SLOKA 5

Sarva Kama prado hi Atma Prokta Shadbhedavistarah |
Bhutatma hi Antaratma cha tatvatma cha Jiva Samkijnakah ||

He fulfills all the desires of all beings by his very presence. Such is the nature of the perfect Atman who is not different from Paratman. He is said to have six names. Bhutatman, antaratman, tatvatman, Jivatman, mantratman and Paratman.

Notes & Comments

Atma: This refers to the fluttering soul which has no fixed abode. According to the nature of the ground and support when it expresses itself, it gets six different names. Along with the six names given above, Shivajnanasidhi and other Tamil Shaiva Siddhanta works add another name கலவன். This denotes the 'Jadatman' that gets involved in lifeless inorganic substances.

It is useful to compare the names given to the atman in this sloka, with the names given to Brahman in the Taitreeya Upanishad.

SLOKA 6

BHUTATMAN & TATVATMAN

Mantratma Paramakya cha eko api bahudha Sdhitah |
Bhutatma Bhutasamyogat tatvatma tatvasamsthitah ||

The fluttering soul (atman) which has many abodes has indeed many names. When he takes his abode in the mahabhutas and the sthula deha he is called Bhutatman, when he dwells in the world of ideas and the inner tatvas like the mind he is called tatvatman.

Notes & Comments

Bhutatman refers to the corporeal man who cannot rise above the region of the senses. In seeking pleasure it is not within his reach to make use of the higher faculties like the mind, Budhi, chitta etc.

Tatvatman refers to the man of intellect. All thinkers and philosophers belonging to different schools of thought belong to this class. Most people who are said to be worldly wise either belong to the Bhutatman class or Tatvatman class or to both.

In the lower levels of experience, all experience is objective and the consciousness that operates is also objective consciousness. Hence in my comments I have tried to explain that the soul dwells simultaneously in the Sthuladeha as dehatma (enjoyer) and in the Maha bhutas as Maha Bhutatma (objects of enjoyment)

Dharma in Kaliyuga

Over 5000 years of Kaliyuga have passed. Kaliyuga is said to be the age of grief and sorrow and only one quarter (¼) of Dharma is said to prevail in this age. When cunning and deceit is said to be the passport of success, when wealth and not birth is the criterion of social position, when woman is attached to the husband merely for the sake of sexual pleasure and when wearing of outward symbols (lingatharana) is said to be the sign of religion, then it is Kaliyuga (Vishnu purana). The two grand epics describe the advent of two avatars of Vishnu (Rama and Krishna) among our midst and their labours to uphold dharma and show us how to lead a true life under difficult circumstances. The Vedas teach us things that we do not know and prescribe laws for our conduct. The Smritis tell us what should be our conduct and lay emphasis on Varnashrama Dharma! as it should be practised under different conditions and time and place. Foreign conquest, not only physical but also intellectual, had changed out outlook; but with the advent of independence the depressed classes fear that the rigid ancient caste rules will regain currency to their great disadvantage and social justice will not prevail. But independence also brought in its wake not only democracy but also socialism that breeds equality and justice to all alike. The Budha preached that it was not birth but conduct that matters in life and on the religious front the Sriamans took the place of the Brahmanas and the Vedic religion lost its hold on the people. But the protagonists of the Vedic religion like Kumarta Batta and Mandana misra resuscitated the Karma Kanda of the Vedic religion that assured its votaries the fruits of the

THIRUKETHESWARAM RESTORATION SOCIETY

Shri S. Somasundaram Elected President

A meeting of the General Committee of the Thiruketheswaram Temple Restoration Society with Mr. Justice P. Sri Skandarajah in the chair was held on Sunday 10th of October at the Saraswathi Hall Bambalapitiya. The main business of the day was arrangement for the continuance of the Temple construction, the election of a President, and the election of Vice-Presidents, Trustees, Joint Treasurer, Panchayat members, various sub-committees and filling up of vacancies.

The Secretary of the Society Mr Allirajah was requested to take all necessary steps to continue the Thirupani work at Thiruketheswaram. A Sub-committee including Messrs R. Sabanayagam, S. Arumugam, V. K. Chinniah, V. Selvaratnam and others were appointed to attend to the construction work. Mr. S. Saravanamuttu along with 3 others was appointed to look after the poojahs at the temple.

Vedic Karmas which appealed to the masses. Adisankaracharya came in the scene about 2000 years ago and preached his Brahma Vada and adwaita Vedanta based on the Upanishads or the Gnana Kanda of the Vedas. He maintained that Karma Kanda was the means to the end of the Vedas i. e. Gnana Kanda and that all actions should be dedicated to God (Brahmarpanam) and one should perform all karmas without looking for rewards i.e. Nishkamya Karma and Vedic religion bereft of crude practices became popular with the people. But Sankara's adwaita philosophy was challenged by the theists like Ramanuja, Srikantha and Madvachariya to whom we owe modern Hinduism.

Mr. S. Somasundaram, Proctor, one of the chief founders of the Society was unanimously elected President of the Society. A sub-committee (Messrs T. Murugesapillai, K. C. Praesoody, and V. K. Arumugam and others) was appointed to attend to certain matters at Thiruketheswaram including Shramadana work which is expected to commence on Saturday the 16th instant. One of the Treasurers of the Society Mr. M. Vairavapillai made a statement regarding the finances of the Society and appealed for support from all sections of these of the Hindu community in Ceylon, India and Malaya, which appeal found acceptance among the members.

Among those who participated in the discussions were Messrs K. Alvapillai, K. C. Thangarajah, M. Ambalavanar, T. Murugesapillai, T. Sivalingam, S. Ambihai-pahan, S. Saravanamuttu, V. Shanmugam, Dr. A. Kanagaratnam, Dr. T. Nallanathan, Dr. S. Ariaratnam and Mr. S. Sivasubramaniam.

Mr. M. Sivasithamparam, M. P. for Udupiddy, Pundit K. P. Ratnam M. P. for Kilinochchi, Mr. S. Arumugam and Lady Vaithianathan were elected Vice-Presidents of the Society to fill up existing vacancies in addition to those who are now holding office.

New members for the Society including Mr. S. Thondaman M. P., Justice Manickavasagar and Dr. S. Thanabalasundaram were elected.

Mr. T. Ratnasabapathy was elected one of the Joint Treasurers of the Society.

A large gathering of members of the Society including representatives from Jaffna, Mannar, Thiruketheswaram and other outstations attended the meeting.

SHAMELESS SLANDER

The venomous mind of the leader of the defeated Coalition Government has wandered far and wide writhing in frustration and fear of complete decline. Mrs. Srimavo Bandaranaike appears to have lost all sense of civic consciousness. No person who had ever led a nation even to misfortune could be so bereft of all ideas of citizenship as to fabricate untruths about any section of the people. The S. L. F. P. leader's frequent attacks on the Tamil community reveal the true nature of the campaign that has been planned by her and her colleagues of the Left to create confusion in the minds of the voters and then to offer her services as their saviour. DEEPAVALI

(BY A CEYLON TAMIL)

When the last streak of the waning moon rises at dawn on the fourteenth day of the dark fortnight in the month of Aipasi with the sun in the zodiacal sign of Libra we perform the ritual bath of Naraka Sathurdasi that precedes the Deepavali festival so popular among all sections of the people of India and Ceylon. Deepavali denotes a row of lights that lead to the seat of Luckshmi represented by a Kuthuvilaku round which are arranged the new clothes and other presents for the members of the household. Indeed Deepavali is more a domestic affair where all members foregather especially the bridegroom who has recently married into the family receives his presents for the first Deepavali from his wife's parents. It is indeed a pleasant festival with much feasting and receiving of presents etc. To those who enjoy in giving, Deepavali offers the best opportunity to give Dana. In practice Deepavali is observed as a new year when all debts are paid and new accounts opened particularly by the trading country of North India where the Wickramaditya era is said to begin on this holy day. To the orthodox Hindu the ritual bath is symbolic of purification from evils of Naraka or purgatory before entering the path of light that leads to god's presence where Karma cannot have any effect on one. For the householder Deepavali offers a good opportunity to illuminate home, offer poojas and prayers to God and make wife and children happy and contented. The servants and other dependants too receive gifts in this practical form of charity by the gift of oil, new clothes food etc to all needy persons whose blessings will help the giver in his pilgrimage to moksha. The devas are advised to observe dama or self control, the asuras to observe daya or mercy and the naras, humans to observe dana or charity in the famous passage Da, Da, Da: of the upanishads. Deepavali deserves to be observed with sober piety rather than with orgy of drinking and eating of meat etc. It is the time to meditate or how to attain Moksha and to avoid Naraka (Hell) where Yama metes out punishment for our sins of omission and commission that the faithful scribe Chitrakuta records in his infallible book. Let us all observe Deepavali soberly and piously please.

mantratman, when it is in close association with Sukshuma Vak tatva or Natha tatva, it is called antaratman. Dwelling in prakriti, driven by the force of gunas, when it seeks pleasure and enjoyment it is called Jivatman.

Notes & Comments

Mantras occupy a unique place in Agamic thought. They are the last resort for the spiritual minded person who is not prepared for perfection in spirit in love. Mantras help us to maintain our sense of separateness from God. The unseen Shivasakthi first manifests itself into Mantrasakthi and then only it begins to energise and guide our movements. For the religious aspirant or the spiritual minded man the first and foremost inner sakthi that should be sought after, is the mantrasakthi that controls and guides him. Our ancient Rishis were adepts in Mantrasastras or the science of Manthra-aksharas.

Jivatma: This is the most important state of the Atman. Thinking that he is a Bhokta and nothing else, in the jivatma state the atman puts on the appearance of a 'saka dukka rupi'. He is also called purusha in this state. Some vedanta schools of thought hold that above the Jivatma state there is no possibility for the separate existence of the soul from God. But Shaiva Siddhanta holds that above the Jivatma state the soul attains the mantratma state and the sense of separateness from God still lingers on to the soul.
