any exception proclaim that for attaining Salvation, the mind should be subdued; and once knows that control of the mind is their final aim. It is futile to make an interminable study of them. What is required for such control is actual enquiry into oneself by self-interrogation. 'Who am I?'

How can this enquiry in quest of the Self be made merely by means of a study of the scriptures?

One should realize the Self by the Eye of Wisdom. Does Rama need a mirror to recognize himself as Rama?

That to which the T refers is within the five sheaths, whereas the scriptures are outside them. Therefore, it is futile to seek by means of the study of scriptures the Self that has to be realized by summarily rejecting even the five sheaths.

To enquire 'who am I that am in bondage?' and to know one's real nature is alone Liberation.

To keep the mind constantly turned within and to abide thus in the Self, is alone Atma vichara (Self-enquiry), whereas dhyana (meditation) consists in fervent contemplation of the Self as Sat-Chit-Ananda (Being Consciousness-Bliss). Indeed at some time, one will have to forget everything that has been learnt.

Just as it is futile to examine the rubbish that has to be swept up only to be thrown away, so it is futile for him who seeks to know the Self to set to work enumerating the tattvas that envelop the Self and examining them instead of casting

He should consider the phenomenal world with reference to himself as merely a dream.

Except that the wakeful state is long and the dream state is short, there is no difference between the two. All the activities of the dream state appear, for the time being, just as real as the activities of the wakeful state seem to be while awake. Only, during the dream state, the mind assumes another form or a different bodily sheath. For thoughts on the one hand and name and form on the other occur simultaneously during both the wakeful and dream states.

There are not two minds, one good and the other evil. It is only the vasanas or tendencies of the mind that are of two kinds, good and favourable, evil and unfavourable. When the mind is associated with the former it is called good; and when associated with the latter it is called evil.

However evil-minded other people may appear to you, it is not proper to hate or despise them, likes and dislikes, love and hatred are equally to be eschewed.

It is also not proper to let the mind often rest on objects or affairs of mundane life. As far as possible one should not interfere in the affairs of others. Everything offered to others is really an offering to oneself; and if only this truth were realized, who is there that would refuse anything to others?

If the ego rises, all else will also rise; if it subsides, all else will also subside.

CHAPTER 4

SLOKA 1

ANTAR - ATMAN

Yah antare vartate sabbah tasya vaca pr. vartakah |
prana apana samayogat sa antaratma prakirtitah ||

The individual soul in association with the inaudible natham (நாதம்) that resides in the cavity of the heart is called antar atman. This inaudible natham again in association with Prana and apana becomes audible sound.

Notes and Comments

Natham is also called Sukshuma Vak (சூக்ஷ்மவாக்) It is possible that it is identical with what they say as 'The Word' in the Bible. Bible says 'In the beginning was the word, the word was God, and the word was with God.'

This Sukshuma Vak is the vibrant form and perhaps the first manifestation of God himself. The first manifestation of God is the first concealment of God. To the aspirant this Sukshuma Vak is the last obstacle (நிலை) that separates him from God. Even advanced yogins are unable to have a vision of this Sukshuma Vak which is so close to God and so different from him. A development of this சூக்ஷ்மவாக் is the pranti Vak (பிரந்திவாக்) which is less vibrant in its nature and more concrete in its form. Yogins with their minds completely calmed down occasionally get a glimpse of this Vak. This pranti associated with உதானவாயு gives rise to madyama Vak. Introverts, deep thinkers, and contemplatives always get a clear picture of this Madyama Vak (மத்திமவாக்) which is not different from the silent thoughts of our minds. This Madyama Vak associated with Prana—the vital air we breathe—becomes Vaikari Vak (வைகரிவாக்) which is the normal speech by the mouth. Bhaktas and devotees who are more emotional than intellectual in their outlook, follow up this Vak Marga and begin a life of singing the praises of God, finally to lose even the 'அகரம்' that lingers on to them when it comes to a case of complete communion with God.

Natham is the Viyanbhaka Shakti (வினயசக்தி) by which all beings in all planes of existence express themselves. Without it existence is not at all possible. Shivajanasidhi says 'விந்துஞானம் பேசின தில்லையாகில் விளங்கிய ஞானம் இன்றும்'.
