SLOKAS 51, 52 & 53

KUMBHA - AKASHA INDIVIDUAL ATMAN

- (51) Gada samvrita akasho neyamane yadha Gade |
Gade neyata na akashah tadvad jivah nabho upamah ||
- (52) Bhiune kumbhe yadha akashah akashatvam prapadyate |
vibhinne prakrite dehe tadha atma paratmani ||
- (53) ite evam adhikarena sarvajnena adhikarina |
sarva bandhat vinirmuktah sarvajnah sarvado bhavet ||

Akasha is contained in a Kumbha. When kumbha is taken from one place to another we say kumbha is moved entirely forgetting about the presence of the akasha in it. The embodied atman is like the akasha contained in the Kumbha.

When the Kumbha is broken the akasha within it merges into the vast Expanse called Bhutakasha. Similarly the atman in the perfected state detaches from the body and merges into the Paratman.

Released from all forms of adhikaratvam and all forms of bondage by the all knowing God, the Jnani becomes an all knowing being. Deriving his powers from God, he grants all kinds of boons and gifts to those who ask for them.

Notes & Comments

Kumbha - Akasha:—All agamic religions compare our body to a Kumbha and the embodied atman to the akasha contained in the Kumbha. When the atman leaves the sthula deha it is directed by its past Karma to some other suitable abode. But when it detaches itself from the sukshuma deha (which happens only when perfect release is obtained) it merges into the Paratman. This mergence of the atman into Paratman is compared to the mergence of the Kumbha-Akasha with the Bhuta akasha. The comparison given here is used only in a limited sense, to bring forth clearly—what actually takes place in the final state of bliss.

A Tamil Hindu University

(By DR. S. RAMANATHAN)

The scope for higher education or University education is not sufficiently provided for in Ceylon; the only secular university at Peradeniya is overcrowded and there is very little room for the ever increasing number of students seeking admission in spite of the Buddhist universities where secular education is imported in addition to religions. Indeed it was vainly hoped that pressure for space will be reduced with the opening of the two privena universities. Some educationists think there is enough scope to open other universities in the North, East and South. Many think that University colleges should be opened in these places and affiliated to the Ceylon University to ensure uniformity of standards. The late Sir Ponnampalam Ramanathan built the two Hindu colleges, Ramanathan and Parameshwara with the idea of developing them into a Hindu University. He would have done that if he could have lived and the political climate had not changed. Hindu education had not thrived

in this country owing to lack of Government patronage. Perhaps it was best during the rule of Tamil Kings of Jaffna who were Hindus. It must be said to the credit of the Sinhalese Kings that Tamil and Sanskrit found a place in their scheme of education. Now the sovereign right is in the hands of the people who should be guided in the proper channels. The Tamils have no separate state nor government; the only heritage they have got is their Religion Hinduism and if they have to maintain their individuality then their heritage has to be protected and a Hindu University with provision for modern secular learning is what they need and the national Government should not hesitate to establish a Hindu university as planned by the great patriot Ramanathan with provision for religious and secular education. The Government of Ceylon owes a debt of gratitude to him. All Tamils and Sinhalese must unite to demand such a university to be established soon.

the Jnani merged in Brahman finds that he is no longer an embodied being. He finds that he is as free as the blowing wind, alighting at all places and associating with all events he expresses the last 'lakshya artha' of the word 'தத்தம் தர்மி'.

Now he is an embodiment of the eight divine qualities of Shiva. He realises his final fulfillment in Shivatvam.

Notes & Comments

The eight divine qualities of Shiva are சுவ தந்திரம், விசத்தேகம், கிராமயஜ்ஞம், சர்வஞ்ஞம், அநாதிபோதம், அனுபதிசத்தி, அநந்தசத்தி and திருத்தி. It appears to us that it is not all the qualities but all excluding அநாதிபோதம் that are actually reflected by the perfected atman in its state of bliss. When this agama like the other agamas says that the perfected atman is identical with Shiva, it should not be inferred that the atman becomes another பட்சகுத்திய முர்த்தி like Shiva. The perfected atman in the state of bliss is still a தத்தம் தர்மி. He is still one who leans on support entirely dependent on Shiva and his Grace (மீளா அடிமை). Even in this state of bliss he can know things only if he is helped to know. He can have spiritual experiences only if he is helped to experience. We are reminded of our sacred sayings like 'விளம்புமா விளம்பே', 'குருமாருகரே' occurring in our Thirumurai Literature when we struggle to realise the sort of bliss attained by the individual atman in its final union with God.

THIRUKURRAL

SOURI RAYAN

The Thirukurral is the hall mark of Tamil culture in which the author displays keen insight into human problems. His approach is the positive one of recommending and persuading the individual to imbibe the positive teaching and not the negative one of ordering or commanding one not to do this and that. This shows his deep understanding of human nature. His emphasis on aram or dharma as the basis of all actions shows the great spiritual outlook and the welfare of man and society. One must be well grounded in dharma before proceeding to artha or porul and later to Kama or in pam to make life worth living in preparation for Moksha or Veedu. His allusion to Bagavan or Iraivan shows his devotion to the supreme Godhead and his emphasis on a theistic education makes education full and complete and which is the aim of studies. He is in accord with the life of Vedio Rishis who taught their pupils Upanishads by personal touch, precept and example. The teachings of the Kurral have been interpreted by different sects in different ways to suit their own sectional outlook but one can easily see the universal outlook—a common approach to human problems by the author. The book could be studied by one and all without regard to Adikara or fitness to study provided the teacher is one who professes its teachings faithfully and merely makes use of the Kurral to quote couplets to emphasise his own ideas. From its teachings it is clear that the author was conversant with Veda and Vedante, Baudha and Jaina concepts were giving a treatise with the impress of his own individuality. Tamils are fortunate to have such a universal book to guide
