Atma janthu Puman dehi purusha pudgala Kapal
Ksetrajnah are the various names denoting the
jivatman or the individual soul.

Notes & Comments

Provided with the three innermost sheaths or
sariras, the individual soul slowly develops its indi-
viduality and attains sufficient maturity for Bhoga
in the jivatma state. It is in this state the individual
soul gets many names.

He is called 'atman' because in his own way he
has the capacity to pervade. He is called 'ஜக்தூ'
because he becomes manifest and is said to be born.
He is called 'puman' because he is endowed with
powers. He is called 'pudgala' because throughout
his existence he is associated with one body or other.
He is called 'காபாலி' because always his life centre
is the head. He is called 'Ksetrajna' because he is
the sentient encased in the physical body.

The individual soul is the persistent knower,
feeler, actor and experiencer. He is the all important
principle to whom the entire universe of (அண்டமும்
பிரண்டமும்) microcosm and macrocosm is directly or
indirectly connected. தனு, கரணம், புவனம், போகம்
are all meant for him. To Shaiva Siddhanta, the
individual, soul 'நான்' is the biggest riddle. Did not
one of our recent saints Ramana Maharshi of Thiru-
vannamalai, direct all of us to base our thoughts,
meditations and prayers on the biggest problem 'நான்
யார்?' This individual soul according to Shaiva
Siddhanta has two different histories, the history of
its bondage and the history of its freedom. The first
six sutras of Shiva Jnana Bhodam deal about the
history of its bondage and the remaining six sutras
deal about the history of its freedom. Until the two
histories are separately understood the full history of
the self is never known and the final truth about the
self whether it is சத்த or அசத்த or சத்சத்த is
never realised

Notes & Comments

The problems facing a spiritual aspirant are
many and varied. He has heard about freed souls
freed from finite existence. He has heard about
great souls who had sought and secured fellowship
with God. He has heard about Rishis ancient and
modern to whom God and God alone was the only
reality. He the spiritual aspirant has first hand
experience of only one thing that is his own troubled
and sick mind. He has also first hand experience of
the warring forces waging war inside his mind. He
knows that he has ideals—all unrealistic, fictitious
ideals always at loggerheads with his inmate Gunas,
impulses and desires. He thinks that he is more a
neurotic than a spiritual aspirant. In despair, with
his mind full of doubts and conflicts he wan-
ders hither and thither in search of a Guru
not so much to secure for him a place in the great
Kingdom of God but to attain ordinary peace of

RELIGION AND PHILOSOPHY

In the religious litera-
ture of the Hindus we
come across various theo-
retical principles that
baffle ordinary mortals.
Yoheswaras like our Yoga
swamygal by virtue of
their disciplined life of
quest of Truth help us to
understand these meta-
physical problems. As well
explained by Rajaji the
Vedas are full of rituals
and the Upanishads are
full of philosophical
Truths and the Puranas
and Ithihasas are full of
stories that explain Vedic
truths. The Vedas, Agamas
and the Upanishads
are the basis of all
our religious teachings and
are the ultimate antho-
rity. They speak of
things we do not know
hence their absolute ne-
cessity. The Agamas pre-
scribe for us a way of life
to gain that which the
Vedas prescribe for us.
All of us are not deemed
suitable to study the Vedas
as based on birth and up-
bringing. The Agamas

are said to be more liberal
and only demand good con-
duct and a thirst for
knowledge. They form
systematised thought on
Religion and hence are
also regarded as revela-
tions just as the Vedas
are. The essence of the
Agamas is said to be
found in the Shaiva Sid-
dhanta Sastras which
are said to be four-
teen. They stand on the
premises of Patbi, Pasu
and Pasam. God, soul
and world. By unre-
lentig logic they esta-
blish a philosophy of reli-
gion that has attracted
the best brains among
South Indian thinkers.
For a student of reli-
gion it becomes clear
that the revelations were
inspired out-pourings
of Bakthas and the philo-
sophical interpretations
were from earnest thinkers.
Religion comes from the
heart and philosophy from
the head and when we
combine heart and head
we gain gnana (wisdom)
and vignana (knowledge).

Maha-Sivarathri Day at Thiruketheswaram

The ancient Siva Tem-
ple of Thiruketheswa-
ram at Mantota in Man-
nar District, is a centre
of pilgrimage for the
Hindus from all parts of
Ceylon on Sivarathri Day
which falls this year on
Friday the 18th February
1966. There will collect
at this Temple the cream
of musical talent availa-
ble in Ceylon, devotional,
lyrical. Natheswaram,
Kathaprasangem, to par-
ticipate in the ceremo-
nies on that night. The
programme at Thiruke-
theswaram will be re-
layed throughout the
night from 9-30 p.m. for
the benefit of those ob-
serving Sivarathri in
their homes in Ceylon as
well as in India.

There will be an all
night service with api-
shekams during the four
quarters of the night with
a Theertham Ceremony
in the sacred Palavi Tank
early on Saturday the
19th morning to which
the Image of Lord
Ketheswarapathan and
Gowri Ambal will be
taken in procession.

The Railway Depart-
ment and C. T. B. have
made special arrange-
ments for a co-ordinated
rail-road service from
Vavuniya and Mannar to
Thiruketheswaram Tem-
ple and back for the con-
venience of the pilgrims.

Lord Budha was a Gnanin
of no mean order; after

ness and despair that Arjuna the fighter sought the help of Shri Krishna the charioteer to solve the riddle of life. Shri Krishna who was not at all different from God by all spiritual standards of all religious sects found in Arjuna the fighter, a spiritually ripe soul, ripe enough not for mere studentship or discipleship but for supreme prapatti or self-surrender. Nobody knows how the kindling of spiritual love and affection took place between the two, but we know the first overtures of this mysterious love came from the side of Shri Krishna. 'You are my most dear,' 'You are my truest friend', 'It grieves me to see you grieve', 'I am telling you the Parama Rahasya which none else knows' 'I am your antaryami, you worship me' are some of the expressions by which Shri Krishna is pouring his love and affection on the helpless Arjuna to endear him. Love begets love. Arjuna with all his conflicts resolved responds to Shri Krishna with equal force of love.

He surrenders and becomes a true being and a better Kshatriya and a better fighter. In the Bhagavad Gita, it is the actual meeting of the character and the fighter, the spiritual thrill that follows and the mutual absorption that takes place later, that are of great spiritual significance. The Upadesha itself is only secondary. In our Shaiva religion as in all theistic religions, God's Grace in its most pure form descends upon man through the agency of a Guru. The Guru himself is none other than the Almighty Shiva, the indweller in the hearts of all beings. Referring to Guru Shivajana Bodham says that he is 'தம்ருதல்', the powerful substratum on which all individual existences are based. It is only after one meets his Guru, his conflicts get resolved. His mind becomes calmed down. He becomes truly religious, spiritual attitudes begin to dawn in him. He comes to know the taste of spiritual freedom. Thirumantram in its own terse language says, 'குருவே சிவம் எனக்கறினன் நந்தி'.

JIVATMA FREED FROM FINITE EXISTENCE

Jnanam labdva param shantim acirena adhigacchati | tatha tu sarva dukkhanam hanih Asya upajayate ||

The moment the atman gets spiritual illumination he attains the state of parashantam. There after he becomes freed and all his sorrows come to an end.

Notes & Comments

Shivajana Bodham says in the 10th Sutra that when the soul is perfected and perfectly attuned to God all forms of fetters wither away. 'ஏகனுகி இறை பணி சிற்க மலம் மாயை தன்னொடு வல்வினை இன்றே.' The freed soul is the Shivajani who has completely merged in God. The mergence is so complete that there is no question of coming back to bondage. Appar Swamikal describes this state in the following words, 'மீளா ஆளாய் கொய் மலர்ச் சேவடி இனையே குறுகிடுமே'. To the freed soul இரவு பகலில்லை. Even the sun, the great author of time has no power over the freed soul. Manickavasaga Swamikal says 'கங்கெழில் குரையிறு எமக்கு'. Description about the great freedom, in which the Shivajani finds himself is best said in the Shivajanasiddhi in the following verse.

ROADS IN RUTS

The dilapidated state of the roads of this country, the chief lines of communication for the use of pedestrians and motor vehicles, is a serious blot on the administration. Not a single highway can be said to be reasonably safe for traffic particularly when the use of vehicles has become a matter of absolute necessity in every walk of life. The indifference to the proper maintenance of roads has been a matter of complaint all along. With the disasters frequently caused by floods, cyclones and other outrageous acts of nature the condition of thoroughfares has become intolerable. Owners of motor-vehicles and bicycles stand to lose very heavily owing to the damage that is being done to tyres, and even other valuable parts as a whole by the vehicles having to be driven along rut-studded roads for miles at a stretch. The severe restrictions that operate in the import of spare parts, tyres and other accessories add to the misfortune of motorists so much so that in the near future only a few road-worthy vehicles may remain. The Ceylon Transport Board uses several hundreds of omnibuses and is faced with a similar serious situation. The double-decker buses cannot be used on routes where the track is horribly rough and rut-ridden. There is the danger of even serious mishaps occurring owing to the hopeless state of roads.

Next to the problem of food comes the question of transport. The Minister in charge of communications and in fact every M. P. must pay immediate attention to this most urgent problem. The entire system of roads must be relaid and remodelled, better metal must be used, the road way and the side path must be well maintained.
