set up as we could accept the responsibility of taking in quite eligible children at a crucial stage and bringing them up to the Upper Sixth Form without too many barriers caused by diversification, With less overcrowding and proper staffing our present standards could be bettered in the new set-up

The greatest problem for the parents will be to find their children a place in the Science stream at the end of the eighth standard. It must be conceded that Science comes first in the priorities of useful knowledge. But our children need social skills and training in citizenship. They need wide opportunities of studying both the Sciences and Humanities. Casteism among children and even subjects is causing much damage and quite a number at our schools are falling by the wayside even at the Ordinary Level. With the introduction of Course Guides it should not prove difficult to teach some Science to every student, chiefly because such teaching does not entail the employment of highly qualified teachers. Let it be remembered that both the Americans and the Russians who stress the value of useful knowledge believe that almost anything can be taught to almost
