## THE CORE OF INDIAN CULTURE

RISHABHOHAND

Each race or nation has its soul, which is a living, individual image or representation of the transcendent and universal Spirit. It seeks its characteristic self-expression, a full and unfettered flowering of its distinctive swabhava or self-nature in material life.

The life-form it assumes for its self-expression, the mode and mould peculiar to it and responsive to its ethos, the particular disposition and play of the psycho-physical forces which help the development and fulfilment of its swadharma, or self-law, constitute its culture.

Culture is, therefore, a growth from within, and not a pattern of life put on or imposed from without.

It is not a creation of environment or circumstances, though it may take a specific pattern or hue from them.

It may be modified for the better or the worse by extraneous influences, and even overlaid for a time by accidental accretions; but so long as it is alive, it retains something of its original spirit and substance, and is capable of a resurgence.

It is only when the soul of a race or a nation withdraws from its own manifestation that the life-form or culture it has created, dies and disintegrates, leaving only an effete structure or a fossilised shell, as it happened in Greece and Rome and Egypt, to carry on the make-believe of a cultural life.

But so long as the soul of a nation has not retreated from its manifestation, its culture, though decayed and debilitated, is yet capable of a revival, and even a recovery and enrichment of its past greatness.

The spirit of a culture lies, therefore, not in the

superficial idiosyncracies, the habits and customs and conventions of its adherents, but in their inner orientation, their psychological centre of gravity, the texture and colour of their thoughts and dreams, the dominant urge and drive of their life-forces and the recurrent refrain of their heart's music.

Judged by the above standard, what is it in Indian culture that can be called its core? What is there in it that is individual and distinctive, distinguishing it from all other cultures of the world? What is it that has kept it not only alive, but untiringly creative over so many thousands of years—creative even in its periods of decline—and now brings about its renaissance in a way that amazes the whole world?

No doubt, all would assert that it is its spirituality. But that is rather a summary statement, which fails to bring out the specific essence of the matter.

The core of Indian culture is an inextinguishable aspiration for God. Indian culture is perennially polarised to the essential Truth and Reality of existence, to the Eternal and Infinite Who contains, constitutes and transcends the temporal appearances.

On the one hand, there is the insistent, inescapable question in the Upanishads: "What is that by knowing which all is known?", and, on the other hand, the rapturous exclamation of the Vedic Rishi: "I have known this Supreme Purusha, effulgent like the sun, beyond the darkness", announcing the ultimate, the highest, the most glorious spiritual discovery.

In between, there have been many realisations—personal salvation (mukti), self-extinction (nirvana),

self-immersion in the immutable Brahman (Brahma nirvana) etc., etc.

These are all, of course, sublime realisations in their own way; they have enjoyed the exclusive devotion of many a promising soul; but they are not the supreme realisation.

They are only so many decisive landmarks on the path, not the ultimate goal.

The ultimate goal is God the one Being without a second, the "devanamadideva ekah" of the Rig Veda, the Supreme Purusha. That God, the Supreme Purusha, is the ultimate Reality is made abundantly clear by the Vedic and Upanishadic Rishis.

"There is nothing beyond the Being, Purusha; That is the extreme Ultimate, the supreme God."

This Purusha, the Rishis affirm, is higher than the Immutable—Aksharat paratah parah. He is higher than even the Unmanifest—Avyaktat tu parah Purushah. The Gita speaks of the Purushottama; who is beyond the Akshara, as the one desirable object of man's love and devotion, and regards Brahma-nirvana as only a stage on the soul's journey to God. God, the Divine, the one Person who has created and maintains the whole universe, is the ultimate Reality; the Unmanifest and the Immutable are only His poises and statuses.

"When men seek after the Immutable, the Indeterminable, the Unmanifest, the All-pervading, the Unthinkable, the Summit Self, the Immobile, the Permanent, equal in mind to all, intent on the good of all beings, it is to Me that they come."

—The Gita, XII, 3, 4.

The Purushottama or Parameshwara comprehends, harmonises and transcends all that exists.

## PANCHANGAMS

SOURI RAYAN

The disparity between various panchangams was such a chronic complaint that the Indian Government set up a Calendar reform committee to formulate a common calendar for the whole of India. Yet this Committee after much research could not give a calendar for universal acceptance. This is perhaps due to their inability to rise to the heights of the intellectual level of the ancient Rishis who gave their Sidhantas. The new Indian Government calendar fixes Mesha sankranti on the day the sun crosses the equator at the spring equinox equivalent to the 22nd March whereas the religious calendars fix mesha sankranti on 13/14th April. This is due to the disparity between the Sayana and Nirayana zodiacal systems. The sayana is concerned with the direct relationship of the earth to the sun. The earth in its rotation round the sun in one year has four cardinal points viz. the two solstices and two equinoxes that four seasons come in between the four points. The spring equinox ushers in Vasanta or spring which really occurs, when the sun is as at present in the sign of pisces owing to the precession of the equinoxes which occurs at the rate of 1 degree in 72 years. This equinox once occurred in the 1st degree of mesha which is exactly 180° opposite the constellation Chitra (spica) that lies on the boundary between Kanya (Virgo) and Thula (Libra). Hence the zodiac of the sayana system is tropical and terrestrial whereas the zodiac of the Nirayana system is celestial and sidereal; once in 27000 years or so the two equinoctial points coincide. People who have studied the movements of the star canopus or agastya think that the marriage of Parvathi to Parameshwara took place when the vernal equinox was at
