Puloly Sivan Temple

The beautiful Division of Vadamardchy in the Jaffna Peninsula is the proud possessor of a number of Saiva Shrines of considerable merit and distinction. Among these an honoured place should be given to two Shivan Temples, one at Puloly, Point Pedro, and the other at Valvettiturai.

The Puloly Sivan Temple was renewed and renovated for the Kumbabhisheka ceremony which lasted for a whole week. As the occasion was considered auspicious and beneficial, almost all the Hindus in the Jaffna District were informed of this ceremony, and many of them visited the Temple and had the Darsana of Lord Saiva and Amman and other deities during the days of the ceremony.

Notices about the construction of the Temple Gopura were issued and some of the devotees contributed liberally towards the Gopura Building Fund. The Gopura frontal base has been built and the canopy is in the course of construction and it will be completed in a few months.

A visit to the Temple according to epistemology is believed to give redemption to one's body, soul and ancestors. A day's stay in the temple will bring mental peace.

Shiva is the God of god's (Mahadeva) and He is ascribed as the Saviour of those who seek liberation from the chain of births in the Kali-yuga.

This temple is one of the oldest temples in Ceylon built in the year 1782 and completed in 1814. It was built by one Mr. Subramaniam Kanapathipillai, a vellala gentleman. He was an emigrant from Karaikal in India. He came to Colombo and being appointed to the post of customs collector Point Pedro Port settled in Puloly with his family. It is one of his distant descendants who now Mana-

ges the affairs of the temple.

There are 3 entrances one in the east (the main entrance) leading directly to the Flag Staff, Balipeeda, Nandi, Maha-mandapam of Garba Graha, another in the south leading to the Amman Flag staff of the Garka Graha. The Western entrance leads to the Veeragathy Pillaiyar in the second court and the holy tank in the north western corner.

In the enclosing space in the first court there are the temples of Paththirakali, Pillaiyar Pancha Lingams, Gopalar, Subramaniam, Maha Luxmy, Veerapathira and Saturn and in the north is the Yaga-Salai. Adjoining this is the Nadarajar Temple facing southward. In the east are the temples for Vyravar and sun god and adjoining it is the Bell-tower.

In the second court in the north there is the Vasantha-mandapam with its long hall, and the vehicles-stand is South of the main entrance in the east. In the south-eastern corner of the first court is the Madappaly (holy kitchen) with its well, and west adjoining it is the store room.

The following account is taken from the History of Hindu Temple in Ceylon.

Puloly Sivan Kovil, Pasupathesvarum and Pavatha Vaxathani Amman

The Sivan Temple was built in the year 1782 and completed in the year 1814. It is situated at Puloly East, Singhapabathavan Kurichy. It was built by Suppramaniam Kanapathipillai of Puloly, Veerapathira-chettiar Ramasamy-chettiar of Puloly East. Built with stone, holy of holies and the adjacent apartments are covered with mortar and

Home for the Aged and Dowry System—Two Major Evils of our Modern Society

Sir.—

Establishment of Homes for the Aged has come into vogue in the Eastern countries also. These institutions are, in my opinion, symbols of the degradation of our ancient social traditions and culture and against our religious genius. To allow our infirm and aged ones to be huddled up and fed and clothed in these State-owned and State-managed institutions is a crying shame and a slur on our Society. The aged ones required not so much as food, clothing and regimented shelter as loving care, compassion and service at the hands of their more fortunate and richer relations. That South-Indian sage and intellectual Sir Chakaravathi Rajagopala Chariyar once wrote that "helping one's clansmen and distant relations is a part of the culture of the Dravidian race. It has not completely disappeared. No one could be punished for not doing this. But he who did not fall in line with that element of culture is looked upon as a brute unworthy of our respect and regard, whatever his rank in Society may be". In spite

of the growing pressure of the Western culture and the terrible pressure of the cost of living the Indian culture of helping one's relations near and distant, has not completely disappeared, doing more service than Governmental Socialism. Robbing, stealing cheating are infringements of the legal code. Not to cheat is not culture in the strict sense, it is just avoiding a crime. But to be helpful, and not to be completely immersed in looking after one's ownself is culture. Helpfulness expands in ever widening circle in proportion to one's capacity to be helpful. Help a few people, those nearest to you if you are not able to do more, if you are able to do it help a wider circle. This is Hindu culture both in the North and South of the Indian Sub continent. Indeed the oldest literature of the South lays great emphasis on this aspect of culture. "Be like a sweet water reservoir or a fruit bearing tree in the heart of the village," says the Great Thiruvalluvar.

It is a matter of great pity and shame that as a result of the impact of western individualism that this part of this Eastern or rather Indian culture is rapidly disappearing in Ceylon too, which is the youngest daughter of Mother India and in the younger daughters like Java, Sumatra, Indonesia, Borneo and the Philippines. Other examples of positive compassionate behaviour falling within the ambit of hospitality, the readiness to receive guests and callers at any time of the day or night are distinguishing marks of Hindu and Islamic cultures. Alms giving is a striking feature in Indian and Semetic cultures. It is part of their general culture and not merely individual generosity. The

TILL YOUR LANDS TO SAVE YOUR COUNTRY

Not even during the worst days of World Wars I and II had the people shown such enthusiasm as they are now showing in their effort to thwart the threat of insufficiency of food. The wars were fought for rescuing humanity from demoralisation; now the fighting is for finding food for humanity. In both instances the affected area is world-wide and therefore universal in character.

Here in Lanka the people have learnt to their bitter experience that everyone must not only earn his bread but also produce the articles that make his meal. In this context the administrative authorities realising the gravity of the situation have begun to make the maximum effort to bring the entire country under full production. The provincial heads of administration are making strenuous endeavours to make the people respond to the nation's call for production. The Government Agent, Jaffna, with the able assistance of his Revenue Officers, is preparing the Province for a supreme effort in the matter of producing articles of food. The proposal to bring the large acreages of lands in the K. linochchi, Paranthan Karachchi, Poonerya left under cultivation with the help of the unemployed youth deserves to be supported by the public at all levels. We go further and suggest that Exhibitions, Art Festivals and other similar organisations must

give way to the marshalling of all available manpower to get every inch of cultivable land tilled. Grama Sevahas must take upon themselves the patriotic responsibility of forming volunteer committees for home gardening in which those who cannot join the army that is being enlisted to conquer the lands that lie idle and make them yield their hidden wealth of productivity can render useful service.

The students in the G. C. E. classes both ordinary and advanced must be prevailed upon to devote one hour of their school-time to tilling the lands that belong to the school. Surrendering of rice coupons is in itself a praiseworthy action but the effort to produce articles of food for oneself will be still more laudable.

stone and the other parts with tiles.

This temple is worth Rs. 35000/- in immovable property and as much in movables.

Principal festivals 20 days, and minor festivals 7 days. Swamy's festivals for 16 days in Tamil June, and Amman's for 10 days in Tamil July. Of the minor festivals one is called Manampu in Tamil September and the other six days in Tamil October called Scandasaddy.

Pilgrims flock to this temple from all parts of Vadamaradehy and Thenmaradehy. Swami and Amman are carried on vehicles twice a day. During the nights procession goes by the outer streets of which the Northern and Western are public roads. On the last day but one (during the Swamy's and Amman's festival) the God and Goddess are perambulated in cars. On the Manampu day Swamy and Amman are carried on vehicles from the temple to the Amman Temple at Manthikai (Puloly West). During the first five Scandasaddy days the Swamy or Amman are carried on vehicles around the inner courtyard but on the sixth day by the outer street. (During the first five days not the Swamy and Amman but God Subramaniam and His two consorts are carried; in December the Thirupalli elachchi is conducted for 0 days and on the last day the God Nadarajah and Amman are carried around the outer street in the early morning. Pilgrims assemble on this day.)

It is the bounden duty of the Jaffna Saivites in general and that of the Vadamaradehy Saivites in particular, to have this Gopura completed and it is fervently hoped and expected that all Saivites will come forward and contribute liberally with a well meant mind and thus earn the blessings of the Almighty God Shiva.

utter loyalty of the wife to the husband, the utter obedience of the sons to parents are also essential elements in Hindu culture. Until and unless these twins evils of hunting for dowry and of not looking after the infirm and aged ones without entrusting them to the tender mercies of the soulless and cheerless governmental institutions euphemistically called the 'Homes' for the Aged are totally rooted out there will be no hope for the future, and we shall forfeit all claims to be called a cultured and civilized Nation.

Buddhist and Hindu Ideals

Sir—The Presidential address by the President All Ceylon Buddhist Congress, reported in the Press, is most appropriate and welcome not only to the Buddhists but also to the Hindus of this country.

While paying tribute to his address, I wish to make special reference to his plea for Ahimsa or 'Reverence' for life. The President in his address observed that killing in whatever form was not Buddhistic, contrary to the teaching of Buddha, and that it was a matter of great regret that some Buddhists

reared animals for slaughter etc.

It is well known that Hinduism and Buddhism agree on two specific fundamentals, namely, 'Ahimsa' and 'Karma'. In the tenets of Hinduism reverence for life (compassion for all living beings) and abstinence from meat (vegetarianism) are considered the most supreme of all virtues. All Buddhists however are not agreed that abstinence from meat is a tenet of Buddhism as is 'Ahimsa' or non killing. In this connection it may be said that Hinduism is the only religion which specifically forbids meat eating, considering it as an equal to that of killing.

In Ceylon numerically Buddhists predominate with Hinduism probably ranking as the second predominant religion. It should therefore be exemplary to the rest of the world on 'Ahimsa' or 'Reverence for life'. But it is sad to record that what prevails is really the contrary, with large scale slaughter of innocent animals daily for human consumption.

It would be very gratifying if the All-Ceylon Buddhist Congress would join hands with the All-Ceylon Hindu Congress and work in unison in the plea for the observance and practice of 'Ahimsa' by the Buddhists and Hindus of this country.
