Indian culture is a complex pattern, a composite culture into which have gone many diverse elements, foreign as well as indigenous. To equate Indian culture with Hindu culture is factually wrong." Having said this he hastens to add, "However, a second statement must ly, that despite the composite nature of Indian culture Hinduism remains by far the most powerful and persuasive element in that culture"
