## Kaleidoscopic View of Kalmunai By Election

### Severe Test for Several Parties

By-elections since that memorable General Election of March 1965 have established a system of the working of the political mind. Any enthusiastic student of political affairs of this country would be able to draw a graph depicting the new trend of events. Such a graphical study would be helpful to the people not necessarily the leaders of parties to review the situation with a view to preparing themselves for the next General Election.

Kalmunai of all the electorates of Lanka has a peculiarity all of its own. It is predominately populated by Muslims with the Tamil people sufficiently strong in number to direct the final issue. Any Muslim candidate who has the full backing of the Tamil voters will romp home in the race for a seat in the House of Representatives. In other words the Tamil voters cannot hope to have one of them voted to the seat. They act merely as a catalytic agent.

Since the first General Election the Kalmunai seat has been the hunting ground for only three parties, the Federal Party, the United National Party 1956 and thereafter along with these two parties the Sri Lanka Freedom Party becoming the third major party. Independents have from time to time assumed labels of mushroom parties. The Federal Party by reason of its title in Tamil 'The Tamil Arasu Kadchi' is a Communal Party like its mother organisation the All Ceylon Tamil Congress.

The Muslim voters who from the majority have to lean towards the political parties—the U. N. P., the S. L. F. P. or the F. P. unless they could not fall in line with the views and principles of these parties. The Leftist Parties however could not make any serious impression at Kalmunai and therefore did not count much. Between the U. N. P. and the S. L. F. P. since 1956 the Muslim voters prepared to be

attached to the Green Flag. However in the recent by-election by arrangement between the F. P. and the National Government of which the F. P. is a component, the F. P. became the sponsoring party perhaps not to lose recognition as a party to be reckoned with in that area. It was a battle on record between the F. P. and the S. L. F. P. though the National Government could not help identifying itself with the campaign of the F. P. as if it were itself pitted against the S. L. F. P.

Grouping the F. P. and its splinter section, the Tamil Freedom Movement, together, the voting may be taken as 9802 as against the 10599 registered by the S. L. F. P. The majority the S. L. F. P. has over the F. P. and T. F. M. combined is 797. The S. L. F. P. being a Party that has all along opposed the F. P. and at present vehemently opposed to the move of the F. P. for the establishment of District Councils may be adjudged to be the winner in the S. L. F. P. — F. P. tussle for superiority at Kalmunai.

This year (1968), this holy event occurred on the 14th of February. Lakhs of people from all over India hurried here to take part in the holy festival.

It has been said that there is no Teertha in all the three words as efficacious as this Teertha on this occasion in destroying even the worst of sins like Brahmahatya. The Teertha is also called Maagha Teertha. It means that sins will not touch the persons who take bath here!

Worship of this Teertha once in life is equivalent to worship of all the Devas. Going round this Tank once in pradhakshina is equivalent to living a hundred times in holy yatra. Bathing on the Mahamagham day here is equivalent to living a 100 years on the banks of the Ganga and bathing in it thrice a day.

The Brahma-Teertha is situated on the northern side of the Mahamagham Tank. Bathing in that Teertha removes the sins of both paternal and maternal ancestors to 101 past generations!

Further, bathing in this Teertha endows one with divine knowledge, wealth, wisdom, fame, long life and assures a long life of descendants.

To the east of Brahma Teertha lies Kubera Teertha. Bathing here endows one with riches. To the east of this Teertha and to the north of the Indra-Teertha, there is the Eesana-Teertha. Bathing there removes sins even of mountainous proportions.

Kanya-Teertha is situated at the centre of the tank. All the sixty-six crore Teerthas of the universe are said to be present in this Teertha on this particular occasion.

## MALARIA EPIDEMIC

Sir,—The Government is taking more steps than ever before and is prepared to spend millions to combat the spread of Malaria in this Island which produced a Malaria-epidemic of international reputation by name Dr. Rajendram who in 1945 left this Island completely free from Malaria. He accomplished what appeared to be an impossible task and his successors had merely to maintain that pitch.

Years later stray cases of Malaria were detected and all the field staff and some of the office staff were posted to outstations, to take blood films from all fever cases. Many of these officers had little or no work. However, large number of blood films were sent to Colombo and not even 10% of the films were examined. As to what would have happened to the thousands of unexamined films, is anybody's guess. What was the purpose in sending blood films to Colombo? If all the blood films had been examined without delay and examined as carefully as they should have been and effective steps taken, the spread of Malaria would have been stopped some years ago.

Did the Ministry or the various bosses in the Dept. ever bother about the impending danger. Everyone of those bosses, has been promoted to high appointments, outside Ceylon in the W. H. O. The Minister himself has been promoted as Minister for Scientific research. Even if he does not understand this subject, he will soon grasp it and qualify for further promotion.

This Ministry did not have the initiative or the originality, the push or the administrative ability to take stock of the situation early enough and act quickly to save the country. This Ministry did not believe in taking disciplinary measures, against officers for inefficiency, neglect of duty or insubordination, etc

Even at this very late stage, fortunately for Ceylon, every officer, except the permanent Secretary, responsible for the present calamity, has gone out of the Island or retired. This Island is struggling to keep its head above water, and the Malaria epidemic has almost drowned it.

Now the country has to spend millions, to save the country from economic disaster, at a time, when the country's coffers are depleted. Is it surprising, that the present Government with all its good intentions is losing ground? Recently we read in the papers that a man who stole 2 eggs worth fifty cents was sentenced to imprisonment. What is punishment to all those responsible for the spread of Malaria, for involving the country into several millions of rupees, for impeding the food drive and for damning the present Government in the eyes of the whole World.

The Prime Minister should take quick and drastic steps to get rid of everyone, big or small, big especially, if he cannot come up to expectation, and perform his functions efficiently thoroughly and quickly, in the best interests of our Island.

CHALLENGE AT CHANKANAI

On another occasion we were reluctantly compelled to comment on the crusade of a hundred Buddhist Priests to the North for the declared purpose of restoring harmony in that area. Now again we are unable to refrain from making similar observations after ascertaining the facts about the visit of a few Buddhist Priests to the spot where caste groups are engaged in a sustained commotion.

Mahatma Gandhi once undertook the hazardous task of travelling on foot in Bengal to restore calm after a calamitous rioting between Hindus and Muslims. Gaadhiji, a Hindu, undertook the task of organising along with Muslim Leaders the means for harmony to be reestablished. And there was weight and meaning in that mission.

At Chankanaï the circumstances are quite different. Neither there nor elsewhere in the Peninsula has there been a wave of organised rioting between the people of one caste and those of another. There were some instances of cruelty and violence as a result of the misguided enthusiasm of a certain section of Hindus calling themselves depressed and the misinformed resistance of another section. These clashes do occur and had occurred in the past not only at Chankanaï but even in other places in other countries for similar reasons. The tempo of the

frenzy of the people gradually lessened and finally the necessary climate was available for harmony to be restored. Representatives of the warring groups could have, if left to themselves, solved the problems without much ado.

At the crucial juncture there arrived at the trouble shorn area political agents for the determined object of making matters worse so that communist propaganda might be successfully carried out. The leader of the Peking Wing of the Communist Party who by the unfortunate accident of having been born a Tamil has sufficient knowledge of the weakness of the people in being easily swayed by promises, found the situation very much inviting and immediately made his appearance there to make matters worse for both groups. Finding the going good the puppet of Peking politics cordially invited the red-liner of the Sri Lanka Freedom Party, Mr. S. D. Bandaranaike, to make the best use of the situation in furtherance of the avowed object of Communists the sowing of the seeds of suspicion and strife. And on the wake of the visit of these Marxists of the Mao-mould some Buddhist Bhikku arrogated to themselves the authority to deal with a situation that had nothing to do with either Buddhism or Buddhist Priests. It is appropriate here to find out whether any Buddhist Priest had visited the scenes of communal riots during 1956 and launched a mission of love and service. There was the horrifying instance of a Hindu Priest having been burnt to death in the very premises of a Hindu Temple; and no Buddhist Priest made his appearance at the place of cruelty. The communal riots of those black days were put down by the Army and the Police and none else.

The Buddhist Bhikkus who planned this program of peace-making should have sought the acquiescence of the leaders of the clashing coteries at Chankanaï or to be more precise should have awaited invitation from the representatives of the two warring groups. Behind the back of the true representatives of the people of the area the Buddhist Priests had arranged for a conference to bring about calm in the area and had made everyone take a suspicious view of their activities.

the political set-up of this country and cannot be considered ideal peace-makers particularly in the North and the East. oil will be really little more than a glorified local governmental body and cannot be compared to a state legislature in a federal set-up. Re-question of removal of social disabilities it is not the Federal politician but a big govt. official - viz - the G. A. Jaffna who is scoring Federalist leadership has proved ineffective so much so that prominent S. L. F. P. - Coalitionists have made moves (with what success I do not know) to capture support in Jaffna. In short there is a gap in the leadership available to Jaffna Tamils which, unless the Tamils carefully take stock of their position, will be filled by individuals who are merely anti-U. N. P but not pro-Tamil. It can also be noted that what the Tamils achieved through Federalists was got partly through agitation by Tamil Congress leaders as well. Harbour developments, a University conducting courses in Tamil, better employment opportunities for educated Tamil youths, a non-persecutory policy towards Tamil Govt. servants not proficient in Sinhala, and more land in Tamil areas under the plough (or should I say tractor) are some of our needs. There is no need for a Federal set up to obtain these. I feel the Tamils will do well to rally once again under the Tamil Congress as they did in 1947 and provide better incentive for Mr. G. G. Ponnampalam and other Tamil Congress leaders to take intelligent action on our behalf. Those Tamils still clinging to Federalist ideas out of sentimental regard for Federalist leaders should learn from the politically conscious young Tamils and call upon Federalist leaders to reorganise their lines of action. Again if alliance with the U. N. P is to give us only what Mr. S. W. R. D. Bandaranaike would give were he to be alive (with or without alliance), why continue with this alliance? I am of the opinion that a revitalised Tamil Congress can give us all the leadership we need and will also function more effectively for the betterment of the Tamil community. Will fellow Tamils take note?
