Maintenance Of Transport Vehicles

(Continued from last issue)

As the Departments can have account with the Petrol dealer, no cash payment need be made for the above purchases. The dealer will forward a monthly statement of accounts giving reference to the bills concerning the vehicle, to the officer in charge with a copy to the head of the Department if necessary for purchasing the matter when payment is delayed.

When the Government owns, operates and maintains a public Transport system in the case of a nationalised transport service, the purchase of petrol etc., servicing, repairs to and replacement of parts to the vehicle, overhauling major repairs etc and accounting and administrations will be different. There should be petrol banks, storage, servicing stations owned and run by the Government itself. There should be a central automobile repair/workshop having different sections such as carpentry, smithy, tinker shop, pattern making foundry, Machine shop, Electric repair shop comprising Welding, Armature winding, battery charging, wiring etc, Transmission section, Tyre retreading and building section and Body building and upholstery. It should be possible to turn out certain spare parts and to carry out all kinds of repairs to all parts of the different vehicles of the Transport service. There should also be a central automobile stores where tyres tubes, batteries, spare parts for Engine, Electric System, transmission brake, etc. will be stocked. The maintenance of accounts with S. I. B. S. R. B. or the Cardex System can be just like any other Government Stores.

There should be a log book for each vehicle for recording the history, performance and maintenance relating to that vehicle. If any re-

pairs or replacements, renewal of types or tubes etc, are made, these should be recorded in this log book. Charging battery replacing a broken spring, brake adjustments alignments, change of spark plugs, or bulbs, valve grinding etc. are taken as running expenses and included in the monthly statement. Change of battery, tyres tubes are debited against stock under annual maintenance expenditure or allotment. General overhauling with replacement of costly worn out or broken part also falls under this expenditure. Major repairs due to accidents or other unforeseen circumstances are debited to contingencies.

As for minor repairs, the officer in charge after satisfying himself that they are actually due or necessary, can sanction the expenditure upto a fixed amount. Regarding replacement of tyres etc. the officer empowered to approve the expenditure, will check whether they are necessitated under normal wear & tare, reviewing the mileage covered up by the vehicle and the condition of the roads.

The monthly statement will then be prepared in the log book with reference to the daily report forms bills from the dealer, monthly statement of accounts from the dealer, bills from Servicing station or repair/workshop for minor repairs or replacements carried out.

Running Cost

- i. Cost of petrol, oil, lubricants etc. (statement of accounts from dealer)
- ii. Repairs to vehicle, replacements
- iii. Drivers pay, O. T. allowances
- iv. Miscellaneous

TAMILS' WELFARE EDUCATIONAL SOCIETY

A deputation from the Tamils' Educational Welfare Society headed by Mr S J. V. Chelvanayagam Q. C., M. P., met the Director of Education, Colombo Region Mr B. P. M. Senanayake recently to protest against an attempt to discontinue the Tamil stream at Presbyterian Girls' School, Debiwala and to apprise him of the difficulties experienced by Tamil children.

Associated with the Director of Education were the following Officials viz — Mr. V. Weerawardena, Ch. E. O., Mr V. Sangaralingam Ch. E. O., and Mr. T. Manickavasagar C. E. O.

The members of the deputation were:—

Mr. S. Somasundaram, Mr. E. Rasiab, Mr. S. Nagarajah, Mrs E. S. Wijayarajah, Mr A. S. Nadarajah and Mr. S. Sivasubramaniam.

The deputation told the Director that the School authorities had been discouraging the growth of the Tamil stream and that was why the strength of the Tamil speaking children there was not impressive. It was illustrative of what was happening at other places

Representations also were made regarding the Tamils stream at St Clare's College, Kotla werapura Tamil mixed school, Wellawatte Maha Vidyalaya, Girls' High School, Mt. Lavinia and other schools having Tamil stream and the need for laboratory facilities for Tamil Girls to study Science subjects and Mathematics. The Director agreed to give due consideration to the representations.

The Director of Education explained in detail the steps he had already taken to provide accommodation to nearly 450 Tamil medium children who were not able to get direct admission to schools

in the Colombo City. He also mentioned that this was made possible by an admission Board visiting various centres and interviewing parents after due notice and assigning schools for various children. The Director further stated that it was the onus of his department to give every child of school going age (4 yrs. 11 months on 1-1-68) admission to Grade I in a school as far as possible nearest to the residence. He requested the deputation to appreciate the fact that the Tamil medium schools are scattered about unlike the Sinhala medium Schools which are situated at close range. He also

STIFLE THE SCARE-MONGER

Within the space of the all too small seven day week, the people of this country have been served with alarms which could not have been dismissed as aberrations of ambitious politicians. When the information about a possible *Coup d'etat* was passed on to the responsible authorities by the stalwarts of the Opposition, it was generally discussed that evil forces were attempting to take foul advantage of all anti-government activities with a desperate view to overthrowing the National Government. But there there was only the smoke of statements that read like a prologue to a story of a secret agent Reading between the lines of the sensational story of the alleged *Coup d'etat* one could discover the sly attempt to split the National Government and expose it to the suspicion of the people as a collection of conflicting aspirations. The mockery of this mock-scare was made more monkeyish by the release of a further instalment of shocking news—the war to be waged at 'Woodlands'.

Since 1956 the people of Lanka have been periodically subjected to experiences of shocks by communal strife, *coup d'etat* and commotion and the nerves of the ordinary man have become very sensitive to every scare. The strain of this type of pressure on the common man has reached a breaking point. Any move to strike him with sudden terror by telling him that mischief by means of political plots is afoot would only make him feel that he is living in a very uncertain world.

We are of the opinion that the Government of any country where the essence of rule is generally accepted to be democratic conduct should be allowed to govern without being

harassed by pernicious propaganda Newspapers have a duty to perform in this context. Every whisper or careless comment should not be accepted as a potential threat to the Government and should be carefully verified before the readers are supplied with such news. Baseless general apprehension of plots alleged to overthrow the Government should not be made public. Unreasoning terror is a very unhealthy sign in democratic rule. The scare monger must be scared away.

covered up by other items, at the discretion of the Department can be debited.

This statement of account should be prepared by the officer in charge of the vehicle and supported by relevant records bills etc. and passed on to the higher officer empowered to pass the bills for payment. This officer will scrutinise the entries and satisfy himself that the mileage per gallon is kept the same as in previous month and that the running cost per mile has not increased. If there is any abnormal variation the officer responsible for the vehicle should furnish a certificate in the log book that the variations are due to say bad roads in up countries, development areas rural places, etc. or bad condition of the vehicle which needs, such and such repairs etc. The officer thus is able to exercise a check on the running and maintenance costs and also to have an idea about the present condition of the vehicle. The expenditure will have to be passed by the accounting officer.

The vehicle log book should contain the history and all information about the vehicle such as Make, Date of purchase, cost, Serial No. Chassis No. Laden and Unladen Weights, H. P. No of Cylinders, particulars of Engine Electrical, Transmission and brake Systems etc. There should be separate pages for Tyres Tubes, Thin Socs replacements and for battery, Make, capacity No of plates, when previously charged, Voltage and Specific Gravity of each cell and like that the routine maintenance works carried out should be entered and initialled by the officer in charge. The manufacturer's instructions regarding the periodical inspection and check ups (which are usually done by the drivers) should be carried out and entered in the register. Major repairs as valve grinding decarbination of Engine, over haul or others due to accidents or unforeseen circumstances are all entered in this book. This is an important record, reviewed periodically by a responsible officer and is also at times reviewed by the *Auditing Department* during their annual verification.

All vehicles should

have a set of tools such as tyre levers. Jack, Pump, spanners, screw drivers, pliers, Hammer, torch light etc. For long distance travel in rural or development areas, a spare 4 gal drum for storing petrol, a bucket for taking water for radiator, a spade or axe for removing small obstacles or ward blocks and a piece of rope for towing and such other odd items are included in the tools. The tools will be under the custody of the driver. The vehicle and these tools are checked during the Annual verification of tools and Plant. Unserviceable items are put under survey report and replaced by new ones—like other Governmental Stores property.

Drivers may be employed on a monthly paid basis. Overtime may be paid if it is more than two hours in a day. They are also governed by F. R. or other rules as applicable to Government Servants, regarding payment of Batta, Hallingallowances etc.

Drivers should not be changed or transferred frequently. As the drivers are responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of the vehicles, they have to do the work with interest and zeal and this work has to be appreciated or recognized by the officers concerned.

There can however be a few changes in the system of recording of the maintenance works, daily reports, servicing, repairs etc. when a transport system is nationalised. The maintenance works to be carried out the vehicles remain the same.

Under the nationalisation scheme, the transport system or services will be owned, operated and maintained by the state itself. Complete nationalisation by over night may be an impossibility but this can be enforced gradually. Zone by zone just like prohibition, requiring one transport or bus company after the other depending upon the financial resources of the state.

If a certain bus company who has been permitted or authorised to ply certain number of buses on certain routes at specific times, or to whom a licence has been issued by the transport ministry valid for a cer-

tain period, is to be taken over by the Government, before taking any action on the acquirement of the liabilities and assets and the staff of that Bus company, certain rules and regulations regarding the mode or method of acquirement, what to take over, how to take over, the basis of assessment of the assets and liabilities, depreciation charges, interest, payment of compensation, taking over the staff by considering their qualification and experience, taking over the stores, spares, tools and plant, immovable properties and other assets of the company, giving due consideration to the legal, financial, technical and administrative aspects, their implications (and complications) have to be drafted by a tribunal.

In India especially in Madras, the transport system was nationalised a few years ago. There were some difficulties at the initial stages in the transfer of the assets and liabilities. The Government with the unstinted and full cooperation from the private enterprises as well as from the public were able to overcome those mushroom difficulties and now the system is being operated and maintained to the entire satisfaction and convenience of the public.

There may be various problems to be tackled in the initial stage of operation and maintenance of a nationalised transport system, on the financial commercial, technical and administrative side of the system in Reliability and flexibility of service, time schedule, petrol, oil, lubricants, servicing, repairs, workshops, tools and plant, stores, payment of compensation, accidents, damage, loss, licensing, operation staff, office staff, staff in workshop, stores, Service stations, Petrol banks, clerical and accounting staff, on Public relations, Welfare of Staff, Salaries and allowances, overtime payment, trade unions, demonstrations strike etc. all because the transfer is

Political Purpose?

Sir,—

The recently concluded World Tamil Conference has aroused the suspicion that the entire purpose behind this affair was political. Under the immediate and careful patronage of the D. M. K. Government the Conference achieved unparalleled success in attracting unprecedented gatherings securing collection of donations by the thousands and providing a varied and picturesque program throughout the sessions. And the position of the D. M. K. Party has been consolidated and its leadership for ever has been ensured. All this has been achieved in the name of the Tamil Language.

The grandeur of the Conference is one thing but the gross performance and the net result constitute another thing. The claim that Tamil should regain its rightful place in the affairs of Tamilakam has been well and truly established ever since it was lost. Long before the Conference was inaugurated the right of the Tamil Language to its hereditary and legitimate position in Tamilakam has been established. But the Conference in its political enthusiasm went all out for a place for Tamil as the

lingua franca of India, and laid a claim for Tamil as the lingua franca of the world. Naturally the organisers must have thought that a World Conference must deal with the subject at a world level.

Time and again it has been repeated on the platform and in the press by political Tamils that Tamils were a world nation and the Tamil Language had been in vogue all the world over. Poetic imagination is permissible but political imagination of such a nature is, to say the least, a ludicrous habit

As far as the achievement of the Ceylon Delegation to the Conference was concerned it was a pathetic show of pitiful appeal to the Chief Minister of Madras to be so merciful as to *consent* to the claim of the Great Navalar who bestrode the Tamil literary sphere as a Colossus and earned for himself the reputation of being the champion of Tamil renaissance to be classified with those who could adorn the capital city of Tamil Nad by his appearing in the form of a statue. The appeal was sympathetically heard and mercifully allowed with the proviso that the people of Lanka should first find a purse worthy of the cause to be presented to the willing powers now controlling the world affairs of *Tamil*.
