Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba

Behold the Hope of the World

Among the hundreds of photos and pictures created then and there by Bhagavan Satya is one which is unique. It is a photo of Sri Ramakrishna with a smaller one situated just over his heart of Sri Sai Baba of Shirdi; there is also another of our present avatar located over the breast of Shirdi Sai Baba. Thus we see three great ones in one photo! When Sri Ramakrishna had his Mahasamadhi in 1886 Sri Sai Baba of Shirdi was of middle age and a most interesting episode took place in his life. He was then not so well known as after 1903. He told a disciple of his to look after his (Sai's) body for three days and that he should bury it if he did not open his eyes after that period. He did open his eyes and continued to lead his miraculous life till his Mahasamadhi in 1918. The disciple had thought that his master was very ill and that by his yogic powers he had cured himself. What really happened was that Sri Sai Baba of Shirdi was at devotees' houses, having materialised his Sukshma Sarira in different parts of India during those three days. He had done it quite often as revealed to us by Bhagavan Sathya.

The ways and methods God almighty adopts to bless us are mysterious. Ours is to receive Him most wholeheartedly and exert our utmost to follow his teachings. Bhagavan Sathya has promised to give us the necessary strength to fulfil our attempts. We are indeed most thankful to him for this assurance. Bhagavan wants us to cultivate hunger for God by regular sadhana. Just as the rays of the sun burn cotton that is placed at the focus of convex lens facing the sun, so should we pray for the

grace of God which when concentrated in us will burn and destroy the mind and shed lustre on the buddhi. It is mind that makes man miserable. It pretends to be chaitanya or consciousness, whereas it is jada asat or unconsciousness. Ramakrishna's teaching is that our hunger for God should be as great as the hunger for air of a man who is forcibly held under water.

A group of his devotees in Ceylon have prayed and written to him for a visit to us and we learn that on his way to South Africa in August or September he will bless us with his presence in Ceylon.

Sai Baba of Shirdi tells us in his own characteristic way and in a language so difficult to understand [Lithuanian] that when he first met his guru the latter took him to a well and tied him to a pole inside the well with his head down and the feet up so that the head was just a foot above the water! and when the Guru returned a few hours later and enquired how he was feeling he replied that he was all bliss; so his guru freed him and advised him to look at his face always and that was the only teaching he had from his Guru. It must be remembered that Sai Baba of Shirdi was the previous incarnation of Bhagavan Sathya Sai and that the former had in reality no human guru. Though he claimed to be and was an avatar of God he puts his teachings in such a strange way—words of an avatar in disguise. Bhagavan Sathya also advises us to remember his face always, and that we should look on him as present in all beings. To drive this truth home these two avatars taught by example in the following telling

ways. Sai Baba of Shirdi was once invited by a devotee for dinner. He went as a cat, but the lady, not recognising her guru in the cat chased it away and wrote the next day lamenting his absence. The reply was that he attended the dinner in the form of the cat, that was chased away! Bhagavan Sathya gives us examples like the following. Sathya and about a dozen of his devotees were busily engaged in scissoring the pairs of dhoties into singles, preliminary to their being distributed to the poor during Navarathri. Suddenly Baba asked "Parasarathi, you think I am only here now with you cutting this cloth? Do you know I had been to Madras just now to see your Kusa? The little fellow developed diphtheria and your brother has taken him to the hospital. Don't worry my dear fellow, I have given him dharsan, he will be alright soon."

An avatar has seven characteristics viz. Aiswarya, Keerthi, Jnana, Vairagya, Srishti, Sthithi and Longa 'Longa' is here used to denote the work of transformation more than of destruction. These characteristics are given by Bhagavan Sri Sathya as well as by Vaishnava Shastras. In Vishnu Purana Sri Krishna is described as an Amsa Avatar i.e. His manifestation as an Avatar was only partial! Mrs. Annie Besant called Sri Krishna a poorna or full fledged Avatar.

In Kularnava Tantra it is said that a real guru refuses mukti till every disciple of his has also attained Mukti. It is indeed a great consolation to us. Bhagavan Sathya makes it a point to be present at the passing away of his disciples: he does so either in the physical body or in his sukshma sarira or in the materialised sukshma sarira. Often he gives holy ash or Ganges water. He not only makes the exit from this world pleasant but also gives us the avatar's assurance that in every case where he is present there will be no more birth for that soul.

KATARAGAMA

The reported desire of the Government to remove the Madalayams at Kataragama from their present site is unsound. As has been stressed often, the Madalayams are religious institutions and promote and serve the cause of religion and their removal would detract from the sanctity of the place.

Objections have been raised repeatedly to the proposal to shift the Madalayams. The subject deserves immediate intervention by Parliament. It is trusted that Members of Parliament would move in the matter without delay.

The proposal to shift the Madalayams is ill-conceived and unnecessary. If it is desired to make the sacred place better fitted for purposes of worship, the present proposal would defeat that very object. The one and only just solution is to set up an Improvement Board to supervise the Madalayams and their management so as to make them conform to standards of cleanliness, safety and other conditions more conducive to the religious sanctity of the place instead of removing them. The Middle Path enunciated by Lord Buddha if applied in this matter will result in the Madalayams being not removed from their present site but in steps being taken to improve them. Such an arrangement would be in time with the prevailing peaceful and harmonious atmosphere and further promote national unity.

It is for the people and religious associations and political parties again to make representation to Parliament and the Government and the Opposition Parties, in addition to offering prayers to the deities to bring about

the necessary consummation.

It is good to remember that the Kataragama deities were worshipped by Hindus from time immemorial before the coming of Lord Buddha and Prince Wijaya to Ceylon and that Hindus are only asking for their religious rights to enable them to perform their religious duties.

PARANIRUPASINGHAN & SANKILY

King Pararajasingham had reached senescence, and consequently appointed his son Singhabahu to conduct the affairs of the state as his representative. Sangily who had his own ideas to be the king, caused Sinhabahu to be poisoned. Nobody at that time was aware of the diabolical deed of Sangily. Then King Pararajasekaran appointed his second son Pandaram, as his representative and went on a pilgrimage to South India, in order to console his sorrow.

It was the time of the Maha Makam festival at Kumbakonam in the heart of the Chola country. Sankily was riding in a chariot, and the king of the Chola country also was coming in front of Sankily; Sankily imperiously sat on the chariot, without allowing the Chola king's chariot the right of way and asking the king to give him right of way. This incensed the Chola king, and he sent Sangily to prison. Pararajasekaran on hearing this incident requested the chola king to free him. The chola king was so incensed by Sankily's insolence, that he bade Pararajasekaran also to be put in gaol.

ed their campaign to poison the minds of the public. The utterances of Mrs. Srimavo Bandaranaike and Dr. N. M. Perera are unworthy of political leadership and require to be taken serious notice of by the public. The vicious circle that is moving uneasily on the axis of ambition must be exposed to public scrutiny. Only a frank expression of public opinion can silence the disgruntled desperados of the Coalition.

Pararajasekaram, collected a force and challenged the Chola king for a fight. Three days they fought. On the fourth day, although wounded in three places Pararajasingham displayed such traits of bravery, that he was able to send the Chola king into prison, and rescue his father and brother from prison. After three months waiting there and healing his wounds the Chola king was made to pay tribute to the king Pararajasekaran and was set free. Pararajasingham returned laden with spoils. It would seem that the Chola king paid tribute for a long time.

Paranirupasinghan - The Ruler of Seven Villages.

Pararajasekaran after he returned to Nallur, rewarded Paranirupasinghan with the gifts of seven villages, namely Kalliyankadu, Sandilipay, Araly, Achevely, Uduppiddy, Kachcheri, and Mallakam and granted him a copper plate where it was stated that he was made ruler of these villages with all royal honours. This inflamed the jealousy of Sankily who concealed his true nature.

A Jaffna King - Cum - Physician Cures a Sinhalese Queen

Paranirupasinghan was a great physician. The Sinhalese king of Kandy, having heard of Paranirupasinghan's fame invited the court of Jaffna, to send him to attend on his Queen, who was laid down with gout which defied all medical treatment. With a single medicine, Paranirupasinghan cured the queen completely. The Sinhalese king was so pleased with Paranirupasinghan that he praised him and awarded him the title of "Vaidya Rajendiran". He was given many gifts such as elephants and a palanquin studded with gems.
