Malaysia and Lanka Meet in Cordial Conference

It was not merely the routine Good Will Mission that Premier Dudley Senanayake had undertaken when he visited Malaysia the modern model of progress and prosperity. The natural ties that bind these two nations may be traced to the Colonial days of the immediate past when both Malaya and Lanka vied with each other to earn the encomium of their English rulers. And when Independence was nwoy these countries the ties did not loosen but became firmer.

Premiers like School Principals have more of fraternising duties than being burdened, the former with a particular portfolio or the latter with a definite class room. Modern tendency has become more or less a rule that Premiers and Cabinet Ministers must be on the move out of their countries on foreign visits despite financial implications. When Prime Minister meets Prime Minister the occasion becomes unusually significant and big. Welcoming the head of nation by another has become a Great Art.

Premier Dudley Senanayake has a peculiar trait of pleasing his host just as he has the significant tact of acquiring the good will of his Opposition

in Home Affairs. His visit to Canada was extremely invigorating. Now Malaysia went all out to greet him in typical Malaysian magnificence.

Winning welcome it was. Malaysia has all along been conscious of Lanka's place in the affairs of Asia. Malaysia is in a way the mother-land of several Ceylonese. This aspect makes the co-operation of these countries with each other easy as it is imperative. More than that the 'Rubber' base has compelled the Governments of these nations to have closer consultations on this subject of common interest to both.

The climate of co-operation has become

The Pandian King And The Wood-Cutter

In those olden days. Madurai in South India was ruled by Pandian Kings. One of them spent two lakhs of Rupees in doing Utsava of Lord Soma Sundresh ar in a certain year. He had a great Abhimana. He thought within himself, "I am a great devotee of Lord Siva. I have spent a large sum of money in the worship of the Lord. Thousands of Brahmins, Sadhus and poor people were fed. I have given rich presents to Brahmin Pundits. There is no king who is so pious as myself".

Lord Siva appeared in his dream that night and said, "O King: Do not be proud of your piety, devotion and charity. I am not pleased with you in any way. Wherever there is pride, there cannot be any real devotion and holiness. Just go and see my humble devotee, the wood-cutter, who lives in a small hut on the banks of the Vaigai, and who offers to Me on Mondays a little Kheer made of broken rice and a little black sugar. Learn from him what real devotion is."

The king was greatly vexed. The next morning he proceeded to see the wood-cutter in his hut. He asked the wood-cutter "How do you worship Lord Siva."

The wood-cutter said in a meek voice "O King I earn two annas daily. I spend one anna for my food, distribute a pice in charity and save three pice daily. On every Monday I prepare a little Kheer with some broken rice and black sugar and offer it to Lord Siva. Whenever I cut wood, I always repeat Siva, Siva, Siva. I always remember Him. This is my devotion to the Lord. I do not know anything else."

The King was very pleased with the simpli-

WORLD ANIMAL DAY

The World Animal Day was celebrated in the Panadura Park for the twentieth time. As usual a number of animals including an elephant were fed by animal lovers.

"I congratulate Dr. W. S. Fernando for continuously celebrating the World Animal Day for twenty years and I am pleased to see that the meat stalls are closed in Panadura on all the Four Poya Days. Your resolution to request the Government to stop slaughtering and close the meat stalls on all the Four Poya Days is very good but it is even better to ask our Buddhists in Ceylon to abstain from meat eating on all the Four Poya Days. I am surprised to see that in a country like Ceylon where the majority of the students are Buddhist the Education Department has made poultry farming a compulsory subject. The Buddhists should vehemently oppose this", said Rev. Narada Thero of Vajiraramaya who presided at the meeting.

Dr. W. S. Fernando, Principal, Universal College, Panadura, who is the organiser of the celebration, said that one of the objects of his Model English School, Universal College, which he had started with a single child on Feb. 17th 1915 was the propagation of the doctrine of Ahimsa all over the world. He had organised his Ahimsa movement with about ten children in May 1st 1925 and it had spread to 42 countries. Main objects were to propagate the observance of the Ahimsa Week all over the world and to get cattle-slaughter banned in Ceylon. On June 1st 1939 Poon Full Moon Day with the kind co-operation of 153 conveners consisting of Hindus, Buddhists, Christians and Muslims he had held a mass meeting in the Park presided over by the Late Mr. Gurge E. de Silva, Member of the State Council, to create public opinion that cattle-slaughter in Ceylon should be banned.

Mr. P. C. de Silva, the

Vice-President of the Panadura Government and Local Government Servants' Buddhist Association moved the following resolutions:

(a) "This meeting requests the Ceylon Government to close meat stalls on all the Four Poya Days."

(b) "This meeting requests all the Buddhists in Ceylon to abstain from meat on all the Four Poya Days."

Mr. Victor Salgado, Member of the Panadura Urban Council, who has been successful in getting his Council to close the meat stalls in Panadura on all the Four Days, seconding the above resolution said that he would be able to get the meat stalls in Panadura closed altogether if he were given co-operation of the residents by abstaining from meat.

Mr. A. P. Fernando, Notary Public explained the significance of the day and gave a vivid account of the life of St. Francis of Assisi in whose honour the day is celebrated.

Rev. Gonapinuwala Sumana Thero, Chief Lecturer in Buddhist Philosophy, Vidyaloka University Pirivena Galle pointed out that man could live a happy life without taking flesh and gave many instances of a number of vegetarians from different countries who had lived to 120 years.

Dr. W. F. Jayasuriya, President of the Ceylon Humanitarian Society, said that he had been a vegetarian since 1932 and it was a pity to see that our Government encouraged cattle-breeding for slaughter, fishing, and tapping toddy for distilling arrack.

Mr. Santha Devapriya de Silva, President, Sri Kapila Sri Ahimsa movement, Magalla, illustrated how the character of man was affected by eating meat and pointed out a large number of diseases caused by taking flesh food.

The meeting terminated with a vote of thanks by Mr. E. V. Fernando.

Mahatma Gandhi: The Sainly Political Revolutionary

Sir,—October 2nd is the 100th Birth Anniversary of this great soul—unique in the political history of India, nay, of the whole world. Politicians as well as historians in their simplicity, which is their divine right, often wonder as to why Gandhiji means so much more than other spirits of the world that preceded and succeeded them. since he has taught them nothing which has been proclaimed before or after them. The reason for his greater significance is the fact that the "Word" in him, as in the case of Lord Buddha or the Christ, became "Flesh"; and that is the utmost that can be attained. To appear wise

nothing is needed but the actor's talent, to appear wise in the ordinary sense it only requires a prominent mind. But before a man turns into and becomes a political Mahatma the highest which he felt and recognised must have become the central propelling force of his whole life. Gandhiji's whole life became the concentrated essence of the spirit of India's revolt against foreign domination. Thus he was able to rule the minds and hearts of the Indian humanity as well as those of the entire civilized world. Gandhiji and Jawaharlal Nehru had fundamental ideological

ILLICIT INTERFERENCE!

In a dignified manner befitting the position he holds in the affairs of this country, particularly in matters concerning the Hindu Public, the President of the Saiva Paripalana Sabha has, in his letter of protest addressed to the Special Commissioners of Jaffna, taken exception to the ill-conceived interference by certain non-Hindus in the installing of the image of Saraswathy, traditionally accepted in this country as the Goddess of Learning. The sinister persuasion by a small band of bigoted mischief-mongers seems to have achieved its praiseworthy purpose as is evident from the desecrating distortions of the features of the image which was already installed that are now being hurriedly effected. Perhaps the Special Commissioners have thought that by silencing a vociferous coterie despite it being unrepresentative would help them proceed with the project without further interference. However, it is regrettable that these Commissioners who by virtue of the special responsibility that has been placed on their heads by the Minister of Local Government should have chosen to err in the company of the wrong group of the citizens of the Northern Capital.

We wish to remind the Special Commissioners that at a time when the Sandal — *Thilagam* and Saffron have become the accepted symbol of Oriental Culture, the peevish protest by pettifoggings dissidents against the appropriateness of installing the Image of Saraswathy in the portals of the premises of the Public Library of Yalpanam, the repository of Eastern Civilization, is only a vicious attempt to create discord and dissension among the people. The Special Commissioners will do well to examine

the new development and, if necessary, after discussion with the leading citizens of the City, leaders of the responsible associations and the Member of Parliament for Jaffna, remedy the wrong that has been unwittingly done by them in replacing the appropriate Image of Saraswathy by a thoroughly inappropriate substitution facinatingly called the Yarl Nanga. The Commissioners would have heard of the celebration of the *Navarathri* Festival during the past ten days throughout the Eastern World and themselves would have observed the spontaneous spirit of devotion to Goddess Saraswathy by the entire people in the area that is represented by the Jaffna Public Library. And so fresh a reminder as this instructive fact cannot be ignored by the Special Commissioners.

differences and had often quarrelled over policies and political strategy, but Jawaharlal in spite of his differences with aim invariably ultimately obeyed him, especially when there was a political crisis and the most astute politicians were in a quandary. In fact, Nehru had often confessed that—the old man was a magician and a political wizard who felt the pulse of the nation better than any one of them put together, and that he dared not oppose him. We all know that there is an indefinable something called "Personality" which is the secret of a man's power and control over other peoples' minds and hearts. It is also the inner geography of the moral man. Many years ago while delivering a political speech in London, the late Sarojini Naidu, the great Indian poetess and politician in describing Gandhiji told the audience as follows: "This little great man, this puny little man—Gandhi—our Bapu who could be crushed between the two fingers of a burly Englishman has shaken the foundations of the British rule in India. Make no mistake about this little old man".

May his life and his example shine for ever and bring light and wisdom to all erring humanity.

The Image in Front of the Jaffna Public Library

We publish below a copy of the letter of protest addressed to the Special Commissioners of the City of Jaffna by the President of the Jaffna Saiva Paripalana Sabha, as the matter is of special concern for our readers. —Ed. 'H. O.'

"I have the honour to lodge hereby a strong and emphatic protest against what is being done by way of interference with the proposed image of the Goddess of Learning at the instance of a small coterie of men who pose as representatives of the public at large. Such interference, I am emboldened to state, amounts to an insult being hurled at the Tamil community in general and at the Hindus in particular.

The Jaffna Public Library Building is being built with funds contributed by and or collected from the public. Mr P. J. Hudson the then Government Agent Jaffna was President, and Mr. T. Murugesampillai who was Divisional Revenue Officer, Jaffna at that time was Secretary of the First Yarl Vinodha Carnival Committee. As President and Secretary they executed a Trust Deed creating a Trust Fund for the Jaffna Public Library Building and it was accepted by Mr Sam A. Sabapathy, the then Mayor and Mr K. Shanmukham who was Commissioner at that time for and on behalf of the Jaffna Municipal Council. Thus the Council is a trustee bound by solemn obligation to fulfil the trust. The original of the said Deed attested by Mr. S. Coomarasooriar N. P. is at the Council Office.

Dr. S. R. Ranganathan, Professor of Librarianship of the University of New Delhi and Mr Narasimhan, the renowned authority on Dravidian Architecture, were got down to Jaffna to plan the Library Building. With the aid of funds realised by the First Yarl Vinodha Carnival and funds collected later by carnivals and otherwise all of which were deposited to the credit of the Library Trust Fund held in trust by the Jaffna Municipal Council, the building work was started in or about 1956: There was a sum of three and a half lakhs of rupees at that time. The first stage of the building is almost complete, with the domes and minarets being constructed. The image of Saraswathy, the Goddess of Learning, was to be installed over the

spout in front of the building.

I visited the site one or two days ago and I found that the image of Saraswathy is being replaced by some other image said to be that of "Yarl Nanga" The Library is supposed to be a Temple of Learning and the Book of Knowledge in the lower left palm of the Goddess represents the boon of learning she offers to devotees of learning. Instead of the four arms of Saraswathy, the image under construction has two. The new image does not conform to any historical, religious or traditional concept.

In Mysore the Dassara Festivals are celebrated as a National Festival by persons of all Faiths. It is so in Bengal. Through out India it is known as Navarathri or Dassara Festivals. On the ninth day Saraswathy Pooja is performed and people of all Faiths join in the devotion to Saraswathy, the Goddess of Learning. I do not understand why and how a few non-Hindus have poked their heads into this matter and persuaded you to replace the image of Saraswathy by this new image which does not conform to any historical, religious or traditional concept.

The plan for the building was prepared by the great architect Mr. Narasimhan. As one enters the ground floor of the building one sees the Model of the entire building. The cost was not a little of obtaining the plan and making the model. It is fit and proper that at the spout in front of the building there should be the image of Saraswathy as originally contemplated. I have to call upon you to fulfil the original idea of installing the image of Saraswathy without effecting any change. Your failure to comply with this demand will wound the religious feelings of not only Hindus but also Buddhists and all national-minded adherents of all Faiths.

This matter is important. I have to request you to be so good as to

more congenial than ever before. Even the bombshell that was thrown by the Opposition taking exception to our Premier having any talks on the 'Asean' question could not create any change. The Association of South East Nations has been suggested by Malaysia. The invitation to Lanka for membership in the ASEAN is quite regular. Though Lanka is not geographically speaking in the South East of Asia yet being in close proximity to the countries in that sector can be a strong inducement for seeking membership in the ASEAN. But Lanka's membership in the ASEAN is no question of any importance as far as the good relations between Malaysia and Lanka are concerned. Premier Senanayake made full use of his visit to Malaysia to see for himself the development works in that country and has certainly gathered useful information for application in the Development program of Lanka, Malaysia is hopeful of being self sufficient in the provision of rice by about 1970. And this optimism has further added to the hopes of Premier Senanayake for making Lanka the granary of the East as of old. And so the Premier's visit to Malaysia has been really productive.
