Subordinate The Material To The Spiritual

(Continued from last issue)

(Extracts from an address by His Excellency Dr. Bhimsen Sachar, High Commissioner for India in Ceylon to the Vivekananda Society, Colombo on "The Way to Peace.")

For a SADAKA, it should create no problem. He cannot, with a jump, reach the destination. He has to cover it step by step. Every step in that direction effects a change in him. The accumulated experience helps in further acquisitions. Gradually, but surely, he moves up towards the outstretched arms of Him, that is He, I, You, the Universe, the Sun, the Moon, the Stars, the Wind, the Water. Whatever meets the eye is He. It is His manifestation and to Him who becomes a part of the Great Reality there is no sorrow, no suffering, no privation, no trouble, no tribulation. It is all joy. For, he is a part of joy personified.

It is this realisation which also spells the unity of humanity. Even when we have not reached the final stage, we must not allow ourselves to forget the great secret, a secret divulged to us by those who have seen beyond, that humanity is one. It is inseparable. It is indivisible. You can no more play with it than you do with your life. Anything done to a part affects the whole. You and I and everyone of us are parts of that great whole. We can forget this lesson, this truth, only at our own peril. And so long as the world does not realise this great truth, there cannot be peace. Their conflicts and strifes shall continue, bedevilling our lives. Material possessions may grow. Mechanical contrivances may multiply. Distances may shrink. Speed may increase. But unless the desire to become one with humanity, to become one with the rest of the universe, flourishes in all individual, the peace we strive for will not come. Lea-

ving alone the peace of the individual soul that has found its destination, the ordinary peace of the man on earth will never be realised unless man shares something of this great truth and tries to translate it in his day to day dealings. Hatred must give place to love. Jealousy and envy must change, must surrender, in favour of benevolence and unselfishness. Kindness, consideration and kinship must occupy their rightful place. Narrow-mindedness and prejudice shall have to be discarded in favour of the large heartedness of the man of vision for whom there is no strangeness. All that lives and moves and breathes is a part of him as much as he is a part of them. This consciousness must grow. This consciousness of unity must flourish. When it blossoms, it will spread its fragrance all round. Not then will there be any fear or a desire for revenge. It may be distant cry. But this is the goal towards which humanity must march.

And, in the meantime, those who believe in the triumph of the spirit over the body must march resolutely and with determination, with faith in the teachings of our great seers and with faith in God, spreading true knowledge. To the extent this knowledge spreads, to that extent is the hope of the world. For, our ultimate redemption is in our hands. It is the individual consciousness that must spark. The individual is the basis of the universe. In fact the universe is the individual. It takes its hue from him. It shares the character of the individual. The individual is, therefore, the object of our attention. Our efforts, our plans, our programmes, our projects are all for the uplift of the individual. It is, therefore, that Swami Vivekananda said "Individuality is my motto. I have

no ambition beyond training individuals". We have therefore to carry forward with faithfulness that great message of the divine seer. The individual is our trust. We must do all we can to raise the individual to his destined place.

The individual again is the only guarantee against further deterioration of the world. The greater the number of individuals who believe in the divine destiny of man, the greater will be the check on the waywardness and insanity of those in control of the affairs of the world. There is no other way but this to check the spread of that insanity which is gripping the soul of the mundane man. In this field numbers do not count. What matters is the quality of the apostles of peace. One single man of peace—yes, one single man—may well serve to open the floodgates of discrimination in those who come in touch with him. The task therefore is to create conditions for the growth and development of the seekers after truth. These seekers will certainly be of this world. The world as it is will have no attraction for them. For them the world would not exist. Their world will be of a different category. But this does not mean that like a recluse they will run away from the world. They will be very much in this world. Only they will not be of it. They will stand out like a lotus, untouched by the mud out of which it grows. They will be actors first and last. But their actions will not touch the purity of their soul. For they will feel detached with the serenity of a non-doer and a non-enjoyer. For them the main spring of action is not themselves but something else. And that something else is not they. They are separate from and far above what prompts actions. Not for them the sorrows and the joys, the love and the hate, the likes and the dislikes, the profits and the losses, the separations and the unions. They see reality with the eye of Discrimination. They press

Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba and Yoga Nidra

(By Dr. T. NALLAINATHAN)

We have in an earlier article mentioned that Bhagavan Sri Sathya (does not sleep (in the ordinary sense of the word) and that he ministers unto us all the twenty four hours. Even as a school boy he told his friends that he had various visions at nights including his activities in his earlier incarnations as Dattakreya, Rama, Krishna and as Sai Baba of Shirdi, Sri Rama Krishna in connexion with his visit to Trailanga Paramahansa in Benares tells us that Lord Viswanath uses his (i. e. Trailang Swami's) body as His vehicle for manifestation and we may presume that it is during such times that the great Swamy used to sleep with his feet on the Shiva lingam at Kasi's Sanctum Sanctorum. We may be justified in inferring that at other times (viz. when God does not utilise his body) he would not have done so. Arguing in this wise we can understand the teaching of Babuji that only an avatar has the right to say he is God (and not those whose bodies are used as vehicles on and off for His manifestation). This clears up a lot of misunderstanding that had been created by the statements of various teachers, both high and low. The question of the lower grade of teachers comes in when in spiritualistic parlance a teacher on the other side uses the medium to impart a special teaching.

Sai Baba of Shirdi had told his disciples that he slept with eyes open and that his heart beat then was different from that by day. In other words he had his Yoga Nidra. He never slept in the way we ordinary people do. In what ways then is this wakeful-sleep different from the ordinary sleep. Aurobindo tells us that sleep in the Anandamaya-kosha for ten minutes is equivalent to many hours of ordinary sleep and that

it takes many hours to teach the Ananda maya kosha for an ordinary man. Therefore he recommends for us several hours of sleep. Sadhakas who practise Sadhana regularly and steadily do not waste much time in the lower planes. There are planes in nature corresponding to the five koshas. Just as we are trying to conquer our physical body and the physical plane, so should we control the other four koshas and the corresponding planes of nature. The man who has full control of the annamaya kosha is much happier than the one who has less control. The same applies to all other koshas. If we spend the nights happily in the sukshma planes we get up in the morning refreshed with joy. On the other hand the man who wastes his day in running after foolish desires does the same by night in his fruitless dreams and he wakes in the morning exhausted and tired. He is angry with the entire world! He may not remember the dreams. To remember them regular sadhana coupled with vairagya is necessary. We all leave our physical bodies at sleep but since we are not conscious on those subtler planes we don't remember them except in the form of stray dreams. Now and then we may have special experiences, which we remember well. A grand Swamy who had the experience of God consciousness continuously for some months in the physical plane had expressed both by letter (when the writer was abroad) and by mouth the great upanishadic teachings "Because I am, the fire burns. It is I who have cast you into incarnation". These statements were made when he did not have God consciousness in the physical plane, and as Sri J. Krishnamurthi would put it, he

APPROPRIATELY APPROVED

The debate on the Appropriation Bill that was presented by the National Government acquired a distinction of its own by the high order of exposition of arguments and the clarity of the explanation of the budget proposals. The crowning glory was attained when after the brilliant speeches of the leaders of the C. P. the Tamil Congress, the S. L. F. P. and the U. N. P. ninety nine M. Ps. approved the Bill as against fifty five dissentient votes. Even more remarkable was the example set by the 2nd M. P. for Matur in his courage in acting up to his conviction despite allegiance to his party. Searching his conscience with a rare ability, the 2nd M. P. for Matur, could not resist the moral conclusion that the National Government's Budget was acceptable. He thus obeyed his inner dictates after a supreme ordeal in solving the problem of casuistry.

The Member for Tissamaharama went the furthest in candid confession when he declared that it would be treacherous to vote against the Appropriation Bill and crossed over to the correct ranks.

The strength of the National Government does not lie merely in the numerical weight but also in the quality of the aggregate political prudence and sense of responsibility of the component parties. The secret of this strength is the fund of common sense that is available to the leadership of the National Government, a factor that has effectively silenced communalists and Marxists. However the

forward on the path indicated to them by seers like the immortal Vivekananda, carrying the torch of wisdom to the darkest corners of the human soul.

Side by side we must make every effort to strengthen the United Nations which seeks to keep peace among all nations. It is a declaration of great faith that war is not inevitable. I cannot do better than reproduce its preamble which states:

"We the peoples of the United Nations determined to save succeeding generations from the scourge of war, which twice in our life time has brought untold sorrow to mankind, and to reaffirm faith in fundamental human rights, in the dignity and worth of the human person, in the equal rights of men and women and of nations large and small and to establish conditions under which justice and respect for the obligations arising from treaties and other sources of international law can be maintained, and to promote social progress and better standards of life in larger freedom, and for these ends to practise tolerance and live together in peace with one another as good neighbours, and to unite our strength to maintain international peace and security, and to ensure, by the acceptance of principles and the institution of methods, that armed force shall not be used, save in the common interest, and to employ international machinery for the promotion of the economic and social advancement of all peoples, have resolved to combine our reforms to accomplish these aims."

It is difficult to improve upon the language and the spirit of the preamble, May God grant the members of the United Nations the wisdom and the strength to be true to the spirit and the letter of the great Charter.

Welcoming the Reverend Swamiji, Mr. M. Vairavapillai, President of the Vivekananda Society said:

"Among the sayings in the Upanishads occurs the following:

"Bramavidh Apnothi

people must be wary and watchful as the monster of communalism has the capacity to rear its ugly head without notice.

Param"—it means that the knower of Brahman attains the highest beatitude.

This saying is the motto of our Vivekananda Society, Colombo, which has for one of its main objects the religious and cultural welfare of the Hindu people. Though it was primarily intended to serve the Hindu people, service for the welfare of the entire country and of all peoples is one of its objects, since service of all mankind is the essence of Hinduism.

This Society was founded 63 years ago, to be exact on 17th July, 1902, sometime after the Reverend Swami Vivekananda entered Maha Sumodhi in commemoration of his immortal services to the cause of Hindu religion, in fact to all religions of the world and all cultures. The Swamiji blessed Ceylon with a visit in the year 1897. Colombo was the first place to receive him with all religious fervour from where he proceeded to North Ceylon and then to Mother India after his triumphant return from the Congress of religions at Chicago"
