SKANDA SHASTI

BY V. SUBRAMANIAM

(Saiva Pulavar)

Lord Skanda or Shanmuka is a Muboortham of Lord Shiva Lord Skanda is a Pratyaksha Deivam in this Kali yuga and is adored and worshipped with intense faith and devotion by the Saivites in India and Ceylon. He is worshipped in Ceylon more by the Tamils; the Sinhalese brethren also do so at Kadirgama.

The Muboortham of Lord Shanmuka is indicative of the combination of the five elements 'Fire' (agni) when he appeared as the sparks; was 'Ether' (akasa) when the sparks encircled the whole Universe; the 'Wind' (vayu) and 'Light' (Theyu) when they carried Him; was 'Water' (appu) when He entered the Ganges and was 'Earth' (Prithivi) when He took His abode on the Hills,—five Faces, and the sixth Face represents the life-principle or the spirit. Thus the holy form consists of six Faces and twelve Hands bearing different kinds of weapons the most important the Vel (or Javelin) is kept on the chest. The Lord rides on the Peacock, holds the banner of the Cock. On both sides (right and left) are His Sakthis Valli and Devayanai. The peacock stands upon a black serpent. The entire picture is the form of Shanmuka or Subramanya.

Now let us see the esoteric significance of the form. The six Faces indicate that His presence shines on the four directions and also above and below. They also represent the six attributes of the Lord viz Gnana Vairagya, Bala, Kirtti, Sri, and Aisvarya and denote that He is the Virat purusha the all-pervading. It is also hinted that He is the Perfect Being sought after by the six means of knowledge. The six faces may also be taken to indicate the six Chakras or the centres of Energy in the human body which are known to Yogars. The twelve arms show that He alone creates, preserves, destroys, hides and bless-

es in fact does everything in the world.

Valli, Devayani and Vel mean respectively Icha Sakti, Kriya Sakti and Jnana Sakti—namely the force of Desire, the force of Action and the force of Knowledge. The fact that Desire and Action forces are kept on either side of Him and that Gnana Sakti or the force of knowledge alone is kept on His chest points out that knowledge is the most important of them all, and that it never gets separated from Him. The peacock on which He rides shows the shape of the Pranava letter Om. When the peacock spreads out its tail, it has the round shape of the Pranava and within it is the Lord in the form of Subramanya. The subornated serpent kept in check by the peacock's feet shows that Maya, impurity is completely subjugated by the power of Pranava. The cock in the banner signifies the sound firm or Nadam (நடம்) It is the nature of the cock to crow at the moment when the sun is about to rise in the horizon; similarly, the chanting of the Mantra (மந்திரம்) Om heralds the manifestation of the effulgent Atman or ultimate 'Truth'.

As in the worship of other gods, in the Saguna worship of Lord Subramanya also, there are some vratas (விரதங்கள்) or vows to be observed. One of the most important of these vratas of the Lord is the Skanda Shasti Vrata. It is commenced on the Pratama thithi (பிரதம திதி) first day of the Sukla Paksha (bright fortnight) in the month of Aipasi - Karthikai. Generally devotees of the Lord observe complete fast for the six days and engage themselves in the worship, reading and learning of the glories of the Lord Skanda in Kandapuram, and other sacred books dealing with His stories. The sixth day commences the victory of the Lord over the

Asura King Sura Pathma. Persons who observe this Vrata with faith and devotion will drive immense spiritual benefit. The sixth day is observed on a grand scale in all Hindu Temples where God Subramanya is worshipped.

The next day His triumph is celebrated and thereby He protects the Universe with His unfailing grace.

The following is taken from "Saiva Siddhanta"

1. "Valli is the Icha Sakti, Muruga's energy or Valli's intervention is therefore essential for getting Muruga's grace.
2. Darasena is Kriya Sakti, the energy which provides the soul with gross and subtle bodies and with experience-planes according to their Karma.
3. Vel (Javelin) is Gnana Sakti liberating the Souls from the bondage of Karma.
4. Valli's union with Muruga serves as a concrete example to show the emancipation of the soul by the Guru's help as enunciated in the eighth Sutram of Sivagnanabodham, for, just as the soul is free from the bodily ties by the grace of the Guru, Valli got released from the illiterate hunter and attained bliss by the Grace of Muruga.

Another great truth that the Lord would grant the prayers of His devotees, Himself taking the initiative and fulfilling their needs, even as a servant would, be discernible from the fact that pleased with Valli's self-less prayers the Lord Himself took the initiative and proceeded from Tiruttani to Vallimalai and took Valli unto Him. So, how and when can we find Muruga? Although the Puranic story gives Muruga a form and a name, yet it is clear that He can be found only in the hrudaya. Guhai (is) in the case of the hearts of those who truthfully and ceaselessly yearn for His Grace; and so Muruga is called Guha. This is the highest philosophy of the Muruga cult.

Twenty Two Years on Trial

U. N. Still Unable to Discipline Member Nations

The Super Assembly of the majority of the States of the world has survived twenty two years of toddling, infancy and teenage both making no difference. Yes the U. N. has come of age and can hope to lay claim to determined action merely on the score of passage of time.

The sudden collapse of the League of Nations owing to the bewildering triumph of the allied nations after initial defeat and despondency, had been a warning to the Big Powers that any attempt to create a World Body of Political purposes would be futile. However the Second World War which was fought almost on the pattern of the First, had made the Allied Nations more haughty and there-

fore more confident of assuming leadership of a Union of Powers.

The concept of co-operative effort was as old as the wars that fill the pages of the History of the world and was therefore not a new inspiration. Combination of powers was always necessary and the right selection of allies only decided the issue for the triumphing group. This again (Continued on page 2)

Restoring Sigiriya Frescoes

U. S. and Italy Cooperate in Effort

Due to the combined and concerted efforts of the governments of Ceylon, Italy and the United States, an internationally known expert will soon arrive in Ceylon to help restore the historical Sigiriya frescoes.

His visit to Ceylon and costs of the initial survey will be borne by the Smithsonian Institution, Washington, an agency of the United States Government.

The damage done to the Sigiriya frescoes, which Dr. C. E. Godakumbure, Ceylon's Commissioner of Archaeology, rightly indicated are a world treasure rather than a Ceylonese treasure, has evoked great concern throughout the world.

Among the representatives of foreign missions in Ceylon which hastened to offer their assistance in efforts to restore the

defaced frescoes, were the Italian and the United States Ambassadors who made spontaneous moves, both in consultation with the Government of Ceylon, to secure the services of the best available expert in the field of restoration.

The Italian Ambassador in Ceylon contacted the Cultural Division of the Foreign Office in Rome to find out what assistance could be rendered. Simultaneously, the American Embassy cabled the U. S. State Department requesting immediate action. Also very much involved in this international effort has been Harold Plenderlith, Director of the International Center for the Study of the Preservation and the Restoration of Cultural Property with headquarters in Rome, as well as the Smithsonian Institute in Washington, D. C.

The restoration expert to come to Ceylon will shortly be named. The expert, possibly an Italian, is associated with the International Center for the Preservation and Restoration of Cultural Property.

PROPER USE OF MAN-POWER

Prize-day addresses normally follow the stereotyped soft speech that showers a torrent of tribute to the College and its staff and makes a general observation merely in the form of obiter dicta. Very rarely we note the purposeful prize day speech that takes the pupils, parents and pedagogues all at once into a co-ordinated consideration and draws their attention to short-comings directing them on to a planned program for making practical use of education. This significant exception, we were able to find in the thought-provoking talk of the Chief Guest at the Annual Prize-giving of the Jaffna Hindu College.

Most appropriately the learned Chief Guest explained lucidly and at length the true purpose of education, the proper assessment of the value of University Degrees and pleaded for more technical and vocational training and better preservation of specialized skills in the age-old tradition of the son emulating the father's example. Lanka like all other countries is experiencing a severe economic set back due to diverse factors one of which is the utter callousness of the people to make the maximum effort to utilize their skill and scholarship in industrial and agricultural pursuits. What naturally suits the individual genius if developed would be of national usefulness. To achieve economic independence this aspect of education must be borne in mind. We believe that the weighty ideas and wholesome advice that we find in the Prize-day

speech would create a new spirit of patriotism in the minds of our younger generation.

USEFULNESS OF THE UPPER HOUSE

Every October the ruling Party is given the pleasing opportunity of placating its supporters by either nominating or sponsoring the election of new Senators. With unerring regularity this assignment of duty occurred this month and the U. N. P., the major partner in the National Government, seized the opportunity with gusto and by misjudging its own powers in such circumstances according to parliamentary convention and practice, went to the ludicrous extent of stultifying itself by the choice of some of its nominees. The immediate reaction from the dissatisfied groups and also the Opposition was the demand for the abolition of the Senate. Whether the Senate is superfluous or the method of the selection and election of Senators had not been followed in letter and in spirit of the Soulbury Constitution it is for parliamentarians to discuss and decide. But the Premier who has all along enjoyed a high reputation for being strictly and constitutionally democratic in thought, speech and action has allowed himself to be questioned on this issue about the correctness of his acts.

Surely we do not agree with the common view that one who had suffered defeat in a Parliamentary Election should not be eligible for consideration for appointments in the public administration of the Island.

We certainly uphold the objection to defeated parliamentary candidates being nominated as Senators. In the case of elected Senators the proposing of the name of a defeated candidate is morally objectionable. But where the electors, who are none other than the elected Representatives proceed to elect such a nominee the entire blame falls on them.

There is something more important than any of these considerations of moral viewpoints. Can it be honestly said that the Senate is fully representative of the special interests for which the Soulbury Commissioners had recommended the creation of the Upper Chamber? The Prime Minister will do well to answer this question himself and declare whether the Senate is a useful institution.
