That only twenty per centum of the candidates manage to obtain the minimum marks required to entitle them to a mere pass in English at this Examination is not a revelation nor a discovery. The standard of knowledge of English that is at present obtaining in all Government Departments and Commercial establishments horribly low that it is feared that the fate of English in this country would be definitely dismal in the future. Time was when students were able to acquire proficiency in English under the guidance of teachers who had reached a very high stan dard of efficiency in teaching that subject. The deterioration in standard started with the neglect of the teaching of composition and grammar in the

Ranade rendered a sig nal service to Indian phi losophic thought by interpreting the Indian tradition to the Western mind. through his commentaries on the great primary trea tises of Hinduism.
