LEADER OF NATIONAL GOVERNMENT GREETED WITH LOVE AND AFFECTION

City of Jaffna Celebrates Visit Right Royally

Seventy Five Thousand Form A Sea Of Heads At The Esplanade

The People's Premier Mr. Dudley Senanayake wrote a new chapter into the history of Lanka when he finished his one-day round the clock visit to the Northern Capital. The Railway clock chimed eleven as the Special Saloon steamed into the Station to be greeted by a thunderous ovation from the distinguished gathering accommodated on the platform and the sweet rhythmic notes of oriental music — Nagaswaram and Thavil.

The Government Agent Jaffna Mr. Vernon Abeyakera performed the official routine introducing the distinguished gathering on the platform to the Premier who was all smiles. Immediately afterwards the Premier and the Ministers and Parliamentary Secretaries who were present at the Sta-

tion were led to a specially erected dais at the entrance of the station. The Government Agent welcomed the Premier who acknowledged the greetings and said that his visit was made possible by the democratic parties, decision to form a National Government a declaration that evoked the sponta-

neous acclamation of the several thousands thronging the outer yard,

Selected Faculties at Jaffna for University Education

The Resolution:

"That in order to provide accommodations and facilities to all those qualified and eligible at the G. C. E. (A/L) Examination for admission to University education in Ceylon, selected facilities be opened immediately in Jaffna for the 1966-67 sessions by the University of Ceylon for Arts, Science, Medicine and Engineering, as adequate number of candidates are selected to these every year from the Northern Province alone so as to run such faculties to capacity and efficiency, and that the Ministry of Education be requested to release four or more institutions in Jaffna for those purposes."

Explanatory Note:

1 Those passing in three or more subjects at the G. C. E. (A/L) Examination are eligible for University education, and they have a right to be given accommodation and facilities to pursue such courses as they qualify for. But it is well known that many are rejected for want of accommodation or are asked to study as external students. It is therefore imperative that existing Universities are expanded or new Universities started. But a full-fledged University may take a long time to come into being or even to get started in a modest way. Therefore the present University of Ceylon may be requested to start a few faculties in new centres to meet the numbers seeking admission to those particular faculties where present facilities are inadequate. Faculties in the category of inadequate supply are Arts, Science, Medicine and Engineering. Proof for that is the fact that many were rejected in

previous years for those faculties, not for want of qualifications but for want of accommodation and facilities. So a start must be made in 1966-67 to meet the increasing demand for such courses of study. (Numbers cannot be restricted on so-called grounds of employment opportunities, firstly because there is no planning and development and hence any equation would be unrealistic, and secondly because in a mixed economy everybody has a right for higher education, though not for any other reason, at least for the purpose of self-employment and self-satisfaction.)

2. It now arises as to how we might ease the situation. A cheap suggestion—the cheapest in my view—is made in some quarters that the G. A. Q. and G. S. Q. classes should be shifted to some schools as a temporary measure till such time as better provisions are made. This is impractical and harmful to the cause of higher education. If it is meant something like A/L class it will not work well, because the A/L class is one approved by the Department of Education while the other has to be approved and recognised by the University of Ceylon. They must of necessity be governed and supervised by the University and cannot be left to the administration of Colleges. There are many problems of administration like Staffing, Time Table, Library, Laboratory, Discipline etc. Further it would not tackle the problems in the other faculties like Medicine and Engineering. University control could be delayed only for a year. The next year the problem has to be faced by the University again.

3. The solution must fall

Representations to the Committee re Higher Education Bill

3. Our Society also submits that the subject of Higher Education in Ceylon including University Education is a matter for full and leisurely consideration by a Commission of Experts, some of whom may be from foreign countries. In making this submission, our Society is only restating an opinion already expressed for years by the general public of Ceylon including those conversant with educational affairs. It is reported in the Press that Government contemplates the appointment of a Commission to consider the subject of taxation in Ceylon and that experts from foreign countries are also to be included in such a Commission. It is respectfully submitted

that the cause of Higher Education also merits equal forethought, circumspection, labour and trouble.

4. Our Society feels very strongly that there is urgent need for adequate and suitable provision for University education for Tamil speaking students and that this urgent and vital objective could be achieved by the dual method of:—

(a) providing more facilities for University education for Tamil speaking students in addition to the University of Ceylon, which is being over-

crowded,

(b) and by providing equal opportunities at the University of Ceylon on the ground of merit and educational fitness.

5. We state with due deference that more time could be given by Parliament to the public to make representations and that the time already allotted is entirely inadequate in proportion to the importance of the subject and would earnestly request this submission be considered.

(6) We request that the Parliamentary Committee be pleased to receive a deputation from our Society to meet the Committee and to elaborate further the views of our Society including our present representations, which under the circumstances, we have been compelled to make in a hurry owing to procedural requirements laid down by the Parliamentary Committee.

STATESMAN OF STEADY WISDOM

The spontaneity of the splendid expression of joyous greetings that were extended to the People's Premier when he visited Jaffna on August 9, serves as a true indication of the value of the change in political outlook which has been made possible by the formation of the National Government in March 1965. For ten long tiresome years no Premier of Lanka could think of exchanging cordiality with the leaders of the Tamil Speaking people particularly because of the communal tension that had been subtly created by the S. L. F. P. and the M. E. P. National leadership is now in worthy hands rejoicingly remarked Mr G. G. Ponnambalam, leader of the All Ceylon Tamil Congress, in welcoming the People's Premier on behalf of the surging gathering that formed a limitless sea of human heads all around the Jaffna Esplanade to witness what was humorously described as the Parliament specially sitting in the provincial Capital of the North. A TOUCH OF DIVINITY

After thirty-six years of Government service I desired to spend the rest of my life in the service of God.

One night, I developed a dull pain near the left shoulder. After two days I could not lift my hand above 45°. My family doctor diagnosed it as arthritis. gave me injections and made me swallow a large number of pills. He added that the relief would be only temporary.

Being an ardent devotee of Lord Venkatesa of Tirupati I decided to take a trip and have darsan of the Lord. It was February and the weather was very chill. But despite the pain in the shoulder, I had a cold water bath about 4-30 a.m and reached shrine about 5 30 a.m. After Viswarupa Darsan, I waited for the Thomala Darsan, and Archana, we were seated first outside the sanctum sanctorum facing the magnificent murti.

While the archana was going on, I made a fervent prayer to Him, saying 'My beloved God, you know everything. Even the tiny grass does not move except at your will. If it is Your will, that I should suffer from this pain all the rest of my life, preventing me from serving you with my hands I appeal to you in all humility and earnestness to remove me from this world. If not, as you are an ocean of kindness, have mercy and make me all right.' Tears rolled down my cheeks. When I opened my eyes I thought I saw the right foot of the great image extending itself and touching my left shoulder. I was thrilled beyond measure. The archana was over and we were asked to move forward to view the aarti. We came out of the temple with "Govinda, Govinda" on our lips and our hearts full with His Grace.

Outside the temple we purchased some articles and I, who could not carry even an ordinary bottle in my left hand before, was able to carry a heavy bag of articles. In trying to shift the bag to the right hand. I unconsciously lifted up the left hand. Lo! It went up straight at 80° pointing to the sky above the shoulder. And there was no pain. I could not contain myself. I cried aloud: "Lord Venkatesa, no wonder You are called

in line with statistical and factual evidence so that natural ways and means are discovered to overcome it. The faculties of Arts, Science, Medicine and Engineering are found in Colombo and Kandy. If they are inadequate the natural solution is to open up institutions in Jaffna also to meet the additional numbers which have hitherto been rejected for want of accommodation. The hypothetical but close to-facts statistical table appended to this Note will show that

Jaffna has enough numbers to fill institutions of the nature proposed. The Ministry of Education can therefore release a few institutions or Colleges to the University for conversion to such a purpose, and a beginning can be made with the 1966-67 sessions itself. Four or five of the suitable institutions can be offered to the University for a start. Other considerations should not warp the solution. Jaffna needs those faculties can afford them, and can make a success of them as years grow from now.

(i) The classes to follow the Singapore Tamil Primary School Syllabus.

(ii) Qualified Tamil teachers to be engaged and paid adequately.

(iii) To have one hour for Tamil Language.

(iv) The existing classes to be divided into groups to benefit by group teaching methods.

'Saiva Samaya Padam'

(i) Saiva Samaya Padam series of books to be used.

(ii) Class to be of an hour's duration.

(iii) Half an hour of Thevaram and half an hour of Saiva Samayam to be taught.

The Committee is also seriously considering:-

(i) the centralisation of these classes that are being now conducted in the Temple and the Kalaimagal School.

(ii) appointing a panel of supervisors to advise and assist these teachers and ensure that there is proper teaching.

Malayan Roving Educational Ambassador

Mr Kandiah Arianayagam's appointment as permanent delegate to Unesco (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation) has been announced by the Minister for Education, Inche Mohamed Khir Johari.

This new post carries with it the rank of minister plenipotentiary.

Mr. Arianayagam, who has been Deputy Chief Education Adviser for the past five years, was the first Malaysian to take over these posts from retiring expatriate officers;

Controller of Examinations (1957)

Chief Education Officer Perak (1959)

Director, Teacher Training (1960)

Son of a former accountant in the Treasury here, Mr. Arianayagam had his early education at the Anglo-Chinese School in Klang and the Victoria Institution here.

Due to the lack of facilities for science teaching here, he left for Ceylon in 1931 and joined St. Thomas' College, later obtaining a Bachelor of Science (hons) degree from the London University.

Returning home in 1940, he began teaching at the Clifford School in Kuala Lipis and during the Japanese occupation lectured at the Technical School here.

He joined the Klang High School as Assistant Master in 1947 and ended up being its headmaster in 1951 — a post he held for three years.

Top Jobs

Then came the series of top jobs in the Ministry — first Controller of Examinations, then Chief Education Adviser, Perak, and finally Deputy Chief Education Officer.

Announcing his appointment the other day, Inche Khir Johari said: "There is no need for me to elaborate on his experience and his great knowledge especially in matters relating to education because he is already well known."
