## Vegetarianism Among Hindus

It is very unfortunate that Hinduism as understood and practised by the vast majority of Hindus today is not what Hinduism is, or should be.

Hinduism is unique in that it has incorporated in it, in addition to the good virtues of other religions, the greatest and supreme of all virtues, namely the observance of the principles of vegetarianism.

According to the Hindu religion the killing of innocent animals for food, or even the consumption of any meat (which automatically involves the cruel slaughter of animals) is *Morally wrong*, and therefore a *Definite Sin*. Serving meat to any other person, by a Hindu is also considered a sin, according to Hinduism.

But, unfortunately, we see today that more than ninety percent of Hindus not adhering to the principle of observing Vegetarianism, which, to repeat again is a cardinal virtue according to Hinduism. Why is this so? Various people give different opinions and reasons. It is worthwhile, if not interesting to consider some of the popular views expressed by Hindus who apparently tend to justify their action for not observing Vegetarianism.

Many Hindus have a wrong notion that it is only 'Saivism' that prohibits the eating of meat, and that Hinduism forbids the eating of only Cow's flesh (beef). But this concept is due to ignorance on the part of these people about their own religion; for 'Saivism' is only one great sub-division of Hinduism and it is Hinduism that taboos completely eating meat of any kind. The Hindus who apply the holy ash on their foreheads and pray to *Sivaperuman* as the 'Father God' are all 'Saivites' or belong to 'Saivism'. Thus the great majority of the

Hindus (except for a small fraction who are Vaishnavites) are really 'Saivites'.

It has become a traditional belief and custom among most Hindus, to feel that their religion forbids them to eat meat only on Fridays (according to still others on Tuesdays and Fridays) and on important religious days, occasions or festivals. This is the commonest form of Hindu religious practice that is met with today. To these people eating meat at all other times is perfectly in order. This form of wrong religious education has been perpetuated from one generation to another (by the Hindus) primarily due to ignorance among these people about the cardinal principles of their religion and also in some instances to wilful reluctance on the part of such people to accept what is religiously right, because it involves the sacrifice of a bad and wrong habit (meat eating habit which they have cultivated).

What is most objectionable, if not shameful, is for some of these people to argue and justify their wrong deeds. It is these people again who have framed their own rules to suit their convenience, in their advocacy that it is beef alone that is forbidden to the Hindu.

It is clearly expressed in many works of Hinduism that it is not beef-eating, but MEAT eating of any kind that is a CARDINAL NO to all Hindus.

The great Tamil Saint and poet 'Thiruvalluvar' in his classical 'Thirukural' has beautifully enlightened us on the virtues of non-killing of animals (கொல்லாமை) and vegetarianism (புறல் மறுத்தல்) and on the evils of animal slaughter and consumption of animal flesh. It is surprising to see that even some of those who have writ-

ten articles on Kural have not yet given up eating flesh.

Apart from the religious and the humanitarian point of view for which alone Vegetarianism is strongly advocated, there are several other good reasons, as to why it is desirable to adopt a vegetarian diet.

Firstly, it is generally agreed (even by many meat eaters) that the vegetarian diet is clean and wholesome.

Secondly, contrary to popular belief, a well chosen vegetarian diet adequately supplemented with milk, stands equal in nutritive value, to any so called 'Rich meat diet'. Even medical opinion today is of the view that certain vegetables and cereals have the protein equivalent of meat both in quality and quantity and that it is possible with a purely vegetarian diet, adequately supplemented with milk, for a person to be as strong and healthy as inveterate meat eaters. People who still maintain that meat is necessary for health and strength, are here again ignorant, as they are about their religion (Hinduism). It may be relevant to quote here what has been said by an eminent medical man in Ceylon (who has done a lot of work in the field of nutrition). He says "A careful examination of the nutritive values of meat, fish and eggs reveals that while these foods are nourishing, there is NOTHING in them, as regards either QUALITY or QUANTITY, that cannot be supplied from lacto Vegetarian Sources".

Above all meat eating should be strongly condemned and despised by all people who claim to have a conscience which 'feels' for another living being as for another human being (i.e. ஜீவ காருண்னியம்). All animals (which people so cruelly slaughter for their diet or rather to satisfy their "tongues") too have according to Hinduism, the soul in

## Poor Standard of English

We publish below a message sent to us by Mr. W. S. Fernando, Principal Universal College, Panadura on World Peace and the poor standard of English in Ceylon Schools.

"History tells us that our parents for over two thousands years had the freedom to select the school and the teacher, to whom they should send their children for education. But today that freedom is lost. This has led to a deterioration in the standard of education," said Mr. W. S. Fernando, Principal of Universal College, speaking at a public meeting held at Walapola recently, to commemorate the World Peace Day.

Mr. Fernando deplored the very low standard of English among school children, and said that unless these children were given a sound knowledge of English they would be deprived of the knowledge of Science and as a nation, Ceylonese would not be able to keep abreast with other progressive nations of the world.

### First in Japan

Tracing the history of the observance of the World Peace Day, he said that in 1948, it was first observed at Hiroshima by about 30 000 Japanese.

He also said that he had observed this day since 1952, at the request of Dr. Alfred W. Parker, Secretary of the World Peace Day Committee California.

Concluding his speech Mr. Fernando pointed out that the main factors that determined the peace of the world were food, shelter, clothing, education and employment. If these bare necessities were lacking the people were bound to be disgruntled.

The Ven. Thripitika-chariya Galagama Jinasena Thera said that it was surprising to note that the historians and poets had exalted the warriors who had taken part in wars as

National Heroes. At war the victors as well as the vanquished were losers. The victors created new enemies, and the vanquished lost their lives and property.

The main cause for war, he said, was man's weakness to control his desire for sensual pleasures.

### WRATH OF THE WEATHER

All the elements appear to be massed against mankind; the people of this country are now feeling the angry impact. This revolt of nature is in fact a grim reminder to the people that they must be held responsible for their own suffering and misfortune.

The continuous dry weather that was dreadfully sapping the energy and enthusiasm of farmers and workers all alike has now assumed a more menacing attitude in the form of a heavy fall of rain causing devastation in a widespread measure. Floods in the past have been fearful but the incidence was limited to a short space of time. The present lingering threat of a prolonged foul weather is really in the nature of a retributive punishment. Thousands have been rendered homeless, still more have become destitute; dangerous diseases are spreading and the general outlook has become gloomy; yet the feasts and festivities for which this Island has now become famous all continue as if nothing untoward has happened to the normal life of the common man. Along with the list of collections for relief of victims of flood similar appeals are being made for donations to organise receptions, conventions and conferences. This view of life reveals a lack of responsibility.

In effect this adverse act of nature is a warning to mankind that it must alter its conception of living and that all those who have assumed the great responsibility of leading the people must give up their leadership before affairs deteriorated.

With particular reference to the Jaffna Peninsula, one finds that though the distress of deluges had been experienced several times before in the past no useful scheme of protection

from floods has been put into effect. The fear is freely expressed that the Peninsula will become more arid in the near future and water will be a scarcity. Yet neither the Government nor the people have thought of ways and means of conserving rain water for useful purposes. Even at this late hour it will be some relief if waste of energy on frivolous celebrations could be stopped and constructive measures taken to improve the conditions of the common man.
