENGERS OF GOODWILL

The National Government under the benign guidance of the Leader of the U. N. P by now must be having a feeling of self confidence judging from the reciprocity that was expressed in the cordial welcome extended to the Ministers who toured the North during the past few weeks. With the eagerly awaited visit of the Minister of Education to Jaffna today the sincerity of purpose of the Dudley Senanayake Government to work for the national welfare of the country can be readily seen.

The choice of Mr. I. M. R. A. Iriyagolle as Minister of Education was hailed as a prudent move by the Premier to undo the political mischief that had been carried out by the previous Government in the field of education. Within the all too short space of four months of administration, Minister Iriyagolle has earned the approbation of all patriotic citizens of this country, the frownings of the frustrated S.L.F.P.—L.S.S.P.—C.P. Coalition notwith-

standing, by his clear understanding of the complex problem and common sense approach to the situation. The people are the judge of what the Ministers are doing. And when the full period of the National Government is covered the verdict of the country will be a vote of complete confidence in the ability of the Dudley Senanayake Cabinet to place the national interest above personal ambition.

The Minister of Education can well expect the whole weight of public opinion to back his schemes such as the national system of education, the expansion and extension of the University by setting up campuses in important cities and above all the positive planning of education to meet the problem of unemployment.

We are particularly glad to extend to Mr Iriyagolle a cordial welcome to the Peninsular land of the Palmyrah where the yearning for education has been a traditional cultural trait. The Minister's recommendation that a Campus of the University should be set up at Parameshwara College indicates his keen insight into the circumstances that determine the educational needs of this area and appreciation of the cultural progress of the North. It is gratifying to recall to memory the dreams of that revered patriot Sir Ponnambalam Ramanathan when he established the educational institution after the hallowed name of Parameshwara providing for its conversion in the course of time into a full-fledged University.

It is to be hoped that the visit of the Minister of Education will inaugurate a new era in the educational history of the North where the illustrious educationists of the past, Sri la Sri Arumuga Navalar Sir P Ramanathan, the founders of the Saiva Paripalana Sabai and the Jaffna Hindu College, and the other leading denominational institutions of public instruction had with prophetic vision laid the foundation for educational progress. That Mr. Iriyagolle represents the truly national aspect of culture and education is borne out by his scholastic achievements as author and journalist and by his able organisation of educational and cultural movements. Education is safe in his able hands.

education Act for the religious education of the laymen in the normal schools in the area as part of the responsibility of the state. The need arises for the provision of training facilities and education for the priesthood. The Naval school at Vannarponnai receives the same aid as any other school from the Department. The entirety of the Trust funds may be released for the purpose of conducting a Veda Agama Padasalai for the more effective training of the Hindu Priesthood which is being done at present in a desultory haphazard way by an apprenticeship system in the temples. The present Trust Board which has in it at present, Brahma Shree Coomaraswamy Kurukkal, may be further strengthened by the nomination of two more priests qualified in the Shastras and the trust entrusted with the task of organising a Veda Agama Padasalai in accordance with the highest traditions of the Hindu religion.

Recommendations— Summary

- 1 A commission may be appointed to report on the Higher Education of the Hindu Priest hood and legal provision may be made for same.
2 The funds of the Naval Trust may be released in its entirety for the establishment of a Veda Agama Padasalai in the same premises or elsewhere according to its feasibility.
3 Provision may be made for the subsidising of this Institution on the same lines as the assistance given to Bhikku Training Centres at present. "Agastiyar"

on the sins of a devotee of his, giving his name and the circumstances under which he took on himself his sins

Sri Sathya also takes upon himself the sin of others. In fact it is his perennial solicitation and teaching that we should all offer our sins at his feet and take back from him his health, happiness (ananda) and Sakti. Aurobindo who preached integral yoga all his life maintained that the old school of saints neglected the physical body and concentrated themselves on the spirit. Aurobindo instructed his disciples to bring down not only the ananda but also the power of the spirit to the physical body. He held the view that the experience of Nirvikalpa Samadhi is not the end and goal of life. It is only a stage in the attainment of the supramental life, in which illness will be still living with us if he had consented to be operated upon by a first disciple an eminent Bengalee surgeon, but he took the view that if his life-long tapas could not prevent that illness he would prefer to let that body die, and so he did.

The writer is an eye-witness to a most peaceful death of a Roman Catholic lady. She was just talking to us when she passed away. There was no illness, no pain not even a last gasp. Devotion to God seems to be the prime factor in bringing about this consummation Sri Satya emphasises that we should surrender ourselves to God. "Take refuge in me" are the resounding words in the Gita and in Sri Satya's teaching. He is invariably present in his Sukshma Sarira when a devotee passes away. Not infrequently he creaks holy ash and blesses the devotee's forehead with it. He also promises that there will be no further incarnation for such a devotee This may sound as strange to us as the words of Jesus uttered in the presence of Phariseus "Thy sins be forgiven thee."

Sri Sathya instructs as not to make the mistake of giving a guru a status higher than what is due to him. "Respect the Guru as the person who shews you the path, who looks after your progress, and who is interested in your welfare: that is all. Do not take the Guru to be the all inclusive and all powerful God"
