SITE PROBLEM SOLVED

C. T. B. Provides Relief Centre

The C. T. B. authorities deserve to be congratulated on their opening a second Central Bus Stand in the Jaffna City to relieve congestion in the Old Bus Stand. Expansion and extension—these have been achieved by C. T. B. since the formation of the National Government. The Minister of Nationalised Services has full co operation and support of the C. T. B.

The transport problem in Jaffna has been always presenting difficulties to the authorities. The phenomenal increase in the travelling population has been demanding extension and expansion in every sphere. The C. T. B. well aware of the needs of the travelling public did well in making bus travel available to all parts of the Peninsula connecting high roads and by roads and organising a special service for school children.

The latest move of the C. T. B. to provide a second Bus stand for the city is highly commendable. The tug of war between interested parties in the selection of sites will now have to come to a stop in view of the fact that the readily available strips of land in the city have been made available for the stands. The entire service has been re-grouped and the vehicles that use the Kandy-Jaffna road are now scheduled to start the journeys from the second stand adjoining the Power Station leaving the Old Bus Stand to accommodate passengers for the remaining routes. It is also heartening to note that boards exhibiting the time table of service have been erected. This will serve a good deal to inform the public of the movements of buses. However, the need for printed time tables to be sold to the public still remains.

There is another innovation that can be introduced with advantage. The public address system will be very useful in centres where there are several routes and where confusion is bound to prevail, passengers running hither and thither hunting for information. Over-

crowding in buses is unavoidable in the sense that there are not enough buses to cope with the traffic. But there is over crowding because passengers do not get the proper direction regarding the service particularly where there is a short service operating within a long route. The delay in the issue of tickets is another matter that can be circumvented by the printed tickets being used for all routes. The seating of passengers also must engage the attention of the C. T. B. staff. Travellers take unduly long time to alight from crowded buses by their failure to occupy seats of vantage.

Taking everything into account the C. T. B. deserves approbation for the improvements and extensions that have been made so far. It is to be hoped that before long the C. T. B. will be a full blossomed transport service worthy of emulation by other countries.

- 37 Karmas get heaped up as sanchita by our physical and mental acts. These acts of our previous births constitute our past Karma and they decide the nature of the body we get now. According to this Karma our senses and mind begin to function in this birth.

Shaiva Siddhantic conception of evolution and involution

Shiva is supreme and transcendent. It is his divine universal presence we call Shivasakti. It is his divine force of differentiation we call mayasakti. It is this mayasakti that evolves and involutes. This mayasakti is called 'ajahi sakti'. She is not an illusory phenomenon but resplendent reality, although in a limited sense. She evolves to help the individual souls embedded in her to get rid of anavamala the most pernicious of all evils. She involutes to lead these individual souls to temporary rest after their Karmas get exhausted. During the state of dissolution this mayasakti remains in a latent, subtle and undifferentiated form. When the Karmas of the souls embedded in her ripen, impelled by the great divine presence of Shiva, once again creation begins. The undifferentiated mayasakti gets transformed into pancha-aksharas, pancha moortis, pancha pranas, panchaendriyas and Pancha Bhutas. It is the great

DEFICIT DEEPENS

No Minister of Finance, nor any Premier can hope to make both ends of our country's Budget meet. This opinion has almost become a truism. The deficit increases with every year and the same feeling of insufficiency continues to demoralise both the Cabinet and the people.

A close scrutiny of the allocations to the different Departments of Administration will however disclose the undeniable fact that the proposals of expenditure are all reasonably required and cannot be decreased even by an infinitesimal fraction.

The National Government has without any mental reservations placed the complete picture of the country's financial position before the public thereby indirectly appealing to the people for sincere assistance in the matter of reducing the cost of living.

A Committee of Experts on finance must be appointed to explore the means of minimising waste and increasing revenue. Debates in Parliament cannot serve the purpose of putting aright the pre-

On Proposed Educational Reforms

Nevertheless, we feel that it is our duty to place before you our views concerning the proposed Scheme.

1. School going age: Any student completing 5 years on or before 1st of May of a year be eligible for admission at the beginning of the year

The school leaving age should be 16 to provide for a general education up to and including the G. C. E. (O. L.) level. There must be no diversification of students before the G. C. E. (O. L.) level, and every child must be able to offer Arts and Science subjects up to the G. C. E. (O. L.) level.

2. Medium of Instruction:

The medium of instruction shall be the mother tongue. A child cannot exercise this right unless the State provides well equipped schools for his language medium. Nor can a parent exercise a free choice regarding language medium unless there are facilities for education in both the language media in the area in which he lives.

3. School Welfare Boards:

The Official members of the Board should not exceed the representatives of the parents and the past pupils. For instance, the nominee of the Regional Director shall not exceed one.

The School Welfare Board shall not have any power over teachers and pupils. It will be a serious infringement on the

sent precarious financial position. Expenditure must be strictly supervised and kept to the bare minimum requirements. Collection of revenue must be carefully organised so that every cent might be recovered. A National Drive must be organised by the people to help the Government in its endeavour to remedy the serious economic situation.

freedom of the teacher.

4. Private Schools:

Private Schools should fall in line with the scheme of zoning and where Private Schools do not fall in line, they must be taken over.

5. Estate Schools:

The state should take over the Estate Schools.

6 Recruitment of Teachers:

New graduate teachers should be made permanent after a probationary period of 6 months.

Non-graduate teachers should be made permanent after one year of probation.

There must be a proper scheme of recruitment to the teaching service. Recruitment of teachers on an allowance is an insult to the profession. It means the employment of cheap labour to buttress a nobler profession.

A non-graduate teacher on graduation should be appointed to a secondary school.

7 Regional Teacher Service:

The Association welcomes the principle of the Regional Teacher Service. All new teachers must be recruited on a regional basis. Teachers who were in service on 1-12-60 should be considered to belong to the region in which they taught on that date, provided that, any teacher should have the right to apply for a transfer to the region of his choice, and provided further, that there should be no new recruitment to any region to which the number of teachers seeking transfer exceeds the number of vacancies existing in that region.

8. Regional Appointment and Transfer Boards:

The acceptance of the principle of a Regional Service necessarily implies that appointments, promotions, transfers and disciplinary action against teachers must be vested in a Regional Appointment and Transfer Board with the right of appeal to a Tribunal where necessary.

Representatives of Teacher's Associations should sit as equal partners with the officials in these Boards. This Board shall determine the nature of the Efficiency Bars Examination, if any.

9. Teachers' Leave:

There should be no reduction in the present leave facilities of the teachers. But a teacher should have the right to accumulate casual leave and utilize it for:

- (1) additional sick leave

According to the Agamas Sadashiva is the first and the highest manifested form of transcendental Shiva. He is called Pati — the ruler of the universe. This Sarvajnanottara Agama says that the 10-eternal principles are not three, but four which are பசு, பாசம், பதி and சிவம்.
