3. University of Jaffna (Ceylon)

For instance in the Northern Schools the Soccer Competition of this year has been reduced to a farce and a frivolity. Competitions are organised to give impetus to students to attain the highest possible standard in sports and thereby to contribute to the national greatness of their country. It is to be regretted that the Competition in Soccer has been inefficiently organised and carelessly executed. Certain Colleges regularly keep out of this Competition while others fall by the way side in the middle of the Competition, yet others are unable to proceed to a finish owing to sudden developments.

Punnalaikadduvan Sethi Vinayagar Temple Ther Thiruppany

The annual Skantha Snaddi festival was conducted with piety and devotion during the last six days. Special Abhishekam, Poojams Purana Padanam were part of the said festival.

Fixing of Dates For Public Examinations

Days Of Religious Significance To Be Avoided

The Department of Examinations has been following the old procedure of conducting examinations in August and December for the G. C. E. and during other months for the other examinations. In December there are several religious observances, such as the Festivals of Lights and Thiruvembavai. High Festivals of many temples fall during July, August and September. Students appearing for the public examinations during these months are compelled to forgo religious observances. It is therefore necessary that in the matter of the fixing of dates for examinations the convenience of candidates must be considered. When Poya days were declared holidays, Hindus drew satisfaction that most of their religious ceremonies that fall on Full Moon days and New Moon days would be covered by these holidays. But the Poya Calendar is being fixed by the Buddhist Priest who follow a different calculation for the determination of dates for Full Moon and New Moon days. Invariably the Poya days either precede or follow the days on which Hindus observe the Full Moon Day or the New Moon day. Hence the public holidays do not generally benefit the Hindu Students.

In the olden days during the Colonial rule Christian festivals were declared holidays and no examinations could be held during Easter or Christmas. Now that the people are the rulers of this country the same principle of avoiding dates on which annual religious festivals fall from being fixed for the holding of public examinations must be observed. Religious festivals and ceremonies are by their very nature and significance

to be observed by the entire household. School-going children should not be discouraged from observing these occasions merely because of the conducting of Examinations. There are festivals during the celebration of which devotees also have to abstain from food. School-going children cannot be expected to be on a fast and at the same time to do the energetic work of answering question papers. The same observation applies to supervisors and invigilators of examinations. It will be advisable if the Examination Department can consult Principals and Headmasters about suitable dates for public examinations. Thus the dates can be fixed after consultation so that Examinations might not interfere with the religious observances of candidates.

The General and Technical Education Bill

It is learnt that the General and Technical Education Bill to provide for (a) General and Technical Education in Elementary lower and upper, Secondary and Technical Schools (b) the organisation of different types of schools for such purpose (c) establishment of the Government Institute of Education to establish a United Educational Service (d) creation of a National Education Fund will be tabled by the Minister of Education in the House of Representatives on November 20 1967.

The debate on the Higher Education Act also will continue on the 20th inst.

TEACHERS' TRANSFERS

The authorities who control the administrative activities of the Ministry of Education appear to have been suddenly set off their steps judging from the orders that have been issued by them transferring a large number of teachers from almost every leading school in the North to educational institutions in other parts of the Island. It cannot be denied that teachers are now in the service of the Government and therefore are transferable. The authority for such transfers certainly rests with the Administrative chiefs of the Education Service. The scope of this authority cannot, however, exceed the bare needs of the service and is expected to conform to a method that will not upset the equilibrium of the net work of teaching in schools. Robbing Peter and paying Paul cannot be the basis of transfers in any service, least of all in the Educational Service. The leading colleges in the North cannot be said to be over-staffed for excess teachers to be transferred out without adequate replacement. In fact no school is adequately staffed. The Ministry of Education must be aware of this undisputed state of affairs namely the inadequacy of teachers. In such a greatly impoverished service no efficient administrative authority can think of transfers by the cluster and that without any replacement.

We also learn that most of the teachers who have been in charge of special subjects in the leading colleges of the North and by whose efficient instruction several students have secured admission to the University have been ordered to assume duties in smaller schools where their ability cannot be made full use of. The Educational Service must be efficient, sound and effective for the general progress of a country. Hence the people in general can-

not be expected to let any administrative act that is bound to affect the Service pass without being questioned. Transferring Specialist teachers and that in a lump from one school will mean the degrading of that particular institution in the content of education. Here, therefore, is a matter for the parents and the students even if we leave the teachers out of the affair. The Minister of Education must now make some effort to view the problem of Education in a more practical and reasonable manner and try to take into his confidence the Principals and Headmasters of Colleges and Schools so that any adjustment in the Service might not adversely affect the general standard of education. For the present all that is feasible is to withdraw to this sudden decision of wholesale transfers and to review the situation in consultation with those who are entitled to be consulted.

Treating Temples Like Ordinary Places

Sir,—Under the pretext of removing social disabilities, our sacred Temples have now been reduced to the level of eating houses, tea boutiques and barber saloons, thanks to our inept politicians. The Mahabharata, the fifth Veda, says that all were one in the beginning and the same came into being by sacred Sankaras or rites. On this basis, Saivism has graded the people into Sabalar, Pralaya-kalar and Vignakalar according to the malam in force and graded temple entry accordingly. The temple is not a place of public worship according to Swamy V.vekananda. Our enthusiastic reformers got the Government to prohibit slaughter of animals and birds at some temples, and now they find the Government interfering with their

worship in temples. We have no Sir C. P.
