CELIBACY & GENIUS

It has been often said that man's best friend, companion, adviser and nurse was a loving wife. Yet many men—learned and cultured—have elected to remain single. It has been a controversial matter, since the dawn of history whether married life or a state of celibacy was more conducive to human happiness and success in life. Some have condemned marriages, while others have extolled it to the skies.

"A married man is no more than half a man" said Romain Rolland Schopenhauer quite frankly remarked, "For men of higher intellectual avocation, for poets, philosophers, and in general for all those who devote themselves to service and art, celibacy is preferable to married life, because the conjugal yoke prevents them from creative work." He called woman "long of hair and short of sense" and advised a friend to abstain from marrying.

Lord Bacon, a married man had stated:—

"He that hath wife and children hath given hostages to Fortune; for, they were impediments to great enterprises either Venture or Mischief" and has further added "Certainly the best works and of greatest merit for the publick have proceeded from the Unmarried or Childless men; which, both in Affection and Means, have married and endred the publick."

Many men of genius, by reason of their passion for knowledge and art absorbing everything else, have remained single.

Newton never knew love

and avoided the company of women. He once wooed a lady, and in forgetfulness, tried to use the fore finger of that lady as a tobacco-stopper of his pipe. This ended their courtship and this proved a blessing in disguise to the world of science, for, celibacy offered him time and scope to give expression to his Versatile genius, that benefitted mankind.

Neither Pitt nor Fox—famous political rivals—got married. Pitt, however, is said to have broken his heart through his unreciprocated love to Lady Eleanor Eden, a lady of exquisite beauty.

Henry Cavendish, the famous chemist hated even the sight of women and communicated with his house-keeper through notes left on the lift. His biographer has observed that

"He did not love; he did not hate; he did not hope; he did not fear. He was almost passionless for he was a scientific anchorite"

Lord Balfour was another who died a bachelor. When Sir Austin Chamberlain proposed a tax on bachelors and hinted to Balfour,

"Oh! by the way, you would have to pay £ 40/- a year" "Yes" replied Balfour "but I know it was worth it."

Voltaire, a fickle lover, became enamoured of Mademoiselle de Noyer, Madame de Villers, Madame de Chatelet — but he never got married.

Among the other distinguished people who had remained single were Galileo, Descartes, Locke, Spinoza, Kant, Macaulay, Gibbon and Hume. Though

Macaulay was the most sought after bachelor, he denied himself the comforts of married life,

Poets

Cosgrave, Gray, Swift, Pope and Goldsmith—poets of great renown have remained single. Among the artists of repute who did not taste connubial bliss, were Leonard da Vinci, Raphael and Michelangelo. This Michelangelo had confessed that

"Painting is a jealous mistress that suffered no rival. I have expoused my art and it occasions me sufficient domestic cares; my works shall be my children."

Reynolds seemed to agree with the views of Michelangelo, for he remained a bachelor. When the news of a co-artist, Flaxman's marriage was announced, he wrote "I tell you Flaxman you are ruined for an artist."

Beethoven, Handel, Mendelssohn Meyerbeer, remained wedded to music. Beethoven however, hanged all his life for feminine love, which he failed to find. He was once smitten by the charms of Mademoiselle. Howrath, but she jilted him to an Australian officer. Again and again he opened his heart to the same tender influence that failed to achieve its objective. So he abjured all other loves, but music.

Handel had an aversion to marriage. In 1707, he went over to Lubek to compete for the place of successor to a famous organist, but he found a funny condition imposed for obtaining the place—the compulsory privilege of marrying the daughter of his predecessor. He got terribly alarmed and fled from the place.

It must be accepted that the question of fecundity of celibates had been viewed in an unkind light. The fact, however, remained that celibates had produced—and produced in abundance—the world's greatest Treasures.

Committee For National Integration

It is heartening that the situation relating to national unity is undergoing considerable improvement. The matter, however requires, close, continuous and systematic attention. Without such attention, progress cannot be made. In fact whatever progress has been recently achieved might even unfortunately get lost for want of attention. The matter of national unity was emphasised by the Soulbury Commissioners in their report which has ultimately resulted in the present constitution for Ceylon. Leaders like the late Mr. D. S. Senanayake and Mr. S. W. R. D. Bandaranaike had emphasised the need for harmony among the various sections of people and for national unity and pledged themselves to this noble ideal.

It may also be of great interest and value at this moment to refer to an extract from the draft of a message which one of Ceylon's great leaders respected by all communities and who could be acclaimed as one of the builders of modern Ceylon, the late Mr. Hector Jayawardene (uncle of the present Minister of State Mr. J. R. Jayawardene), left to the nation, before his death:—

"Let us rid our minds of cant and humbug. Let us be sincere in all our actions and our speech. We are now fully alive to the evil of sacrificing the national to the sectional interests. We must advance together if we are to advance at all. We must all make common cause in all public questions. We can make no progress as a nation unless and until all the communities approached all Ceylon problems from the point of view of a Ceylonese nationalist, one who had the sole good of the country at

heart and one who did not exclude any one from the category of Ceylonese because of the accidents of race, caste or creed."

It is eminently desirable that a Standing Committee for National Integration is appointed by the Government to promote internal harmony and unity and to make recommendation to Government and Parliament from time to time.

Such a step would also give effect to the sentiments of our past leaders and the people of the country.

In one of his latest addresses the President of the Indian Republic, Dr. Radharishnan made this fervent appeal:

"We must love our country and make our country lovable"

This appeal is applicable to Ceylon.

SERIOUS TURN IN TEXTILE SITUATION

Moving into mighty action the Minister of Trade and Commerce brought to bay the black-marketing miscreants in the trade of textiles and revealed the startling fact that the ordinary man had been paying for his clothes several fold and that the middle-man merchant had been reaping a rich harvest of easy income. For a time it seemed as if the consumer had been saved from the clutches of the unconscionable textile trader and that clothing could be obtained at reasonable prices. But true to the traditional effect of regulations of control of prices of all commodities, the result held no lasting threat to the unscrupulous trader and the old order—

in precise terms—the normal order of black market has again come into vogue exposing the common man to misery. If the National Government cannot remedy the serious situation that has recently developed in the textile market it must acknowledge its incompetence and face the consequences. It is inexplicable how traders can flout with impunity the regulations that govern their activities and how articles can be sold much above the controlled price. The numerous notifications relating to the control of prices of textiles must be codified and conflicting orders should be cancelled. After several months of experimenting in devising measures to maintain a standard normal price it should now be feasible for the Minister to issue final orders in simple unambiguous terms so that there cannot be any doubt about the exact price of

each variety of textile. The list of prices must be ordered to be exhibited in not only textile shops but also public places so that the common man can know what the prices are just as he is sure of the cost of a coupon worth of rice. Now that the big annual festival Deepavali is approaching it is the duty of the Minister to ensure for the public availability of clothes and the assurance of the enforcement of controlled prices

ASSASSINATION OF APARTHEID LEADER

The assassin, whatever his motives may be and whoever may be his victim, cannot be pardoned. He has no right to appropriate to himself the authority of the Almighty God in dealing with beings for their actions. Apartheid as a doctrine, like any other similar slogan, carried with it the potential of sudden danger for the author or adherent. And if Dr Hendrik Verwoerd was done away with by a daring assassin it could not be surprising. In open Parliament just as the aged South African Premier was adjusting himself to deliver a speech the felonious attack was made. If the foul act was intended to scare the followers of apartheid it had not achieved its object as the successor to the departed South African Leader had already declared that there would not be any change of policy. The means must be good even if the ends be of paramount importance.

PROVINCIAL SWEEPS

The National Lottery has become almost a permanent institution. The weekly and fortnightly sweeps have become overwhelmingly popular and the common man has become used to buying a sweep ticket with the same feeling of need as when he buys the newspaper. The idea behind the National Lottery is to provide better and more extensive facilities of medical aid and if possible to assist other charitable purposes. Now that the idea of collective effort in charity-mindedness has caught the imagination of the people we would suggest that provincial sweeps may be organised in the nine provinces with a view to finding the money for establishing, maintaining and sustaining institutions like hospitals welfare centres. The co-operative spirit in charity will be more productive of benefits if the National Lotteries Board would extend its scope by organising Provincial Sweeps
