## DEMOCRACY MUST AND SHALL PREVAIL IN ASIA

### M. P. For Udupiddy At Harvard University

Speaking on 'Prospects for Democracy in Asia' at the Public Forum held in August 3 at the Harvard University in Boston, America, Mr. M. Sivasithamparam M. P. for Udupiddy explained at length what the people of Asia meant by 'democracy'.

It has become quite a fashion for some gentlemen particularly newspapermen of the West to jet-propel themselves from one Asiatic capital to another in a matter of days and then sit down to tell us and the world that due to a multiplicity of reasons, ranging from the sublime to the ridiculous, that Asiatics cannot run their own affairs

In this type of assessment of Asiatic affairs I hear the lingering echoes of the pronouncements of the past—the story of the white Man's Burden. We of Asia rejected this in the 1940's and we reject it now.

For me and a host of Asiatics, a fight for independence was not for a change of masters from white to brown but from foreign to indigenous! That is why I assert and re-assert that democracy must and shall prevail in Asia. I gather strength for my assertion from examples of Japan, India, and my own little island—Ceylon.

#### India

India a country with over 540 million people living in a 1½ million square miles, with a population density six times that of America, with a long history of Imperial mis-rule, with people speaking fourteen major languages, with problem following partition that no country has had to face, with people of different levels of economic and educational standards, has had four national

True, country after country in Asia that chose a parliamentary system gave it up for some form of oligarchial autocracy. But it is important and significant that everyone of these leaders had to protest their faith in a constitution of democracy and to promise to get back to some form of representative government sooner or later.

In a short span, we saw Pakistan holding Elections. In Indonesia a President for life was made to realise that life can also mean a very short period and it is an indication for future that students were in the vanguard of this movement.

#### FOCUS

World focus has shifted to Asia. Asia has come to be regarded more and more as the cross-roads for contending forces, the cockpit of conflicting ideas. We, in Asia, fondly hope that she will be a crucible for fu-

### Singapore's High Commissioner In London

#### Mr. A. P. Rajah Assumes Duties

Mr. A. P. Rajah, former Speaker of the Singapore Parliament has been appointed Singapore's first High Commissioner in London. On the eve of his departure to London Mr. Rajah stated his views at a Press Conference in Singapore thus:

"I am delighted to go to London as Singapore's first High Commissioner."

"I consider it a great honour to represent Singapore. I hope I will measure up to the trust the Government has placed in me."

"I feel somehow that this job is not going to be too difficult because Great Britain understands us and we understand Great Britain. I don't think there are great areas of differences between us. Any problems or difficulties we have I feel we can solve them to our mutual advantage."

"I have to carry out my prime task of interpreting Singapore to London and vice versa."

### World Peace Day Celebrated

"It is with the greatest pleasure that I come here to give my genuine cooperation to Dr. W.S Fernando Principal of Universal Colleges, who has been working for a good number of years for the cause of Peace. His work is very simple & unostentatious. Although the people of his country have not sufficiently understood the value of his services, the educated people in foreign countries not only have appreciated but also have admired his services, which he has rendered single-handed for so many years," said Rev. Pundit Madupitiya Medhananda Thero, Principal of Sri Sangatha Vijayalaya, Panadura, who presided at the public meeting held on August 6th at the Universal College, Panadura, to observe the World Peace Day for the fifteenth time.

Rev. Medhananda Thero making a long speech described vividly what unutterable devastations were caused by the dropping of Atom Bombs by the then Americans on Hiroshima and Nagasaki, which brought the Second World War to a close.

Dr. W. S. Fernando, the organiser of the meeting traced the history of the observance of the World Peace Day from 1948 when it was observed for the first time at Hiroshima by about 30000 Japanese. He had observed this day at the request of Dr. Alfred W. Parker, Secretary of the World Peace Day Committee, Berkeley, California, since 1952. He pointed out that the main factors that determined the Peace of the world were food, shelter, clothing, education and employment. Coming to educational problem in Ceylon with his knowledge and experience gained by running his Model English School without having any connection with the Education Department for 52 years, he said that the parents for over two thousand years had full freedom to select the teacher to whom they should

send their children for their education and the teachers had full freedom to impart education to the children who came to them. But he said "there is no freedom and the parents are compelled to send their children to a recognised school." He deplored the very low standard of the knowledge of English and he said unless the children be given a sound knowledge of English they would be deprived of the advantage of acquiring an advanced knowledge of Science and as a nation Ceylonese could not be able to keep abreast with the other progressive nations of the world. He emphasised the importance of making English, a world language, a compulsory subject. And he added that unless people be given freedom to run Independent Schools untrammelled by the rigidity of Departmental control, it would be impossible for the Government to impart education to all the children of a rapidly increasing population.

Rev. Thripitakacharya Galagama Jinasena Thero said that it was surprising to see all the historians and poets had extolled the warriors who had taken

NOT IN THE NORTH ONLY

The challenge to the Communist chief Mr. Pieter Keuneman to visit Matugama along with the Premier was thrown in the floor of the House of Representatives when the former in a fit of frustrated mood gave vent to his inner feelings and said that Mr. Dudley Senanayake could get a reception only in Jaffna. But Mr. Keuneman knowing well the hollowness of his empty declaration cleverly kept himself sufficiently away from Matugama where a mammoth gathering greeted the Premier despite the fact that the electorate was being held by the S. L. F. P. But the Opposition M. P. for Matugama was not only present at the grand reception to see for himself the large measure of welcome but also offered his hand of cooperation to the National Government as he believed in the sincerity of purpose of Premier Senanayake.

The Leftists have always exhibited their capacity to make capital of events that are capable of being misinterpreted to confuse the mind of the common man. The visit of the Premier to Kalmunai was a great success. Greater still was the reception that was accorded to him in Jaffna. And the Communist Leader could only read between these two big functions the suggestion that the Premier has turned to Tamilakam for his political support indicative of the implication that the South was not so minded. Matugama a city that is being represented by the S. L. F. P. gave the lie direct to the Marxist Parliamentarian. Hindu Educational Society, Kandy

The parents and well-wishers of Tamil-speaking children of Kandy met under auspices of the above Society on 8th August, 1966 at 5 p.m. in the Saiva Maha Sabai Hall.

Mr. S. Vythilingam, the President of the above Society presided and a representative gathering was present.

The main theme was the disabilities of the education of Tamil speaking children outside the Northern and Eastern Provinces and particularly of the Central and Sabragamuva Provinces.

Three representatives of the above Society, Messrs P. Subramaniam, Matlaparanam and K. V. Mylvaganam were present at the inaugural meeting of the Tamils' Educational Welfare Society which was held on Saturday 30th July, 1966 at 5 p.m. at the Sarawathie Hall, Welawatte. The Kandy representatives presented their memorandum which embodied the following:-

(1) The Education Department should take immediate steps to transfer teachers from Jaffna to meet the demand of all the under staffed Tamil Schools in the seven provinces.

(4) All Government Schools in the Island

Appropriation Bill approved in Second Reading

The Premier Mr Dudley Senanayake, once again rose to great heights when in a very well argued speech he demolished the Opposition's criticism. The voting on the Second Reading was 90 Ayes against 52 noes.

The Opposition speakers Messrs R. G. Senanayake, F. D. Bandaranaike Peiter Keuneman, Dr. N. M. Perera, Mrs. Srimavo Bandaranaike and Mr. Maitripala Senanayake all had to seek material far away from those relating to the Budget for their attack on the Government. This as the Premier pointed out betrayed the weakness of the criticisms.

must maintain all three streams—Sinhalese, Tamil and English to help the children of all communities in the areas.

(3) We request the Government to restore the Tamil streams at Kingswood College and St. Scholastica's Girls' School, Kandy from 1967. We also request the Minister of Education to restore the intake of all Tamil speaking children in the Schools in Kandy and the other Schools in the Central and Sabragamuva provinces as was done prior to 1954. Further, if the Government is willing to do so we request that permission be granted to the above Society to establish two A grade Schools for Tamil speaking boys and girls in Kandy.

Those points were lucidly explained to the meeting by Mr. K. V. Mylvaganam who cited many instances of disabilities experienced by Tamil speaking children in Kandy in particular.

The General body of the Society approved the memorandums submitted by the committee. A sub-committee of fifteen members with power to co-opt others to study the problems in detail and to submit a report of their findings to the General Body before forwarding it to the Tamils' Educational Welfare Society.

(Continued from page 1) put of foodstuffs has risen by 55 per cent but her population had also risen by 33 per cent.

That brings me to what we, in Asia, mean by Democracy, Abraham Lincoln's definition of Government of the people, for the people by the people may be a useful guideline but over years this definition has taken form of a pyramid with broad base of the people but narrowing down as it goes up to by the people and for the people.

We under colonial rule have lost an average of 200 years in search of time in political economic and social advancement. If we have to make up the leeway, there must be an essential rush of peace, a skipping of intermediate steps.

To us, therefore, Democracy has a different concept. The task of Democracy is to devise institutions that safeguard liberties of the individual and ensure his participation directly or through his representatives in decision-making processes like free elections, legal recognition of parties, free press, independent judiciary, an executive being answerable to and dismissible by people's representatives and the task of Democracy should also be to become a dynamic agent in a process of economic growth and social change.

Thus our concept of Democracy may differ from yours but as that American Lady, Mrs. Roosevelt, said after a visit to India "The democracy that India is building will never be exactly like ours. There is no reason why it should be for her history and needs are completely different from those that dictate our forms of democracy."

Economic growth is only a means to an end.

Has India, after all is said and done, done so badly?

Since 1951 India's out-

In my country the Manager of our national Bank has formulated a scheme to set up a Development Savings Banks which shall combine features of social security, savings and investment schemes embracing particularly the workers in Government and private sector.

Inaugurating the independence of India, Pandit Nehru said "We have a trust with destiny". If I may now switch on to words of someone nearer your hearts -- words of Kennedy: "Let a message go out that a torch has been passed to a new, younger generation who are determined to keep that date with destiny"

part in wars as national heroes. In wars the victors as well as the vanquished were losers. The victors created new enemies and the vanquished lost their lives and property and were subject to humiliation and unutterable grief. Main cause of war was man's weakness to control his desire for sensual pleasure.

Rev. Fr. J. Jayasuriya O. M. I. said that two thirds of the population of the world were underfed and suggested that all should fight against hunger. He said that a strong public opinion should be created to fight against poverty and to prevent rich people from bringing poor children of eight or nine years from remote places to use as servants most of whom became subject to merciless torture.

Mr. S. de S. Samarasinghe of Maharagama, a great humanitarian, who has been a member of the London Vegetarian Society for over fifty years gave a vivid description of the humanitarian work done in countries like England and America. He pointed out that the food problem could be solved to a great extent by vegetarianism. He gave figures of vegetarian societies existing in Great Britain and deplored the slow growth of vegetarianism in Ceylon, proudly called Dharmadweepa. He described in detail the various diseases caused by taking flesh food and suggested that there should be vegetarian hotels in Ceylon as in other countries.

Mr. E. V. Fernando said that if people wanted Peace in the world they must follow religious teachings and show compassion to all beings and learn not to try to appease hatred by hatred.
