Hindu Orthodoxy - A Lesson From Kashmir

When the Kingdom of Kashmir was conquered by the Muslim invaders many Hindus were forced to embrace the religion of the conquerors but later when the British restored the Hindu monarchy many Kashmiris appealed to the then Maharajah to take them back into their old faith. But the Brahmin pundits would not hear of it and on their advice the Maharajah refused to have them back although the Dharma Sastras provide for such contingencies e. g. apastamba sutras. Now this lack of foresight has created a very troublesome state in this part of India where the Muslim majority is trying to break away from secular India. The fundamental question that needs solution is whether anyone can become a Hindu and whether a Hindu who was forcibly or otherwise made to become a non Hindu can be taken back into the Hindu fold. When the head of the Arya Samaj accepted non Hindus into his fold he was murdered being shot dead by a muslim fanatic. This is what happens when religion is made a political question. More bitter was the lesson learnt by the Brahmins of Malabar during the Mopla rebellion that took place during the first world war. Yet Brahmin orthodoxy refuses to grant asylum to these unfortunate victims of fanatical iconoclasts. On the other hand many a victim of Hindu tyranny found refuge in the social justice afforded by Islam and Christianity. What Hinduism needs today is the sense of social justice that the Buddha inaugurated, over 2500 years ago in which conduct and not birth received due consideration i. e. a Brahmin was what his conduct made him and not his birth, although the traditional laws (smirthis) laid down otherwise. ment of these laws by a competent authoritative body representative of all section of Hindus. One should allow every earnest aspirant to adopt the Hindu faith, irrespective of caste or colour. The saying of Saints and Mahatmas should inspire us to afford every one to gain the fruit of the prusharthas, Dharma, Artha, Karma and Moksha. The Late Sir K. V.

Sir—Sometime in 1951 the late Sir Kanthiah Vaithianathan gave a talk to the members of the University Hindu Students' Movement. At the end of the talk one of the questions put to him was—"Is Hinduism tolerant?" I have forgotten the exact words Sir K. V. used in his reply but what he said amounted to this—"To say that Hinduism is tolerant would be ascribing to it a superiority which it doesn't claim for itself". Another question put to him was—"Is Hinduism a hobby or a way of life?" Sir K. V. did not answer this question but joined in the laughter which followed.

More recently a friend from Mannar told me that as one dedicated to the cause of Thiruketheswaram restoration and the welfare of pilgrims visiting the shrine, Sir K. V. was interested in getting a hotel put up. Those who continue the work of Sir K. V. in this sphere should not overlook this aspect of the restoration scheme. What is wanted is not a big modern hotel but resting places like 'Sirapparmadam at Keerimalai.

Sir K. V. belonged to a generation of civil servants who proved that the quality of the country's administration did not suffer in the least by the take over of big posts by the Ceylonese. In granting independence to Ceylon, the Imperial Authorities took into consideration not only the existence of statesmen wedded to the ideals of Parliamentary Liberalism like Mr. D. S. Senanayake but also the presence of talented officials like Sir K. V. who could make ministerial planning really effective at administrative level. Alas! Sir K. V. is no more but may Lady Vaithianathan and prominent Hindus like Proctor Sivasubramaniam make his Thiruketheswaram dream come true with the co-operation and

SITUATION SAVED!

The organisation that was formed twenty years ago with the authoritative and attractive name, the United Nations, to organise peace for the world, has cause to feel proud of itself by reason of its performance during this most critical week. It cannot be denied that the U. N. has been subjected to strong criticism by its members on the ground that it was not sufficiently strong or that it was unnecessarily interfering. However the history of this august Assembly indicates the strenuous efforts it has been taking to re-establish lasting peace. Certainly several problems remain unsolved. But the usefulness of this organisation also remains.

The triumphant step that was taken by the Security Council to persuade India and Pakistan to agree to its demand that fighting should cease registers a new achievement which may well be the basis for strengthening the U. N. as the Supreme Authority for guiding the destiny of mankind.

Pakistan still contends that there is a problem between her and India about Kashmir but India says that there is none. The present problem is to find out whether there is a problem to be solved in Kashmir. The U. N. constituted as it is at present commanding universal respect and acceptance must be able to satisfy Pakistan that she should no more interfere in the affairs of Kashmir.

The Mission that is being arranged to supervise the Cease-Fire will consist of 150 observers selected by the U. N.
