2. Our Society further submits with the respect that the control of Higher Education in Ceylon be vested in the National Council of Higher Education, of which the Minister of Education shall be ex officio Chairman and that a majority decision of the Council shall be conclusive in matters relating to the subject of Higher Education, provided however that the autonomy of each University is fully preserved.

Mr. Vallipuram Kandiah of Nallur, born 69 years ago, passed away on the night of July 10th rather unexpectedly, when everybody thought he was recovering from his illness. He retired to bed and with his palms held together in worship was muttering the Mantra "Muruga, Muruga, Muruga" when he quietly breathed his last. What a peaceful parting of the soul from this sin-worn mould?

It is said that

"On some fond breast the parting soul relies
Some pious drops the closing eye requires"

So with these artless but affectionate lines, have I endeavoured to supply them to my old schoolmate. Despite the fact that he was born in an outlandish village in Jaffna "a youth to Fame and Fortune unknown" he had blossomed into a loveable leader of men in the cosmopolitan towns of Malaya, where he was a trusted employee of the State Railways. He had moved there in an uneasy half way house, between two civilisations. Yet, in his guileless heart, the conventional antagonisms of the East and the West had got reconciled and he had grown up to be a popular figure, loved and respected by all. His word was as sound as a board and he never failed a friend.

His married life was marked with unparalleled domestic felicity. He was blessed with 3 brilliant boys and a dutiful daughter. Fortune too had smiled on him benevolently. Whilst heading for a life of ease and comfort, the War broke out and he fell a victim, like many others of his station, to the Japanese marauders, who relieved him of most of his earthly possessions. So, he returned to Jaffna on retirement, sans health, sans wealth, but a chastened, religious mystic. Unlike the average human being, who got tossed about like a cork upon the Sea of Samstra in a seething turmoil of emotions of likes and dislikes, of fears and hopes,

he remained unruffled and unaffected by the vagaries and vicissitudes of life.

In Jaffna, he used to get up before day break, chanting holy hymns and keep himself ever occupied—watering the plants in his garden, being his hobby—for, he believed "in filling the unforgiving minute with sixty seconds' worth of distance run". He was highly religious and would preach to all the virtues of vegetarianism and exhort everyone to dedicate themselves to the service of humanity.

A large gathering of friends and relations attended the funeral and mourned his loss. As a Hindu, would I be wrong, if I said, that the person whom we knew as Kandiah will live on, may be as a purified soul, projected to life on a distant plane; or may be, that the wave-length has already vitalised some human conception somewhere in this wide world to be re-born in due course, as a nobler Being to do greater good to humanity.
