Behold the Hope of the World

In spite of all the riches of this earth at his feet he desires to earn a living by being our driver; and what is his earning? It is the joy of seeing the present unmanifested God-head in our hearts blossom forth into the full-fledged all embracing Paramatma. His profession is Somathana-Sarathi. He beckons to us for our permission to be our sarathi (driver). Apart from these seven characteristics he has in his last birth as Shirdi Sai Baba shown himself as Shiva, Rama, Krishna, Panduranga etc to his devotees. Our Bhagavan Sri Sathya has transformed himself not only as the Dasa avatars including Rama, Krishna and Kalki but also as Jyotir Padmanabha Shiva, Ganesha, Luxmi, Parvati, Kali, Saraswathi and Annapurani and a few other God-heads; in short he shows himself as the Ishta deva of the devotee concerned. What more tangible proof is needed? We shall go the way of Duryodhanan, Surapadman and Ravana if we do not cleanse our hearts, and try our best to look upon him with the twin eyes of viveka and vairagya. When Skanda shewed his Viswarupa Form to Surapadman he believed it first but later called it hypnotism. So did Ravana. But Arjuna believed for all time Krishna when he shewed himself in his Viswarupa Form, but begged of him to give up the terrible form and take up the human form! Bhagavan has come to us. Let us all receive him with open arms and put our best efforts to serve and follow him.

Swami Sadananda a senior and advanced Sannyasin of the Divine Life Society witnessed many a divine event in Babaji's

life. He told his fellow sannyasins at Ananda Kutir that Baba can roam at will through Atma loka, Prana loka and Jiva loka and therefore he can reveal whatever happens anywhere at any time and that he is a Sarvasakra. Babaji at Sivanandanagar (Head quarters of Divine Life Society) while giving the meaning of the word Bhagavan said that Bha meant creation, Ga meant protection and Va meant change or transformation. He avoids the word destruction. Sri Subbaramiah President of the Divine Life Society, Venkatagiri was present at Vasishta (cave) Guha when Babaji gave darsan of Jyotir Padmanabha to old Swami Purushotmananda. Only Baba and the aged Swami were closette in the room. The others were asked to go out. Sri Subbaramiah describes the incident thus "I was standing near the entrance to the cave. I could see what was happening. Baba placed his head on the lap of Swami Purushotmananda and laid himself down. Suddenly his entire body was bathed in divine brilliance. His head and face appeared to me to have increased very much in size. Rays of splendour emanated from his face. I was overwhelmed with a strange inexplicable joy. The time was about 10 p. m."

Aurobindo had preached all his life about the future super-man. Bhagavan is not only a superman but a maker of supermen. He had planted a banyan tree in the Tapavanam of his ashram in Puttaparthi and buried underneath it two yantras (Copper Plates of sizes 15 inches by 10 inches) created by him. THE TRUTH I KNOW

SRI-LA-SRI PANRIMALAI SWAMIGAL

The universe and its inhabitants live and exist by the grace of the Omnipresent and Omnipotent Divinity which not only vibrates the universe but is itself vibrant.

To the extent to which man's mind is attuned towards Divinity he becomes refined. To the extent to which a man's mind leans towards and merges with God, he gets the divine grace which enables him to overcome the cycle of births and deaths. It is only by Divine grace that man attains the stage of perfection and gets endowed with the glorious innumerable powers of God.

Bhakti or devotion takes a man to His Grace. To cognise devotion one needs inner purity. This inner purity begets inner strength. Once this inner strength is attained, discrimination, dispassion, compassion, service to the noble, divine association, divine society, singing of God's name, truth etc. follow. Still better aspects are visible in those pure and good-natured bhaktas who do not have even a tinge of lust or desire for wealth. Those who have attained

Milk and water mix freely but butter taken from milk does not mix with water. It floats. Similarly the soul which has attained Realization will not be affected by association with ill-natured and imperfect beings.

One who has attained the knowledge that Nature (Prakriti) and Self (Atman) are unified with Brahman (Cosmic Consciousness), will not lay himself to be bound by virtue and vice.

When Yogis, mindfully bestow mercy, the doors of Yogic stages are automatically flung open without one's own effort. This is a truth worth knowing. To realize that eternal, basic and permanent state which is beyond birth and death and therefore deathless and birthless, should be the high, exalted and ultimate goal of human life. May one and all strive to achieve this goal by the grace of the Almighty!

(Extracts from an address by His Excellency Dr. Bhimsen Sachar, High Commissioner for India in Ceylon to the Vivekananda Society, Colombo on "The Way to Peace.")

Man is peace hungry. His search for peace has been typified by the search for peace of such mighty royal personages as Rama and Siddhartha. They have decried the emptiness of sensuous pleasures and confirmed from personal experience that true happiness consists in self-realisation; another way of saying that true happiness consists in God realisation. But to realise God is no joke. The journey to this destination is almost endless. Should this then deter us from launching upon it? Certainly not unless we abandon our goal. Our task therefore consists in giving proper direction to our thoughts, feelings and will. We have to subordinate the material to the spiritual. This cannot be done unless we have faith in the view that the main spring of all bliss is He and therefore we have to cultivate Him. We have to endeavour to sit at His feet. Once in His presence, the scene changes. No more of the mundane. The fleeting joys yield place to bliss eternal. You enjoy the security of a baby in its mother's invincible arms. No protection is greater than the protection of a

The journey is long and arduous. It may take a person innumerable lives to complete. But that should not matter. The journey is a continuity. There are no breaks in it. You do not have to begin anew if the journey once commenced is not completed in that life time. The achievements are not lost. They accumulate and become a part of you. You carry them with you on your onward march. This sublime assurance has been repeated to us by the Shrimad Bhagavat-gita. Nothing is wasted. Nothing is lost. Your gains are accumulated with compound interest. In spite of this assurance human beings—trail, unsteady and unbelieving—break under the strain of the journey and, more often than not, abandon the celestial road and fall headlong into the precipice of sensuous enjoyments. They are tossed on the ocean of life crying for help, but help for them is not. They are too far removed from the shore. The path of realisation is very exacting. It commands your complete dedication. You cannot play with it anymore than you can play with the solution of a problem
