The White Paper — A Penetrative Study

"Fools rush in, where angels fear to tread" is a well-known adage. The White Paper, has many attractive features but it has also its traps and pit falls. One must have a very great penetrative insight to probe the mind or minds that fashioned these proposals.

Medium of Instruction

(1) In page 18, Section 40, we have the following:

The medium of instruction of any pupil will be his mother-tongue. But at the option of his parent he may be taught in Sinhala or Tamil.

The writer foresees a time when many Tamil parents would send their children to "Sinhala classes" as the main medium of instruction. The composition of the nation as Tamils would soon disappear if this were to happen. Even the religion of Hinduism will be at stake.

The option of parents to teach children in any language, Sinhalese or Tamil or English as exercised today is removed at the stroke of the pen. Even in such countries as India and Malaysia, English is retained as an important medium of instruction. It would be the ideal thing to have a bilingual education — Tamil and English; Sinhalese and English and a Third language for Tamils can be Sinhalese and for Sinhalese Tamil.

Fisheries

(2) Page 9, Section 22 (iv) The following seven courses will be provided in Jeyestha Vidyalayas Next to Agriculture, Fisheries has been indicated. We suggest that weaving also be indicated. A protest was raised by Prof. Jayasuriya of the Ceylon University re-fishing. Fishing is an occupation that involves killing of living being

(i. e. fish) that is against one of the cardinal principles of Hinduism and Buddhism viz. non-killing.

3. Establishment of Private Schools

Page 13, Section 53 says: "No person other than a Regional Director of Education shall have the right to establish a school for children of compulsory school age, other than a private School in an estate as provided above or a school for the mentally or physically handicapped children.

It is clear that the state is trying to continue forever the monopoly of establishing schools — thus centralising and concentrating power in its hands. Right for the last nearly 2500 years the king or nobles had the right of establishing schools. The Temple authorities, nobles and scholars established Schools in temple premises. There were philanthropists, such as Sir Ponnambalam Ramathan who established Colleges in Jaffna and men such as Sri la Sri Arumuga Navalar who established the Saivaprakasa Vidyalaya in 1848. A democratic right which we have enjoyed so far, — the right for any religious body or association or individual to establish a School is taken away by Section 53 (Page 13) which enables the Regional Director alone to establish Schools.

Supposing that a Communist Government comes to power under, regulations contemplated, the Regional Director can do away with religious education. As a matter of fact, no mention of religious education is made, for students after Std. 8. Are they to be allowed to grow without any religious education?

nature of the mind must be totally arrested by right thought, right contemplation and right meditation. WORD OF WARNING

As if to prepare the mind of the masses to receive the shock of drastic measures of economy, the report is published that the Cabinet has unanimously agreed to introduce some changes in the issue of rationed rice. Whatever may be the implication, we hasten to utter a word of warning and to caution the Cabinet against any step that will afford the Opposition just another opportunity to carry on not only a whispering campaign but also a direct and open agitation against the National Government. Already there is the vicious allegation that the Premier and his colleagues have granted the Tamil-speaking people all their demands and rights. To make any move that by mischievous misinterpretation is liable to be taken advantage of by the Coalitionists to induce the common man believe that the economic situation has deteriorated beyond redemption will be utter folly and suicidal tendency.

To the National Government we issue a plain challenge. What concrete step has been taken to reduce the colossal expenditure on unnecessary schemes and missions? Commissions and special committees swallow a large amount of the nation's revenue. For work that can be done by Government officials without additional expenditure to mention only one example, the delimitation of wards of local bodies, special committees are readily appointed. On some pretext or other most of the Ministers have made expensive visits to foreign countries. Though sports must receive a mention at national and international levels, over-enthusiasm that entails large expenditure of state funds must not be allowed.

Ministers more than the other legislators of this

country must now realise the need for launching campaigns of austerity and self-sacrifice before they can make bold to compel the common man eat less, pay more for his staple food, forgo the bare necessities of life and in general to live a life of economic starvation and instability. It is openly known that large quantities of rice are daily obtained by persons who are not entitled to coupons. There is criminal waste of articles of food in entertainments at dinner, lunch, tea and convivial gatherings that are regularly arranged by Ministers, Members of Parliament & High Government officials. While the nation is on the brink of economic disaster, every cent that is ill-spent every ounce of rice or other articles of foods that is wasted will be only reflecting the incapacity, nay the irresponsibility, of the Government in carrying out the administration. Every day several thousands of imported goods are declared damaged or decayed owing to some delay in unloading.

Govern correctly and save the country from loss by waste. Practise austerity at the top-level before the citizen can be compelled to give up a portion of his present ration of rice or to pay more for it. This warning, we hope, will fall on receptive ears.

aims which both Sri la Sri Arumuga Navalar and Sir Ponnambalam Ramana than had. Navalar's views are well known to the public; Ramanathan's Last Will, conveys his mind to the people. The dictum of Saiva Schools, in a Saiva atmosphere should be fostered.

The Hindu missions or as a matter of fact any denomination, should continue to have the collective right to establish a School in future too. Private denominational Schools should be allowed to co-exist with Government Schools.

Individuals are allowed to establish private schools in estates. Hindu Associations should bestir themselves and be an anchor of faith of the Estate children regarding religious education. The Government has decided not to interfere in a sphere which deserves interference.

Female Education is no where mentioned.

In the white paper no-

where can we see anything about a special education for the girls. It is presumed that the education for the boys is the same as that for girls. We submit that it should be different and it should suit the special talents of the girls—in spite of the much-vaunted equality of men and women.

5. Publication of Text Books, Library books etc

Page 30 (h) says the Minister of Education will be in charge of the production and approval of text books, library books and apparatus.

The implication of this is very deep, and the results will be devastative. This means concentrating power in the hands of the Minister. *The Minister wants to continue to have the monopoly of all production of books.* This is a bad heritage from the S. L. F. P Government. This will deprive individual freedom, to write and publish any book. It will be an infringement of a democratic right enjoyed by the people so far. It will certainly be a totalitarian measure adopted by communist countries. But our people who have tasted the freedom that exists in a democratic country must oppose this measure tooth and nail.

Regimentation of education a feature contemplated by the Minister should be dropped. The Minister of Education would foresooth, annihilate all free thought by introducing this proposal. Much more dangerous than a bomb is propaganda. There are dozens and dozens of publishers, some of longstanding repute who are on the verge of bankruptcy; and hundreds of writers whose talents are wasted because they cannot use their knowledge to write new books and get them published—owing to the monopoly exercised by the State. Some of the text books that are prescribed for various classes by the Government do not tally with the requirements of the classes; nor are they satisfactory in style or subject matter.

The Minister must encourage Authors and teachers to write text-books and private publishers in the field of Library books and text-books. Thus he should help in allowing Private enterprise to co exist with State enterprise, as it has a' read, done in the sphere of trade recently.
