## THE MYSTERY OF LORD BUDDHA'S VISITS TO CEYLON

Buddha made it clear to Ananda that his very physical body could be transported to the moon or any other sphere. The explanations of the process is as cryptical as the Yoga Sutras of Patanjali. It is well known that Yogis can do it. The Swami of Nagadipa (Nainathivu Swami) had given us one instance. He put this incident in the following modest way. He was sleeping with his Gurn (who was also the Gurn of the late Sir P. Arunachalam) in Mutwal one night. He found himself the next morning in Nagadipa by his Gurn's Grace. This Gurn was so great that when he passed away, Sir P. Arunachalam built a temple over his Samadhi in Waters, Meet, Mutwal, Colombo.

A man who has truly attained nirvana is omniscient i.e. he is conscious of what is taking place in any part of the world. This statement won't be acceptable to the modern man unless it is supported by facts. The following is a true account. A couple of years ago Swami Sudevananda and Satchithananda of the Divine Life Society were talking to Bagawan Satya Sai Baba in a hotel in Kodaikanal in South India, when suddenly Bagawan shouted "Don't shoot" and fell on his bed unconscious. After an hour Bagawan came back to consciousness and a revolver was in his hand. What happened was as follows:—An air pilot in Bhopal (which is some 700 miles from Kodaikanal) was so upset by the promotion of a junior over him that he decided to shoot himself. This pilot and his wife were devotees of Bagawan. The latter left the physical body in his Sukshma Sarira and reaching Bhopal as quickly as thought materialised it (i.e. Sukshma Sarira) and happened at the

door of the pilot's room. After finishing his work he returned to his body in the same way he left. He could make the revolver invisible till he reached his hotel in Kodaikanal. The full story takes much more space and I therefore have given sufficient material in support of my statement made to show that Lord Buddha was aware of what was going on in Ceylon. He must have found that Ceylon was a fit place to sow the seeds of his teaching and hence his visit to Ceylon. The love these great ones have towards us is immeasurable and is not realised by man. Their methods of demonstrating their love is almost unknown. We unfortunately treat them like fellow mortals. We must not forget that they are conscious of their immortality and are all the time working for our uplift with their superhuman powers. May they bless us.

### Sivanadi Padam

The Buddhists worship the foot print on Adam's Peak as that of Lord Buddha and the Hindus as that of Sivaperuman. This mystery is clarified by the following:—Bagawan Sri Satya Sai Baba gave Dharshan six months ago to a devotee called Rao in Shimoga in South India. Baba was in Sukshma Sarira and was visible only to this devotee but not to his relatives. But, the latter could hear Rao's replies. For ten minutes this conversation was going on, during which time Bagawan changed himself into the form of Ramadas (Rao's Gurn) and later into that of Rama (Rao's Ishta Deva; finally Rao received a packet of Holy Ash. The spot where Bagawan stood was kept untrodden and now the sacred foot has manifested there deeply impressed in outline on the hard

## Cultural History and Principles of Hinduism

Sir,

The above is the title of a book written by Dr. C. Sivaratnam of No. 2 Nimal Road, Bambalapitiya and printed and published by Stargard Printers Ltd 196, Sea Street, Colombo 11. I had the rare privilege of receiving this very interesting and fascinating composition from Dr. C. Sivaratnam about two months ago with the request to place it at the disposal of a suitable library at Point Pedro. Dr Sivaratnam does not know me personally but he seems to have read my article in the papers on Sir P. Arunachalam's studies and translations under the heading "Magnum Opus" of Sir P. Arunachalam, which seems to have attracted his attention and interest. Since receiving this book I have been in correspondence with the learned Doctor and have received valuable information on the antiquity and glory of Sigai Nagar near Vallipuram in the Vadamarachy Division of the Northern Province which was the birth place of Parakrama Babu the Great and his illustrious ancestors, according to a copper plate inscription found near the Giants' Tank (Maha Vavi). The learned Doctor has also been good enough to send me a copy of the letter which the late Sir C. P. Ramasamy Aiyar who was at one time the Advocate General of the High Court of Madras and a scholar of international reputation, had written to him paying high encomiums to his masterly treatment of the subject matter of this book. He has also been good enough to send me an extract of the review of the book by one Mr. M. D. J. in the Ceylon Daily News of 20-5-64. After reading the letter referred to above I feel rather reluctant to review the book myself, which I had intended to do, for any attempt on my part

to do so will be like trying to paint the Lily. But however I shall for the better enlightenment of those who may chance to come across this article add my mite of praise and commendation of the book.

I may say without exaggeration and without fear of contradiction or controversy that the book is an invaluable mine of historical and cultural information on subjects pertaining to the language, culture and civilization of the Dravidian Race of which Tamil is the Chief component. It is pre-eminently a book which should find a place in the book shelf of every patriotic Tamil, whether Hindu or Christian. It must be read, re-read and read again and inwardly digested as it contains matters regarding our language, culture, social and religious customs and about our temples, festivals and festivities.

Chapter XII deals especially with Hindu festivals like Thaipongal, Philosophy of Sun Worship, Deepavali and the legends connected with it, Sivaraththiri, Navaraththiri, the New Year Festival, Thirukarthikai or Sakkapanai or Vilakkeedu, Thiruvadirai and the festival of the hymns of Saint Manickavasagar and so on and so forth.

Most of us who are Hindus celebrate these festivals without a proper knowledge or understanding of the origin, the inner core or significance of our customs and festivals. It is very necessary, therefore, that we should know and learn to respect our customs and celebrate our festivals with due piety and reverence, if we are to remain true to our cultural heritage.

Before concluding this article I should not omit to quote what Sir C. P. Ramasamy Aiyar and Mr. M. D. J. have got to say about Dr. Sivaratnam's book. This is what Sir.

### 'B' BYE ELECTIONS BOOST FOR MRS. B?

The alphabet 'B' has played a fairly big part in reinstating prestige for Mrs. Bandaranaike. But a close scrutiny of the results of the three Bye elections reveals the true picture—the maintaining of party position more or less at the General Election level. The three 'B' electorates, Balangoda, Bentara-Elpitiya and Bandarawela have all along been S. L. F. P. strongholds except for a minor diversion in respect of Bentara-Elpitiya in March 1965. Bandarawela, however, provided a very interesting change with the S. L. F. P. being nearly defeated. And there is the question to be answered whether all the Tamil speaking voters were able to cast their votes.

Bye elections have a significance all their own. The ruling party is confronted with a volley of attacks from all quarters who have not had any satisfaction in the form of accommodation of their wishes and requests for personal and sectional favours. The might of the Opposition has the capacity to increase several-fold and multi-wise forces begin to operate all in a bitter bid for humbling the ruling party. And that is what has just happened. But the intelligent voter and the academic politician will both rely on the tales that are told by figures and figures alone. By no standard of judgment can it be said that any change has happened except for the fact that the U. N. P. could not retain the Bentara-Elpitiya seat which fell into the Green Bag only in March 1965 Election. But the Bandarawela seat was nearly occupying the place held by Bentara.

Yet there is the other aspect—the feature of the continued effort of the Coalition Parties to wrest power from the National

Parties. Much mischief has already been done by misinterpreting the position of the Government in the matter of the State policy on Language. The sending of Sinhala teachers to Muslim Schools has been made the main plank of the Madam's election movement. But what has that achieved? There was no landslide victory. In March 1965 at Balangoda 25,999 voted and of them 14498 for the S. L. F. P. and 11274 for the U. N. P.

In October 1966 27876 voted but only 14,771 voted for the S. L. F. P. (27 less) and 12731 voted for the U. N. P. (1457 more than in 1965. At Bandarawela out of 15599—7917 for S. L. F. P. and 6406 for U. N. P., in March 1965 and out of 17306 that is when 1707 more votes polled 719 more voters voted S. L. F. P. while 2082 more voters voted U. N. P. than in March 1965—a very curious situation—showing the ascendancy of the U. N. P. at Bandarawela,

At Bentara—Elpitiya the swing was certainly in favour of the earlier decision—S. L. F. P.

The issue of sending Sinhala Teachers to the North and East could not produce the desired effect—a landslide voting for S. L. F. P. But the danger is still there for the issue to be made more prominent as days go.

The spirit of the modern age also requires such facility be-

ing made available. It goes without saying that people going to temples for purposes of worship should observe certain rules of achara. Compulsion, legal, political or otherwise, could well be avoided. Such compulsion, as Mr. Coomaraswamy has mentioned is likely to do more harm than good.

New temples avowedly open to all Hindus without restriction also ought to be constructed and consecrated in addition to peaceful efforts to have existing temples being made available for worship.

God in his infinite Grace will see to it that restrictions hitherto in vogue will soon cease, if we Hindus set about our duty in a prayerful, humble and truly religious spirit. I trust and pray that our greatly esteemed elder (Mr. Coomaraswamy) will live to see this blessed consummation completed fully, considerable portion having been already achieved with his devoted services.
