SLOKA 5

BUJA - AKSHARAS

yasya yasya tatvasya adimantu yad aksharam |
shashdam trayodashantam cha tasmin tasmin niyojayet ||

For every mantra (deva) there are six angamantras. The angamantras should always be preceded by beeja-aksharas beginning and ending with the first and the fourteenth vowel.

Notes & Comments

The beeja-aksharas are the fourteen vowels of the sanskrit alphabet beginning and ending with 'अ' and 'ह्रस्व' respectively.

In the highest form of mantras of Shiva all beeja-aksharas are preceded by 'ॐ'. In mantras pertaining to Shiva Shakti all buja-aksharas are preceded by 'ॐ'.

When we speak of a mantra deva there are two aspects to be noted. One is the sthula-sabda-mantra aspect of it. This aspect is called the vachaka aspect. The other aspect is the sukshuma-soul deva aspect of it. This aspect is called the vachya aspect. The relationship between vachaka and vachya is called Bheda-abheda relationship in our Hindu philosophy.

SLOKA 6

BHINDU ADORNING EVERY MANTRA

tan mantram viyanayat sarvatatva atmakam param |
Bhinduna alankritam murdhini sarvakama palapratam ||

It should be known that each mantra tatva controls all tatvas and each is adorned by Bhindu. To the mantra aspirant the mantra grants him all his desires.

Notes & Comments

Beeja and Bhindu are the modified mantra aspects of the Supreme Shiva and Supreme Shakti. Without the Beeja and Bhindu existence of any mantra, or mantra tatva is impossible. That is why in the discussion of mantras the agama stresses the importance of Beeja and Bhindu in the above two verses. In mantras pertaining to Shiva the beeja and bhindu that precedes every mantra occurs as follows
ॐ + अ + ॐ = ॐअॐ.

SLOKA 7 (a)

CONSECRATION OF MANTRA DEVAS

tesham angani yunjita teshu brahmah na kirtitah |

The consecration of mantra devas usually takes place in 'Kumbhas' and 'Bhimbhas'. With a full knowledge of the exact position of the angas, the anga mantras should be recited and the spirit of the recited mantra passed on to the respective angas.

RAMANATHAN REMEMBRANCE

Meetings in Colombo and Jaffna

Delivering the Presidential Address at the Ramanathan College on the occasion of the Ramanathan Day Celebrations Dr. H. W. Thambiah pointedly put the question 'What has Ceylon and in particular Tamilakam done to show gratitude to the patriotic services of Sir P. Ramanathan'. In a comprehensive survey of the many-sided contribution of Sir Ramanathan to the welfare of the people as a whole, Dr. Thambiah made particular reference to the spiritual and cultural activities of the Grand Old Gentleman and to the impression he had created in America about the educational progress in this Island.

Dr. Thambiah was full of admiration for the foremost patriot of this country when he stated that the establishment of the two educational institutions in the North at a time when they were most needed and in the form they were planned showed the breadth of vision and loftiness of ideas of Sir Ramanathan. KAMBAN CONFERENCE

Communal Harmony and Revival of Tamil Culture will be Fostered

The Second Kamban Conference was held on a more elaborate and grander manner than last year in the Vannarponnai Vydeswara Vidyalayam Hall on the 27th and 28th instant. The proceedings began with the address of welcome by the learned President, Justice H. W. Thambiah Q. C. who remarked that the chief objects of the conference were to foster national unity and to encourage the younger generation to learn Tamil more deeply and become acquainted with Tamil culture.

Professor T. P. Meenachisundarampillai, Head of Research Department of Dravidian Languages of the Annamalai University, was the chief speaker for the day. He remarked that the Ramanaya of Kamban was the chief among the Tamil epics which excelled all the others by its poetic beauty, noble sentiments and the superb description of the characters and natural scenery. Rama, the hero, and Sita the heroine of the Ramayana are characters depicting an ideal man and an ideal woman. Rama, though he was an Avatara of Sri Krishna, behaved from first to last like an ordinary human being. Sita was an embodiment of chastity and elegance. Their life was therefore a model to be followed by human beings who are likely to err through their ignorance. Rama was an embodiment of humanness and loved all irres-

Mr. Charles de Silva, a Sinhala Scholar who spoke on "The Place of Kamban among the various of authors of the Ramayana", remarked that Kamban was an incarnation of Saraswathy. He regretted that the Sinhalese were denied the benefit of studying the Ramayana of Kamban by the Buddhist priests who feared that the Sinhalese by acquainting themselves with the story of the Ramayana might develop a liking towards Hindu culture and the Hindu Religion. The Sinhalese thereby lose the benefit of the Ramayana. He sang a verse in Sinhalese composed by him in praise of Kamban. It should be mentioned here that Mr. Silva had translated the immortal Thirukkal in the Sinhalese language. Professor Meenachisundarampillai under whose presidentship he spoke on the second day of the conference appealed to Mr. Silva to undertake the task of composing the Ramayana in Sinhalese.

The organisers of this conference should be commended for their wise arrangement of inviting Mr. Silva to speak at this conference.

The participation of a Sinhalese scholars in such conferences would naturally promote communal harmony in our country. Mr. V. Selvanayakam Professor of Tamil University of Ceylon and Mr. K. Sivalingam, M. A., lecturer in Tamil at the Vidyalanakara University also participated at the conference.

Mr. S. Ambikaipagan, Principal, Vydeswara Vidyalayam, was felicitated at this conference for his services to the Saiva Religion and the Tamil Language by the presentation of a printed address and a gold medal.

PALMYRAH RESEARCH

While welcoming the decision of the House of Representatives that provision should be made for the establishment of a palmyrah research institute in the North we wish to sound the gentle warning that if the investigation is intended to explore among other things the potentialities of the Northern Palm in the matter of the production of alcoholic drinks then the new move might well be shelved. The Palmyrah is almost the symbol of the economy of this land; it is also the emblem of the industry and resourcefulness of the people.

In the not forgotten past of the early half of the present century the people took immense interest and pride in possessing palmyrah groves as they had known the productive capacity of the palm. It was a perennial source of supply, as both food and household requisite. The sweet juice that yielded to trained tapping afforded refreshing drink and raw material for the manufacture of jaggery which in turn provided the ingredient for the preparation of confectionary, sweet refreshments and other articles of food. We need not elaborate on the richness of the palm as a source of sustenance for the people of the arid areas where it thrives. All that the authorities must know is that any idea of making use of the proposed research institute for the purpose of stepping up the production of liquor must be abandoned. We make this observation as we fear that even the present National Government under the guidance of a prohibitionist, Mr. Dudley Senanayake, is reported to be considering the suggestion of Dr. W. Dahanayake that more youngmen should be trained to tap trees for toddy.

Vivekananda Society's Statement on Education of Tamil Speaking Pupils

The Vivekananda Society, Colombo views with great concern the hardships and obstacles which the Tamil speaking pupils are experiencing in their attempt to secure education for themselves; the Society further regrets that Hindu children suffer worst in this respect than any other group. The Society, whose main objectives are the promotion of Hindu religion and Tamil language, both of which are inextricably bound together in Ceylon, is greatly perturbed at the inadequacies of the administration of educational matters prevailing in the country which tend to curtail the minimum facilities necessary for the education of Tamil speaking children through Tamil medium. The Society looks to the State to provide adequate opportunities to promote the education of all sections of the peoples of Ceylon, irrespective of race, religion and number.

The Society appeals to Government and Parliament to take immediate steps to afford the Tamil speaking children the untrammelled and fullest opportunity for educational facilities in all parts of Ceylon, particularly in such parts of the country as the City of Colombo and its suburbs, where the suffering is most acute. The Society requests Members of Parliament to bring to the notice of the Government and Parliament the serious plight facing the Tamil speaking children and obtain the necessary relief without delay. The Society fervently trusts that before the advent of the new school year in January, 1966 the situation will be well remedied by the Government and Parliament.

Radio Station In Jaffna

It is understood that arrangements are being discussed for establishing a Radio Station in Jaffna and that temporary adjustments are being made in the Jaffna Public Library to house the station until a permanent building is put up close to the Fort.

Coup Conviction Set Aside

The Judicial Committee of the Privy Council has quashed the conviction of the 11 accused in the Coup case. The appellants have been freed.

The above verse gives a direction to the Kriya Guru explaining how he should use the mantras in his various ceremonies. Restrictions are imposed on the Kriya Guru that he should be very cautious in the use of Shiva mantras.

Bhimbam: The deity awaiting consecration is called the Bhimbam.
