KATARAGAMA MADALAYAMS

Protest Against Their Removal

A deputation consisting of Messrs S. Somasundaram, President, Thiruketheeswaram Restoration Society, T. Muttusamipillai, President, Saivaparipalana Sabha, K. V. Subramaniam, Kataragama Vythialingam Madam Trustee, S. J. V. Chelvanayagam, President Federal Party, V. Navaratnam, Secretary Ceylon Hindu Cultural Affairs Committee and Registrar Supreme Court, Vice-president Ramakrishna Mission, Rev. Bava, Trustee Kataragama Theivayanai Amman Temple the chief Kapuralai and his assistant, met the Hon'ble the Minister for Local Administration at the Secretariat on Thursday, the 28th ultimo to express their views against the demolition and removal of the Madams at Kataragama.

There was unanimity of opinion among all the delegates that the Madams at Kataragama should not be demolished or removed from the present site.

A memorandum, supporting the claim of the deputation prepared by Sir A. Mahadeva was also submitted.

The editorials which appeared in the 'Inthusathanam' protesting against the demolition and removal of the said madams and copies of the resolutions of the Jaffna Saiva Paripalana Sabha were also submitted by the President of the Sabha.

The Minister stated that the former Government had taken action in this matter and the then Minister had made certain orders for promulgating a Town Planning Ordinance and he was therefore not sure whether

ther the former order could be vacated.

The deputation then pointed out that the same question propped up in the early part of 1951 and Sir Oliver Gunatileke, the then Minister for Home Affairs and the then Prime Minister, Mr. D. S. Senanayake visited Kataragama and decided to permit the madams to remain where they were. They further gave a plot of land to the Ramakrishna Mission to build a madam and it was after that the Ramakrishna Madam was built.

Mr. Dudley Senanayake, the present Prime Minister, had then subscribed a sum of Rs. 1000/- to the Ramakrishna Madam and his name appears in the list of donors.

The Minister promised to place their submissions before the Cabinet and if necessary to meet the deputation later.

Mass Transfer of Teachers

At an emergency meeting of the N. P. T. A. Executive Committee held on 8-11-65 it was resolved to issue the following statement:

Having considered the intention of the authorities to put through a scheme of mass transfers, the Executive Committee expresses its opposition to any such scheme of mass transfers for the following reasons.

- (i) The teachers by reason of their nature of work and scale of pay and because of the fact that they are not full fledged government servants should not be considered to belong to a transferable service.
- (ii) Indiscriminate and periodic transfers of teachers will disorganise and ruin the work in schools because the teachers will always be under the threat of a transfer order and could therefore have no abiding interest either in the school or in the pupil and the community.
- (iii) Existing vacancies in any part of the Island must be filled in by new recruitment. The Union cannot be held responsible for artificial vacancies created by the transfers from deficit areas to adequate or surplus areas.
- (iv) The Executive Committee reiterates its position that it will always take up the case of any transfer who is unjustly transferred.

While welcoming the move to re-establish the Transfer Board it regrets the fact that that Open Unions have been denied membership in the Transfer Boards, thereby fostering sectionalism and undermining the confidence of the teachers in the Government's policy of fostering Trade Unionism as stated in the last Throne Speech.

PARA - SHIVAM

Visuddhem shashvatam nityam apramayam Anaupamam |
Nirvikalpam achintyam hetudhrishdanta varjitham ||

In the background of the atman and rising from it, the Jnani sees the pure, the eternal, the ancient, the immeasurable, the incomparable, the inexpressible transcendental Shiva.

Notes & Comments

The atman referred to in the above verse is pure consciousness unlimited in its expanse and dimensions and completely freed from any form of conditioning by human thought. Consciousness at all levels is the centre of experience. Its ground and support decide the nature of its experience. The released atman after losing all its petty associations and supports, and regaining all its lost glory and splendour comes to its natural abode—the abode of Shiva. In his first reaction to this experience he attempts to describe the indescribable nature of Shiva. Since the impact of the transcendental is tremendous the released atman becomes a virtual mute. He prefers maunam and சும்மா இருத்தல் to anything else. Even Sruti in some of its boldest moods confesses 'na vidmahe na vyaneemabe' meaning 'I do not know anything about Brahman'.

Hetudhrishdanta Varjitham:—The transcendental is Vakmanatheetam. Mere argumentary skill or logical reasoning will be of no avail in the realisation of it.

SLOKA 19

PARA - SHANTAM

Sutrpadam nirgunam shantam tatvateetam Niranjaanam |
Avibhavyam asandehyam pashyanti isanam Atmani ||

The Jnani completely freed from tatvas and gunas and experiencing the bliss called para-shantam, the light that is called self-luminous, sees Easwara in his own self.

Notes & Comments

Asandehyam:—Doubts do not linger on to the atman. There is cent per cent certitude in his vision of Easwaran within the Atman itself.

In this sloka there is a description of the bliss that was said to be indescribable in the previous verse. In almost all religious traditions the description about bliss runs on the same lines. It is described as peace beyond understanding, beauty beyond description, light that is self-luminous and brilliant and so on. In the Shaiva Siddhanta the final state—not the transcendental is said to be a state of para-shantam, (peace beyond thought) in which the perfected atman becomes absorbed in the sun like glory of the ever perfect Shiva. Mar-nicka Vasaga Swamigal in his Thiruvagasam says 'I meditate on thy infinite mercy, thy way of rising from the bosom of my soul dispelling all darkness in the glory of the Sun'. Svetasvatara sruti says 'I know of this mighty purusha of the colour of the Sun beyond darkness'.

RADIO STATION FOR JAFFNA— A REAL NEED

Is any investigation necessary for the Authorities to establish a Radio Station in Jaffna? We do not think so. The Radio Commission's terms of reference are wide and varied. On this particular aspect of the establishment of a Radio Station in the Northern City the Commissioners can only express their surprise that the question has been allowed to be outstanding for many years.

As far back as in 1948, before the Second Commission on Radio Service was appointed, Mr S. Srinivasan, who yesterday acted as the spokesman for a deputation consisting of lawyers that met the present Commission, pleaded, inter alia, for the establishment of a Radio Station in Jaffna in the course of his two articles in the 'Hindu Organ'. We ourselves had earlier in these columns dwelt on the need for a Radio Station in Jaffna, as the cultural and educational level of progress in the North demanded such facilities. We, therefore, take it for granted that the present Commission would unhesitatingly and unanimously recommend the immediate establishment of a Radio Station in Jaffna.

In this context of the sittings of the Commission and the views expressed by various deputations, we are obliged to take strong exception to the suggestion that was made by a deputation that the duration of Hindu programs need not be extended. The measure of time for a religious program over the Radio can be judged only by the actual need for it. The Hindus of this Island are mostly Saivites and therefore require the Saiva Religious Service. The present edu-

cational system has recognised the importance of religion and has made its study a compulsory requirement. The Saiva religious service has to cover the recital of the Thirumurais and the exposition of the essentials of Saivism according to the Vedas, Agamas and the other shastras. The time allotted for the Saiva service is certainly inadequate and has to be increased.

The Commissioners also will do well to bear in mind that necessary administrative arrangements should be made to ensure that all available musical and literary talents are utilised to produce the best contributions in every section of the Radio Service so that the purity and classical elegance of the culture of this country may be maintained and preserved at a very high standard.

Red China to be Recognised in U. N.

The view that Ceylon would be willing to accept Red China's application for membership in the U. N. if such an application be made was expressed by Mr. G. G. Ponnambalam, leader of the Ceylon Delegation, at the U. N. Assembly meeting on November 10. He contended that an application for membership implied the applicant's acceptance of the provisions of the U. N. Charter.

Mr. Ponnambalam who has earned the approbation of the U. N. delegations by his brilliant speeches at the Assembly earlier is expected to return to Ceylon in December. His 64th birthday was celebrated on November 8.

Easwara:—In Vedas and Agamas, this word Easwara is used to denote Shiva as the ruler of the universe. If in his transcendental aspect Shiva is all consuming fire, in the Easwara aspect he is the benign and silent ruler full of mercy to all the creatures of the universe. It is the Easwara aspect — pati aspect — Ruler aspect of God, that appeals to most of the world religions and that is why their worship is always directed to God—the Lord of the universe.

In the above verse it is said that in the state of Para shantam, the released Atman prefers communion with Pati to transcendental bliss. He communes with Easwara the ruler of the universe and shares in his Great Glory.

SLOKA 20

PARA — SHAKTI

Sarvadam sarvadehastham vyapakam Sarvatomukham | Niramayam niradharam atmanam pasyate Shivam ||

Again in the background of the atman, the Jnani sees the all seeing, the all supporting, the all pervading Shakti vitalising beyond the realm of heat and cold, all beings living in all bodies.

Notes & Comments

Sarvadam: This means creatine everything.

Sarvadehastam: Energising all beings living in all bodies. As we said before, it is not within the reach of all jnanis to merge in advaitic union with God. Nor is it within the reach of all of them to enjoy the state that is called parashantam. Some jnanis, by their natural temperament and spiritual maturity delight in the worship of the dynamic aspect of God. Thereby they get arrested in Shakti Bhuvanas. Their vision though all pervading in every sense, yet does not transcend the celestial regions called Shakti Bhuvanas. They see God as the devatmashakti—the divine energising force that permeates everything and vitalises every being. It is possible that all trances and spiritual ecstasies we see in the case of the Shakta saints are derived from a vision of this devatmashakti. Syetasvatara upanishad in one of its most difficult verses speaks of a group of Vedic Rishis who by direct intuitive perception saw devatmashakti known as Parashakti in Saiva Siddhantic language.
