Mr. Ramachandra is an ardent believer of the Saiva tenets and a great devotee of the sixty three canonised Saints of the Saiva religion. It is indeed a praiseworthy fact to mention that Mr. Ramachandra, while being a faithful Saivite, is essentially a Universalist. His ideals of Universal Love and Service, for which he is known the world over, is based on the ideals expounded in the very ancient psalms of the four great Nayanmars and other Saiva scriptures.

INDIA'S SACRED DUTY

God had entrusted us with a great responsibility.

If you take the map of the world and the two hemispheres separately and find out what position India occupies in the eastern hemisphere, you will see that even from point of view of latitude and longitude, India occupies a position corresponding to the heart of the human body.

If the natural law as propounded by the Western world, if our own Vedantic law of parallelism between *brahmanda* and *pindanda* is true, it means that India holds the same position in the world as the heart does in the body.

THE NATURE OF MANTRA - ATMAN

Atah param pravakshyami purusham Mantra vigrasam |
Sarvashokaharam diptam sarvapapaharam param ||

Now I will describe about the great mantra-atman who is shining and who is completely freed from all sins and sorrows

Notes & Comments

In its first stages of descent the divine shakti vibrant in its nature expresses itself as *naatham*. The recipients of this *naatham* are highly evolved beings who are called *aparamuktas* (அபரமுத்தர்கள்) in the realm of pure consciousness called *சுத்தமாயை* in our traditional religious language. These *aparamuktas* include *விஞ்ஞானகரர்*, *அணுசதாசிவர்*, *வித்தியேஸ்வரர்* and *மந்திரீஸ்வரர்*. All these *aparamuktas* are the *mantra-atmas* referred to in the above verse. To cert in schools of Hindu philosophy union with this *naatham* is the final goal of liberation. Those schools refer to this *naatham* as *Sabda Bramam*, and therefore the upholders of this school are called *Sabda Brahma Vadins*. In the famous dialogue between Yama and Nachiketa occurring in *Katha Upanishad* Yama declares in chapter 2 verse 15 that the essence of all Vedas, all austerities and all religious lives in this *naatham* otherwise known as *aum*. The meaning of the verse runs thus:-

The Padam which all the vedas recite
The Padam which all austerities proclaim
The Padam which all religious lives desire
That Padam will I briefly declare.
That is Aum! (Katha, 2. 15)

OMNIPRESCENCE OF MANTRAS

Sa deva asura yakshanam Kinnara Apsara Rakshasam |
pitru matru gananam cha siddha vidyadharadishu ||
Naga gandharva tiryakshu pishachanam cha manusham |
Shivadeva sarvatatvanam mantra vidoanti shashvatah ||

Devas, asuras, yakshas, Kinnaras, apsaras, rakshadas, manes, siddhas, vidyadharas, nagas, Gandharvas, pisachas, and human beings. All the above said beings having their existence in different *Bhuvanas* and different *tatvas* ranging from *prithivi tatva* to *Shiva tatva* are controlled by mantras.

Notes & Comments

All the above beings are supported, nourished, and endowed with talents by the mantra shakti, that lies hidden in the vast ocean of the unconscious mind. We may prefer to live in the forgetfulness of this mantra shakti that controls our individual, social and national lives. But that is the way to disaster for an individual or a nation. SETTING UP OF A SYSTEM OF EDUCATION

The new school year is only four weeks away. And the plight of parents and pupils has become more and more pathetic. Pressed between the artificially created scarcity of the necessities of life on one side and the difficulty of finding the means of educating children on the other, the common man has become a victim of vicious circumstances. Year after year this problem of admission of children to schools has been carried over to the following year without being solved with the result that the present position is thoroughly chaotic.

True it is that the authorities are spending the largest portion of the revenue of this land on education. But this expenditure without proper planning has only complicated the already confused situation. There are a number of Teachers' Unions. Parent-teacher associations and religious bodies that meet time and again and discuss these problems but unfortunately no feasible and useful scheme of education has been produced.

Education is not a subject for party politics. It is admittedly of the most vital concern to every one. Hence the priority of consideration for this matter of paramount importance. The complexity of the question is such that its different aspects require exclusive discussion and consideration. On the subject of admission of students to schools, colleges and universities, the Department of Education must publish for the information of the public the number of educational institutions in each electorate, the number of students presently on the roll

the extent of available accommodation and the details of provision of additional requirements to meet the existing demands. On this basis the requirements for future admissions can be planned. The only feasible answer to this question of insufficient accommodation is the setting up of new schools in areas where the number of school going children is very large.

Similarly the question of text-books, standard of tests and other allied topics require separate consideration by a team of expert and veteran teachers and educationists. In all these matters the preliminary basis for a proper study of this big problem can be prepared by the Teachers' Unions, Principals, Headmasters and educationists by means of a series of consultative conferences.

Nasti Mantraih vina Kinchit Sarvam Sdhavara jangamam | Yavantah ke Cha te satva mantra Adhishditam vigrabah |

Nothing exists without mantras. All beings moving and unmoving have their respective mantras. There are celestial beings whose tatvas are mantra tatvas (சுத்தமாயாதத்துவங்கள்) and whose sariras are Mantra Sariras (மந்திரத்திருமேனிகள்).

Notes & Comments

It is important to know that Mantra Shakti is also divine shakti. When the all pervading nature of Divine Shakti gets localised, it is said to be Mantra Shakti. In fact it is modified Divine Shakti. The modification is caused by the impact of Divine Shakti with the sense of 'I' that lingers even in the case of highly evolved beings who dwell in the Sudha Maya regions of pure consciousness. With reference to mantra devas, three things are always clearly stated in all our Agamas. Firstly, they deal about ஆசனம், or tatvas in which the Mantra Devas dwell. Secondly they deal about the ஞாந்தி or nature of their astral bodies. Finally they explain about the ஞானம் or the Divine Shakti that gets localised in the particular being or the particular situation.
