## A MESSAGE TO THE MATURED

With the year 1966 drawing to an end, many will be passing another mile-stone in their lives. As each year rolls on and vanishes, we keep moving imperceptibly towards old age. Should one worry about it or feel happy?

### Youthhood

I feel I am not too old to recall the thrills of my youthful days,—holiday travels and outings, attending festivals, cinemas and sport meets. They were the happy side of adolescent years. The censures of elders, teacher's home-work, the petty jealousies and rivalries, failures in examinations, broken friendship, lack of pocket money and uncertainty of employment were the other side of the story. With maturity, these grim facts fade away. Many things that were terribly irksome in youth have dwindled to unimportance with the passage of years. Looking critically at many past events, however rosy they may have been, I would not like to exchange my present peaceful state for youth's delirium. The old question "What will people say, if I do this" has ceased to be my principal yard-stick.

### Maturity

At one time, I was not keen on maturity; but now, I think it is the nicest thing that happens to mankind. An adult, who looks backward to youth as his happiest period, has not matured as ordained by his Maker. The Divine plan was that all living creatures should not be static, but keep moving forward. Maturing gracefully with sweetness of spirit, calmness of mind, accepting gleefully the various vicissitudes of life and

## WINTER SOLTICE

SOURI RAYAN

The sun which was rising in due East in September, is now seen to be rising more and more to the South and will reach the South most point in December 22nd. When it will appear to stay there hence it is called the winter solstice. After a study of three days the sun will appear to turn northwards in the midnight of 24th. At that movement the zodiacal sign of Virgo or Kannya will be seen rising in the Eastern horizon. This is the beginning of Uttarayana and is compared to the birth of a son for married couples. As this birth occurs in the sign of Virgo it is called a virgin birth i. e. Kannya mochoortha. These changes are due to the change in direction of the axis of the earth, when its north pole that was turned away from the sun now turns towards the sun gradually till it faces the sun during the summer solstice on 22nd June. Midway between the solstices are the vernal equinox and the autumnal equinox, when day and night are of equal length. When the sun is directly over the equator the longest night is during winter solstice and the longest day is during summer solstice. Thus the two solstices and the two equinoxes are the four cardinal points in the year which is divided by them into the four seasons of winter, spring, summer and autumn, that are well apparent in the temperate climates. Whereas the polar regions have one night of six months and a day of six months and the tropical regions have their wet and dry seasons with their monsoon winds. The seasons (Rithu) are determined by the direct relationship of the sun and the earth or the Sayana method. But in the Nirayana method the relative position of the earth and sun to the stars or Nakshetras is

When the moon is in relationship with a particular Nakshetra then a particular Mahadesa operates which is modified by the position of the planets of the maha desha of the nakshetra. Hence the importance of the Nakshetras and the Nirayada system.

He died as he had lived, cheerfully with heroic dignity, great good humour, and affectionate concern for everybody else's problems to the very end.
