Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba

Behold the Hope of the World

Now let us take the characteristics of an avatar and verify for ourselves that Bhagavan Sri Sathya has them in full measure. He is an embodiment of Aishwarya (literally riches). By the wave of his hand he gets in a jiffy anything he wants. If he wants to present a Saiva artist he gets down a golden ring for appropriate ornament, with the figure of Shiva embossed on it. If a Vaishnavite artist the figure will be that of Sri Krishna. He gets down most expensive jewels and sarees for his devotees. When he went with his devotees to Cape Comorin the waters of the ocean greeted him with a pearl chain thrown by the waves around his hallowed feet. Among the many miracles wrought there special mention must be made of his bringing the nose-stud said to have been on the vigraham of the devi and the brilliance which was a source of great attraction to the passing ships Swamy brought it by just digging into the sand. The precious stone was as big as a nelli fruit. After every one had satiated his eyes with its lustre. Baba sent it back to where it came from. There is no treasure hidden from his eyes nor any which he cannot get. We shall cite another example to illustrate it, when he went to Badrinath he got down by the wave of his hand a small netra lingam which was brought by Adi Shankaracharya from Kailas to this shrine and kept hidden. Rays of white brilliance emanate from the netra or eye of the Shivalingam Krishnaswamy Rao, a governor of a North Indian province, a great devotee of Baba, was asked to perform the abhisekam and puja. Baba got down Ganges water and special flowers from Kai-

las for the puja. No one seems to know of the esoteric life of the great Shankaracharya. We have read of visits to Kailas by eminent Swamis but not one has told us about Shivalingams at this most holy centre! After the puja he sent back the lingam to where it came from. Another notable feature is that whenever feeding is to take place he does it himself, because the basket of food is always full when he puts his hands into it; it will go round to feed a five-thousand with ease. He has told us that he can transform the earth into the sky and the sky into earth if he wants. His keerthi or fame had already begun before his declaration of his Ministry. A fifty thousand audience is not uncommon. He is wanted everywhere. His gnana covers everything of spirituality. When in his private interview, he spoke of a very special vision Swamy Sadananda, of the Divine Life Society, had in his early years of Sadhana. Swamy Sadananda was surprised beyond measure. He queried "How did you know it since you were not born then?" The reply was "What birth and death for me?" He is eternal. In his previous birth as Sai Baba of Shirdi he used to give concrete instances of Rebirth. Once when a mother wated Shirdi Sai Baba to bring back to life his dead child (Baba had just then done that miracle of bringing to life another dead child) he replied that the soul had already entered another body and it is most unfair to take the life out of the new body. The consciousness of God is present in Bhagavan Sathya always and in full measure! His creations are too numerous for repetition here and no

Letter to the Editor.

Ministerial- Utterances

Sir,—In a recent speech of his made at Kayts the Minister of Local Government had stated that within a period of two years Tamil shall be the language of administration in the North and East. The Prime Minister on the other hand has repeatedly emphasised that all that the National Govt. would do is to implement the so called Reasonable Use of Tamil act, hitherto kept in cold storage, through Treasury circulars. In other words there will be no fresh legislation on the subject all that will take place is that some already existing legislation will be given administrative effect. At best there is room to hope that within limits Tamil will be used at translation level.

The provisions of the Reasonable Use of Tamil Act do not supercede any section of the Sinhalese Only Act which states clearly that Sinhalese shall be the one and only official language throughout Ceylon. Without prejudice to this status of Sinhalese Tamil will be allowed to operate in the North and East. This is not the same thing as Tamil being the one and only language of administration in the North and East. However it must be admitted that the National Govt. is sincere about doing at least something for the Tamils regarding their language. In return the Tamils are expected to co-operate in the arrangements to be made for the use of Sinhalese in the North and East.

These words of duplicity deceived Paranirupasinghan. He unsheathed his sword, and announced that his son Paranirupasinghan was henceforth the king of the seven villages, and

Paranirupasinghan was no more to receive half of the royal revenue of the kingdom, as was his right. But he was given an honorarium for being Sankily's Minister. The captains of the army, were heavily bribed and they were silenced by honeyed deceitful expressions by Sankily.

Great was the sorrow of Pararajasingham the old king, and Paranirupasinghan and his son Pararajasekaran, at the unexpected turn of events. Consequently Paranirupasinghan sent a letter to the Chola king, and asked him not to send tributes anymore to Sankily the king of Jaffna. The Chola king, (possibly should have been Acchudappan according to the Tanjore Gazetteer) was very glad indeed. It is said that Acchudappan fought with "Paraseekar" at Negapatam according to an inscription. It is very likely that those who wrote the inscription, have written "Paraseekar" instead of Pararajasekaran.

BACK TO THE EARTH BUDGET

The depressing influence of the political party that held sway since the fall of the U. N. P Government in 1956 and the totalitarian turn that was ushered in by the Coalition of 1964 had made the people view budgets with trepidation so much that when the National Government presented the first Budget this week the sigh of relief was quickly in evidence everywhere.

Bridging the gap or the deficit between income and expenditure is not the main criterion to judge the quality of the budget. The approach to the economic problem as it affects the people and the resulting impact on the progress of the nation are the really important aspects that a successful budget-maker must deal with.

The Treasury coffers were not depleted but were almost empty. Any new Government would have been scared away. But the purpose of the formation of the National Government was to salvage the country from the serious set-back into which it had been forced by the power-hungry leaders of the party at the helm of affairs from 1956-1964.

Public Holidays

Vivekananda Society Proposals

1. The Society is of opinion that the following should be declared as Public Holidays having regard to the religious importance, sentiment, opinion and requirements of Hindus:-

- Thai Pongal (now a Public Holiday)
Maha Sivaraththiri (was a Public Holiday earlier)
The day following Maha Sivaraththiri Chiththirai Paruvam (Full Moon)
Hindu New Year Day (now a Public Holiday)
Adi Amavasai (was a Public Holiday earlier)
Deepavali (now a Public Holiday)
Vijayathasami
Thirukarthikai (Full Moon)

2. Paruvam (full moon) and Amavasai (new moon) days have been considered very sacred by the Hindus from time immemorial. They are days of fasting and of religious worship and meditation. Prior to the advent of the Portuguese, these sacred days were rigidly observed by the Hindus. Subsequently as a result of foreign domination important changes took place and the Hindus were unable to continue to discharge their religious duties properly.

3. Fridays are all-important for the Hindus for purposes of worship throughout the year in the same manner as Poya Days to Buddhists, Sundays to Christians and Fridays to Muslims. Hindus are enjoined to worship at Temples on every Friday, even if they are unable to go to the temples daily.

4. A summary of these representations is as follows:-

NOTE 1.—Should you apprehend that your witness will not attend of their own accord you can have a summons from this Court to compel the attendance of any witness and production of any document you have a right to call on any witness to produce by applying to the Court at any reasonable time before trial, and depositing necessary subsistence money.

NOTE 2.—If you admit you should pay the money into Court with the costs to this action to avoid the summary execution of the decree which may be made against your person or property, or both if necessary.
