Legislation to Ban Cow-Slaughter

At a religious meeting attended by a large number of Hindus held in the Navalar Hall under the auspices of the Jaffna Saiva Paripalana Sabha presided over by Sri Sri Swaminatha Thambiran head of the Nallur Thirugnana Sambanthar Atheenam the following resolution on the banning of cow-slaughter was passed unanimously.

The president in his remarks said "The cow is a sacred to the Hindus as it is said that she is the abode of Hindu deities and as she supplies five necessary things known as Pancha Kavyam, very necessary for the performance of Poojahs to Lord Shiva. She supplies cow dung necessary for the preparation of the Holy Ash. Thiru Neeru milk and its by products which are nutritious food items are supplied by her. The worship of the cow is also one of the important forms of religious practice of the Hindus. Sri Sanagara Chiriyi Swami kal of Kama Kodi Peedam performs pooja to the cow every day before he starts his daily work. Even from an economical point of view protection of the cow would increase the national wealth of the country. When one considers these facts one cannot fail to impress upon the government the necessity to ban cow slaughter by means of legislation."

Mudaliyar C. Muttuthamby one of the Vice-president of the Jaffna Saiva Paripalana Sabha, said that it was very heart-rending to find that cow-slaughter was increasing rapidly in our land, the birth place of Gnanaprakasa Munivar and Sri Sri Arumuga Navalar the former who fled from this land to escape being forced by the Portuguese rulers to supply cows

for their daily food. Both of them published treatises on the protection of the cow. It is a great pity that the descendants of these two great Saiva Saints have begun to forget their teachings.

It is a matter of great pleasure to find that there is a powerful campaign being conducted in the South of Ceylon by a learned and devout gentlemen. Dr. W. S. Fernando, Principal Universal College Panadura to promote ahimsa for which he is endeavouring to create public opinion in the land in favour of his campaign. He has formed an Ahimsa Army consisting of 500 active members to support his campaign at the first instance. His association had also passed a resolution requesting the government to ban cow slaughter by means of legislation.

On behalf of the large number of Hindus assembled here I move the following resolution.

"The Jaffna Municipal Council had resolved to ban cow-slaughter within the limits of the Jaffna Town in 1947 and it is being implemented.

We would therefore request the Government of Ceylon to ban cow-slaughter like-wise by enacting a legislation.

Mr. R. C. Manmatharayan, Ex. M. M. C. and a member of the Board of Management of the Jaffna Saiva Paripalana Sabha agreed with the views expressed by the president and Mudaliyar C. Muttuthamby and seconded the resolution which was passed unanimously.

RESPONSIBILITY OF RELIGIOUS SOCIETIES

To meet the open challenge of scheming swindlers who deprive the people of their legitimate rations of the necessities of life, legislation alone cannot be sufficient nor even efficient administrative arrangements. These efforts must be strengthened by organised religious preachings as it is a well accepted fact that only faith in the Lord Almighty can save man from disaster.

The Agricultural Corps may increase the production of articles of food but if the middle-man—the black-trader, the unscrupulous administrative, officer and other parasites all continue to conspire as they now impudently do, the fate of the common man cannot be altered. Where religious practice is lagging behind, where Faith in God is forgotten or not accepted, there corruption and all attendant evil practices thrive. The present situation is entirely due to the decadence of proper religious consciousness.

The preaching of precepts of religion and the exposition of tenets alone will not be adequate to create in the ordinary man a sense of religious responsibility, duty to live as a human being. This consciousness can be created only where religious leaders lead exemplary lives and acquire great soul force that can stir the congregations of religious societies to enlightened thought, speech and action. The religious Association must function more in the nature of a welfare society in which members are called upon to help one another.

EPICS AND PURANAS THEIR AGE

Of ancient Indian writers Sri Veda Vyasa was the most prolific by being the author of the Mahabharata and the eighteen puranas. In addition to the compiling of the Vedas he is credited with the composition of the Brahma sutras which is said to be the essence of the Vedas and Upanishads that form the prasthanas stream of Vedanta along with the Bagavad Gita that forms the 18th chapter of the Mahabharata. It is a feat that has no parallel. Vyasa is worshipped as an avatara of Srimat Narayana, the original expounder of Vedanta. Vyasa lived during the time of the Mahabharata war before the beginning of Kali Yuga in 3102 B. C. Undoubtedly he was a rare Vedantin of veneration. His grand work Mahabharata is a master epic giving us the full view of the purushatas. Dharma, Artha, Kama and Moksha to which every human being is entitled. Its content is so vast that they say "what is not in the Mahabharata, is not in the world". It is wisdom in full bloom. The puranas are similarly vast and of them the Skanda with the lakh of slokas is said to equal the Mahabharata in size and content. This deals with the fights between the devas and the asuras, while the epic Mahabharata deals with the wars between the Pandavas and the Kauravas. In both, Truth endures and justice triumphs, a lesson so necessary to us in modern times. A well known writer has culled the following particulars from the puranas and Ithahasas: Kaliyuga is said to have begun at midnight 17/18th of February 3102 B. C. when Sri Krishna is said to have shaken off his mortal coil before going to Vaikunta and Yudhishtra ruled for 26 years afterwards.
