## Expansion of University Education

(Extracts from the University Commission Report)

(Continued from last issue)

While every endeavour should be made to meet this increasing demand for higher education we must necessarily bear in mind the lessons to be learnt from our analysis of the defects patent in the hastily established Pirivena Universities. Before attempting to set up new Universities it is necessary that the authorities concerned should satisfy themselves that adequate provision can be made not only for the accommodation of students, and for the necessary equipment but also for suitably qualified academic personnel in the various fields of study. It is recognised that there is a dearth of trained personnel in the Island, especially in Science and Engineering. If we can recruit qualified personnel from abroad, we should take suitable steps to do so. We are confident that if suitable steps are taken without delay the University of Ceylon can, within a decade or two, train the minimum personnel required for the three lay Universities, which we hope to see well established during that period.

### Dispersal of Instruction among Campuses

Concentration of all University teaching at any one place in the island is not desirable, and we recommend the dispersal of the facilities for higher education to convenient centres, or campuses as we prefer to call them, in different parts of Island.

As our meagre resources would not permit us to provide at each such Campus, instruction in every course of study however desirable that may be, we may be compelled in the first instance to confine certain departments of study to one Campus only. Such basic subjects as Science, Mathematics, Ceylon and World History, Geography and the National Language,

would, however, necessarily have to be provided for at each Campus.

We accordingly recommend that—

- The Gangodawilla Campus of the Vidyodaya University be handed over to the University of Ceylon for the expansion of its Colombo Campus in order that it may absorb the students of the two Pirivena Universities which we have suggested should be closed down.
- The faculties and departments of study of Ceylon be dispersed among its present Campuses at Peradeniya and Colombo and a new Campus at or near Jaffna, and
- The administration of the University of Ceylon be decentralised to permit the three Campuses to manage their own affairs subject only to the general control of the University in order that they may gain in experience and qualify in due course for fully independent status as autonomous Universities.

There will thus be, in the first instance, according to our proposals, one University of Ceylon with Campuses at Colombo, Peradeniya and Jaffna.

### University Colleges

As the Halls of Residence at the Campuses will not be able to take more than a fraction of those seeking admission, Government might consider setting up a University Section in certain selected Government schools which have, in the opinion of the Grants Commission, reached a sufficiently high standard and possess the necessary laboratory equipment, library facilities, and trained personal. We suggest that, provided the

necessary standards are reached, the first preference should be given to a school in South Ceylon and, next to a School in the Batticaloa District. If the Grants Commission and the University authorities are later satisfied that the training imparted in the University Section of such School justifies their recognition for the award of internal degrees we recommend that those University sections of the Schools be recognised as University Colleges, and given representation in the academic body of the associated University.

### The Campuses

The three Campuses proposed will be Campuses of the University of Ceylon for a limited period only, as we envisage that the institutions at these Campuses will soon develop in to independent Universities. Jaffna Campus. This is a new Campus. Government appears to have accepted in principle the setting up of a Cultural University at the premises of the Ramana-than College and Parameshwara College. We have received representations on this proposal for a Cultural University and it appears to us that the real demand is not for a Cultural Institution but for instruction at University level in all branches of learning. Universities are essentially cultural institutions and we do not favour the application of the expression University to an institution providing instruction solely in subjects that are associated in the popular mind with the expression "Culture". There are also many institutions in the Peninsula preparing students for University examinations and the nucleus for a University at Jaffna can be said to exist. We consider it, however, desirable that a commencement should be made by establishing a Campus of the University of Ceylon at or near Jaffna and assisting that Campus to grow up into a University as soon as practicable.

### Notes & Comments

Means are always different from ends. Sadhana is different from sadhya. Slokas 13 and 14 refer to the noble 'Ananya Bhava' Sadhana undertaken by the Shiva Gnani. The above sloka is a description of the para-anubhuti realised by him as a result of the sadhana. All traces of self-activity have disappeared from him. All his actions—words thoughts and deeds.

**Yogasanyasta Karma:**—Karmas that appear to come from the gnani are not his. His utter inability to own them, possess them and feel for them is his special characteristic. That is why the Sruti says that all his actions are God's actions. Shiva Gnana Sidhi and other Tamil Gnana sastras say 'செய்யும் இவன் செய்தி எல்லாம் என் செய்தி என்று கொள்வன்'.

**Nirvikalpah:** This word denotes the Shiva Gnani's predominating sense of oneness with God. 'I am different from Shiva. I am the worshipper. Shiva is the worshipped'. Such thoughts are entirely foreign to the Shiva gnani who becomes lost in God in love and in spirit.

SLOKA 16

PARA-ANUBHUTI (ADWAITIC UNION)

Nirasya Vasana sarvah atma trupto Niramayah |  
Advaita Bhavana yukta sada atmanam Upasayet ||

Having brushed aside all traces of vasana malam not affected by heat or cold, poised in perfect peace the natural advaitin should always be in perfect communion with God.

### Notes & Comments

**Vasana Malam:**—This is the lingering and not dying sense of 'I' and 'mine'. The last traces of malam that persists in adhering to the consciousness even after the attainment of Maya Nivritti and Karma nivritti is called vasana malam.

**Advaita Bhavana yukta:**—The interpretation of this mysterious word advaitam has caused many wordy battles between the different schools of Hindu philosophy. According to Shaiva Siddhanta advaitam means not two but one in love and in spirit. When we speak of a being, we think that there is only one principle that functions in the being. It is not so. A being consists of two principles one inner and the other outer. The two principles are conjoined together from when, nobody knows. One is the enjoyer, the other is the feeder. They are ever at peace with each other. Svetasvatara upanishad (4th Chapter Verse 6), says that 'there are two mysterious birds. They are fast bound companions. They clasp close the self same tree. Of these two birds, one eats sweet fruits. The other merely looks on without eating'. The two birds

### PROTECTION FOR PERSON & PROPERTY

The campaign that is being waged against the Government on the issue of the uncontrollable prohibitive cost of living cannot be dismissed as mere propaganda for political purposes. The people know that the present leader of the Opposition had handed over the problem to the National Government at the last General Election. But the common man is worried not so much about those who are responsible for the crisis being brought to book as about the solving of the problem.

The index of the cost of living is presumably prepared from available particulars of the average expenditure of a person. In this computation the loss that the common man sustains owing to the nefarious activities of miscreants of the several varieties ranging from pick-pockets to gangsters is not taken into account. It is common knowledge that the safety of a person, leave alone his property, cannot be assured by the Administrative Authorities. There has been a reported rumour that the owner of a sweep ticket that secured the first prize has been swept away to the other world and that the Police are enquiring into the matter. This is not the first instance of winners of prizes having been reported to have succumbed to planned attacks. Picking of pockets in all public vehicles of transport has become a recognised way of earning one's livelihood.

We, therefore, suggest to the Authorities who are striving to reduce the cost of living also to take into their investigations the subject of saving the common man from the depredations of the pick-

Aprakritena nityena nirmatena Avikarina |  
Vyapakena Atisukshmena parena Jnana chakshuna ||

Beyond prakriti, deathless, spotless, changeless, all pervading, subtler than the most subtle is Parajnanam or Godly knowledge of the Jnani.

### Notes & Comments

Spiritual knowledge is of two kinds. One is aparajnanam which is knowledge about the celestial worlds and knowledge about the beings that dwell in the celestial worlds. This Jnanam is spiritual knowledge of an inferior order. Aparajnani is one who is not prepared for advaitic union with God. He is satisfied with mere indirect knowledge of God.

Para Jnanam is direct knowledge of God. It is a newly discovered knowledge of the atman in which his fundamental faculties of knowing, feeling and acting, function in a new way. By this knowledge the Para Jnani feels that he is a completely freed being with no obstructions to him in his paths of spiritual flights.
