Yada abhivyajyate Jnanam vimalam Sarvatomukham |
tada atmeeyam param dharmam vindate Shashvatam
dhruvam ||

When the taintless and all embracing spiritual vision dawns in a person simultaneously dawns in him a vision of the truth and the only enduring truth about the atman.

Notes & Comments

The common truth about the atman is that it becomes what it thinks. Thereby the Atman as we said before is called 'Tat Dharma Dharmi' with the dawning of spiritual vision, this truth becomes confirmed. The atman now is a completely released being and so is in inseparable union with Shiva. He becomes the real temple of Shiva, Experiencing Shiva and at the same time reflecting all His transcendental qualities.

He, the released atman is at times seen to be supremely indifferent to things worldly. At other times he seems to be overflowing with Karuna or compassion to all the creatures of the world. Yet at other times he appears to be lost in over whelming love towards his newly found associate the unconditioned and all pervading Shiva.

SLOKA 13

ANANYA BHAVANA

Aham eva paro hi atma purushah Karanam Smritih |
Aham eva param brahma aham Jneyam aneksharam ||

I am the great atman, I am the great purusha. I am the cause that should be worshipped. I am the eternal and changeless supreme soul that should be sought after.

Notes & Comments

Smritih. This in Sanskrit means that which should be remembered. I have translated it as 'that which should be worshipped'.

The released soul in Shaiva tradition is called a Shivagnani. Having realised that there is no other refuge for him other than Shiva, the Shiva gnani undertakes the noblest of all Sadhanas called 'Ananya Bhava Sadhana' to merge himself into the great ocean of bliss otherwise known as Shiva. By this the worshipper and the worshipped coalesce, in inseparable union with each other. The worshipper melts in love, and the worshipped responds to it with equal force in love and peace. In Tamil Siddhanta sastras this 'Ananya Bhavana' is called 'ஏகனாகி இறை பணி நிற்றல்'. This Bhavana has been tested by all schools of thought and found to be most effective to remove the last traces of 'Anava shakti' that hangs on adamantly to the individual soul even at the gates of Shiva Loka. The 10th Sutra of Shivagnana Bodham, declaring that the effect of this Sadhana is immediate says that 'ஏகனாகி இறை பணி நிற்றல் - மல மாயை தன்னொடு வல்வினை இன்றே'.

MR. B. SANJIVA RAO PASSES AWAY

A Former Principal Of Jaffna Hindu College

The death had occurred early last month (September) at his residence in North India at the age of 81 of Mr. Benegal Sanjiva Rao, M. A. (Cambridge), B. Sc. (London) who was the Principal of the Jaffna Hindu College from 1913-14. He was an eminent educationist, theosophist and politician. When he visited Ceylon 1946 he was the Chief Guest at the Prize Day held at Jaffna Hindu College. References were made to his death and career at the College Assembly on Friday 22nd October and Jaffna Hindu College was closed at 1-15 p.m. as a mark of respect.

We reproduce below extracts from the comments made by 'Bhikku' in the "Swarajya" of September 18, 1965:-

"Sanjiva Rao had been kind him over half a century of labour in the education field in which he had more than the usual fare of frustrations, heart-sinkings, hopes and fears, and fleeting successes and praise, obloquies following sometimes so closely on triumphs that the seesaw bewildered and stupefied. But then he always had a second and inner life of quest which insulated him to an extent from these upheavals. Even in youth he had the mental cast which thinks austere of a life of spirit, of finding a 'Guru' of service and sacrifice. Securing a Tata scholarship, he won a tripos in mathematics in Cambridge but did not get selected to the Indian Civil Service as two of his brothers - Benegal Narasing Rao and Rama Rao - did. May be, this reverse was one of the dispensations which was proof to him of what he declared in another context that "the divine was continually with us at all levels capable of being reached through any and every incident however trivial" for his world was essentially one of thought and feeling.

All beings and non beings which are deathless have their ultimate source in me. Freed from births and deaths, I am one I am indestructible Shiva.

Notes & Comments

Vinasaka abavat: This refers to beings and non beings which are beginningless according to Shaiva Siddhanta both matter and spirit, or the insentient and the sentient are indestructible. Their operation and inter-relationship are revealed in the ancient upagamas like Mrigendra and Parameshvara.

This 'Ananya Bhava Sadhana' is only meant for the Shivagnani or the Jivanmukta who has transcended births and deaths and whose only problem of life is Godly knowledge and God realisation.

GRAND STAND VIEW OF HIGHER EDUCATION!

The tidal wave of students selected for University education has created a sinister situation that cannot be ignored. In effect it has become a topic of primary concern for the country, almost a crisis that is baffling University Authorities. However it cannot be denied that such confrontations were carefully discussed in the Report of the Universities Commission of 1962 and remedial and constructive measures were outlined. The enormously expanding population of this Island necessarily demands more educational opportunities. The duty is thus cast on the Government and the leaders of the people to see that educational resources are commensurately adequate.

We do not propose in our comments to elaborate on the very useful recommendations of the University Commission, particularly in reference to the setting up of Campuses with University Colleges and affiliated Colleges. In the context of the present chaotic condition in which the new entrants have been placed, we wish to invite the attention of the Authorities to the suggestion that was made by the University Commission on the dispersal of instruction among campuses. "Concentration of all University teaching at any one place in the Island is not desirable and we recommend the dispersal of the facilities for higher education to convenient centres or campuses as we prefer to call them, in different parts of the Island". That was what the Commissioners recommended to meet the increasing demand for

Expansion of University Education

(Extracts from the University Commission Report)

Admission Pressures

Elsewhere in this Report, we have referred to the increasing pressures for admission to the Universities, and also suggested various ways of reducing that pressure and diverting some of the prospective students to other fields of instruction at the Junior or Senior Secondary School levels. It is possible that the Universities are only just beginning to feel the impact of the various measures taken in the field of education by the State, both before and after Independence, such as the introduction of Free Education, the establishment of Central Schools in various parts of the Island, and the adoption of Swabasha as the medium of instruction in the Junior and Senior Schools. These measures together with the social changes consequent on the 1956 Elec-

higher education. It is inexplicable why the idea of setting up a campus in Jaffna where, according to the learned Commissioners, there is a real demand for instruction at University level in all branches of learning and already a nucleus for a University exists in the form of institutions preparing for University examinations, has not been welcomed and acted upon? Why, therefore, we ask should the new entrants who are now laboriously striving to attend lectures in the improvised stadium that was by usage and environment considered congenial only to the study of the majestic movements of fleet-footed quadrupeds, should be denied the rights of receiving their education in available institutions and appropriate conditions. To the Minister of Education we submit the suggestion that even at this late hour it will be safer and sounder to establish Campuses outside Colombo and reclaim the losing trends of higher education so that every student 'who has the capacity to benefit from University education' can be afforded appropriate facilities to enjoy his right and pursue his studies in the interest of the progress of his country. Whether we are capable of self-government can be gauged from our sufficiency to provide adequate higher education in proper environment.

tions are likely to result in large increases each year in the number of persons seeking admission to Universities and other centres of higher learning

This demand for higher studies which is not confined today to any racial, religious or social group is a healthy sign, and nothing should be done to deny any University education to any student who has the capacity to benefit from it. We are aware of the dangers which may result from the release each year of large numbers of young graduates who have no early prospect of profitable employment. While we do not under-estimate these dangers, we are of opinion that if the young graduate has acquired, along with academic training, a good civic sense and a broad general education he would find ample opportunities to make a useful contribution to the life of a young and developing nation.
