## The Case for Vegetarianism

Everyone seems to enjoy the appetizing steak dinner. However, let us take a detour to the local slaughter house first.

Let's visualize the individual cows with their trusting, soulful eyes that were sacrificed for this meal. Then we'll observe the inhumane killing process followed by the dubious "inspection" of the butchered carcass. I wonder, then how many of you could eat your dinner with such relish.

Some of you, to deny guilt, will argue, "But I didn't kill the cow." Nonsense, gentlemen, you're the hand behind the hand that did. For cattle are only slaughtered in direct ratio to the demand.

If that appeal doesn't faze you—and believe me, there are countless people who for that reason alone are vegetarians—let's examine other facts.

From a physiological standpoint many people believe that meat is vital for good health. But is it really? Let's look at the evidence, gentlemen.

Let me introduce Exhibit A: The carnivores, the lion, tiger, dog and the hyena. These animals are designed physiologically for a flesh diet. Observe their equipment. The sharp canine teeth with which to kill, and the powerful claws to render and tear apart their prey. Notice the protruding mouth and short intestines adapted for the digestion of rapidly decaying flesh.

Now we will present Exhibit B: Homo-sapiens or thinking man. Let us examine the apparatus of man. He is equipped with flat nails, flat teeth, and long convoluting intestines.

And now our final Exhibit, C, or our star witness: The Anthropoid Apes, the Gorilla, Chimpanzee, and the Orang-outang. Biologically, Gentlemen of the Jury, these animals most closely resemble man.

They are in the same phylum, same class, same order as man. Observed in their natural state, these creatures are strict vegetarians. Nature has equipped all animals so as to obtain their food best. If Nature intended man to be a carnivore, is it not logical that it would provide him with the equipment of the carnivore?

Now let us weigh some additional evidence:

Is it mere coincidence that the Hunzas of Northern India, who rarely eat meat, are noted for their remarkable health, their longevity, and their ability to reproduce themselves until advanced age?

Why are the Seventh Day Adventists being studied so keenly? Because as a sect they are uniquely free from the degenerative diseases, cancer, heart ailments, arteriosclerosis. One of the basic tenets of their faith is to avoid meat and animal products.

Cholesterol, the suspected factor for these degenerative diseases is present in all foods of animal origin; however, it is absent from foods of plant origin, such as fruits, vegetables, cereals and nuts. Nuts, incidentally, pound for pound provide as high a quality of protein as meat, but without the poisonous waste products.

There have been numerous athletes of outstanding achievement, such as Murray Rose and Robert Moller, who have demonstrated that a meatless diet is no deterrent to strength or endurance. Needless to remind you, gentlemen, that the strongest animals, such as the horse, camel and ox all subsist without meat. The elephant, another vegetarian, pulls trees out by their roots and hauls logs by the ton.

## Hindus of Jaffna Resent Alienation of the Chidambaram Navalar Trust Properties

A public meeting was convened on 28-10-67 at the Saiva Paripalana Sabha Navalar Hall at the instance of several leading Hindus of Jaffna for the purpose of considering what action should be taken to prevent the sale of the land comprised in the Chidambaram Navalar Saivaprakasa Vidyasalai Trust founded and established by the late Sri la Sri Arumuga Navalar. The meeting was presided over by Mr. T. Muttusamipillai, President Saiva Paripalana Sabha. Mudaliyar G. Subramaniam who takes a keen interest in the Navalar Trust both at Chidambaram and Jaffna was also present at the meeting.

"This meeting regrets the sale of the paddy lands, 30 acres in extent situated at Usuppus near the Chidambaram Railway Station and expresses its protest against what has been done.
