47 Association with prakriti gives rise to notions of 'I' and 'mine', and thereby arise Karma and bondage. This karma and bondage throw the being back into prakriti and this cycle gets repeated again and again. The atmajnani transcending this cycle never owns that he is a doer. All physical and biological laws are mere fragments of this universal, natural law of Karma all scientific accuracies and precessions merely fade into insignificance in the presence of this most scientific and most powerful law of Karma most fundamentally man is a being. This beingness in its most ultimate form is caused by his feeling, knowing and willing. These three threads in the background of காலம் are twisted together to form the cord of Karma.

Karma is motivated by desire and it yields pain and pleasure as its fruits. This doctrine of Karma is common to the Hindus and the Buddhists. But there is a difference. Buddhists speak about Karma and Karma alone. Hinduism does not stop there. Along with Karma, it speaks about the doer of the Karma, also it speaks about the intelligence that operates the Karma. ## VAIKASI VISAKAM

(BY A CEYLON TAMIL)

The full moon day of the month of Vaikasi when the sun is in the zodiacal sign of Rishapa (Taurus) usually falls in the Visaka nakshetra hence the name Visaka held sacred to the War God. Karhigeysa or Skanda. Lord Budha's Paranibana, enlightenment and birth are said to have occurred on the full moon day of the Chandra masa of va'saka which is usually one month ahead but rarely these two coincide. On the Vaisaka full moon day there takes place a great ceremony of Kap hita wanawa or planting of the Kap at the ancient shrine at Kataragama dedicated to Lord Skanda. It is a preliminary Rite in the Esala perahera in the month of Ashada or Adi. This year an extra lunar month or Adimasa is falling in the next ashada month. A pongal festival takes place in Vaikasi Visakam day at the Kannagi Temple at Wattapola where pilgrims to Kataragama gather to trek their way to the sacred shrine for the festivals usually arriving there in time for the Adimavasaya new moon. This is the ancient Kathira yutra that is celebrated in song and dance with Kavadis long before the advent of Buddhism. Vaikasi Visakam was observed as a sacred day for the observance of soma yagna performed in late spring (Vasanta) during uttarayana. This is the season when plants after their winter hibernation shoot out buds and life is revised. The juice of the Soma plant is ritually obtained and allowed to ferment before being used as an exhilarating drink at the yagna etc.; what the soma plant is no one knows as it has gone out of existence and people are unable to identify it. With the advent of the Buddha yagnas went out of fashion and temple

festivals became popular, hence we have more temple festivals when the sun is in the northern hemisphere than at other times; yagnas were performed to propitiate the devas who help man in his existence on earth being eventually dependant on each other. In this atomic age devas are not cared for and man seeks his own destruction by his folly.

### Two Complementary Needs

If both the demands are unitedly put forward together by the Tamil community, there is a greater chance of both being accepted; if on the other the demands are split into two and each put forward not unitedly but separately by two different sections of the Tamil community at variance with each other, there is greater risk of danger to either requirement. Apart therefrom, it will result in unnecessary division of the Tamil community, not based on political principles, which division will have its baneful repercussions on the process of national harmony and integration which could well be avoided. Inherently, there is no question of conflict or priority involved in the two requirements, which are distinct in character and purpose but are complementary in substance to each other, and are therefore, each on its own merits, worthy of being granted without any further delay, even if separately put forward by two schools of thought or two groups. There has been long and inordinate delay already in the case of both requirements.

## Conference Urges Early Establishment

At a well attended Conference of public spirited social workers held at the Jaffna Central College Hall on Wednesday June 1, presided over by Sivanerikavalar T. Muttusamipillai, Bar-at-Law, President of the Jaffna Saiva Paripalana Sabha, it was unanimously resolved to demand the early establishment of a Hindu University in Jaffna named after the illustrious educationist and patriot, Sir P. Ramanathan.

Mr. G. G. Ponnampalam M. P. for Jaffna explained

his view of a Hindu University. A committee was appointed to take practical steps in this matter.

- 48 The atman who dwells in the prakriti is bound up by the three malas and is never a mukta. He who is detached from Prakriti is not bound up by the malas and is always a mukta.
- 49 Dispelling all darkness the self-luminous lamp shines forth, spreads its light and illuminates the objects. Similarly dispelling all darkness of ignorance, the self luminous Pati shines forth, spreads its light and illuminates pasu and pasam (மரணம்).
- 50 For want of oil the light of a lamp loses its brightness and is finally extinguished. Similarly to the atma jnani, the reflected light from prakriti loses its brightness and is finally extinguished. He dwells permanently in his final refuge—atmajnanam.

### Notes & Comments

The law of Karma is immutable. It operates in the physical mental and the spiritual planes. Except the Jnani who is not separate from God, all others are subject to this law of Karma. This Karma is of three kinds. They are (1) Sanchita—the accumulated Karmas of the past, all adhering to the faculty of Buddhi or intellect. This Sanchita in a way determines the tendencies aptitudes, capacities and desires of a person. This accumulated stuff can be removed only by the Gnana Guru — by அத்தவசோதனை which is a particular type of psycho-analysis in which the Guru is the analyst and sishya the subject. If the Guru and the Sishya are of very high spiritual attainments it is said, that in the mere presence of the Guru, the accumulated Sanchita of the Sishya is burnt off entirely without any residue.

The second kind of Karma is called prarabhdha. This refers to that portion of the past Karma which is responsible for the present body. It is only exhausted by being experienced. It lingers on to a person even if he is a Shivajnani till the last living moments of this body. The third kind of Karma is called Agamiya. This is the Karma which is now being made for the future. A Shiva Jnani who lives in God consciousness is not bound by Agamiya Karma.

### HASTEN THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE HINDU UNIVERSITY

Explaining the objects of the Conference that was held this week at the Jaffna Central College Hall demanding the establishment of a Hindu University, Sivanerikavalar T. Muttusamipillai, in his presidential address, declared that the request was reasonable legitimate, popular and could not be opposed with a sense of seriousness by any citizen of Lanka least of all by any Tamil speaking person.

In our view the Conference merely reiterated the proposal that was indicated by that peerless patriot and philanthropist, the undisputed leader of the entire Island during his life time, Sir P. Ramanathan, pursued later by eminent educationists and approved by both parties the U. N. P. and the S. L. F. P. Any attempt to hoodwink the Government and the public by any party is in effect a subtle move to deprive the Tamil speaking people of the chance of their realising their legitimate aspirations. The reported rejoinder to the Hindu University Movement by a number of Tamil-speaking Members of Parliament, on the very face of it, indicates and betrays the working of the political mind that has always been mischievously manoeuvring to divide the masses on important issues and thereby to delay and damage the cause of the minorities.

In this context we make bold to appeal to the Premier whose statesmanship has become the praise of the world to express his considered views on this problem and help the country out of a wanton crisis particularly as he has full knowledge of the proposal for a Hindu University and the provision of several token votes in the Budget including a Draft Bill for this purpose.

**Square of Pegasus**

The jaundiced planet, Saturn, traditionally the bane and bigaboo of heavenly bodies according to the ascriptions of astrologers, now shines as a 1st magnitude object in the straggling and in conspicuous constellation of Meena, Pisces, the Fishes. It is of interest that Saturn is at present nearly, but not quite, in the position occupied by the Sun at his vernal equinox or "The First Point of Aries" on March 21st, being just 2 degrees or 4 Moon-breadths south of the celestial equator.

It does not need a trained eye to detect on his north and west the great Square of Pegasus, a stellar sky mark easy of identification by reason of the 4 stars of almost equal brightness forming the rectangle, some 14 degrees square. He lies on the great circle of the equinoctial where practically coincident with the 2 easterly stars of the Square, all 3 objects being equidistant from each other and bearing due north and south with Saturn supreme in lustre.

In the morning of Sunday the 12th the waning crescent of the 22½ day-old Moon will lie 2 degrees south of Saturn, to make a beautiful brace of celestials. But in an awesome abyss sunders them for while the Moon is but a bagatelle of a 250 thousand miles from the Earth Saturn is at the dizzy distance of 900 million miles. They rise around 1 a m on this morn.
