## "A SOCIAL LAMENT"!

(By SABARATNASINGHE KUMARAKULASINGAM B. A.)

During colonial times the "Sootsmen of the North" dominated the Govt. service in Ceylon, provided clerks and stationmasters for Malaysia and Singapore and made farming pay in Jaffna, without the prop of a guaranteed price scheme. Jaffna schools were among the best in the Island. For the most part the Jaffna man spent his lifetime in Jaffna itself and a young Jaffna Tamil was not averse to following the hereditary occupation of his caste group. The majority of Jaffna Tamils in Colombo allowed western influences to by-pass them while a few of those who made Colombo their home town like the famous "Saravanamuttu" set standards which even the white men envied. The younger members of families of those times respected and obeyed not only parents and teachers but elderly neighbours and relatives as well. The boy who ventured beyond the front gate while his father was seated in the verandah was a hero to his sisters. The older women-folk (literate or illiterate) backed by the more senior girls of the family denied themselves comforts (even food at times) so that others of the family may progress. Career women were far and few between and working men and women spent little on themselves and helped their families along. A boy who passed the London Matriculation or the S. S. C. had no difficulty in getting a job. Food and manufactured goods (mainly imported) were cheap and Black-market dealing was unknown. There was poverty but the Jaffna man never allowed material want to kill his spirit. He did not maintain standards beyond his means with the idea of showing off to others and was not averse to making full use of Palmyrah products. Religion was taken very seriously and the Brah-

min had an honoured place in society. Homeliness, quiet simplicity, and spontaneous sympathy towards fellow humans in difficulties were some of the more attractive features of this society. On the whole life was more balanced and leisurely.

But what do we find today? Speed, self-advertisement and social competition at family level are the order of the day. Good neighbourliness has come to mean supplementing one's resources with what can be sponged off one's neighbours. Education is free but the school going child is a family "Status Symbol" and is over pampered at home while at school things like automatic promotion assure him or her of some routine academic progress at least. Teenage rowdiness has reached the proportions of a social disease. The career woman has come to stay but one is unable to understand the urge in elderly women to put up social airs in competition with the young ones. Family life has degenerated into being little more than a convenient arrangement forced by the necessity to live together. There is more money in Jaffna and greater willingness to spend than ever before but advertisements seem to set the pattern for living standards and expenses. Life has become commercialised in all its aspects and all over there is a craze for modernisation at any cost and even rural Jaffna is infected with snobbery arising out of possession of gadgets and similar manufactured goods. Farming is no longer a way of life but a profit enterprise. There is plenty of education and printed matter but men of worth are hard to come by. The unscrupulous trader who amasses wealth is hero worshipped for it. Society is more egalitarian but the newly liberated sections

are groping in the dark without proper social direction. Religion is playing a smaller part in moulding life and outlook than before. The Jaffna man has lost his built in attitudes and traits which even if they made him the target of Colombo society's jokes, enabled him to live within his means and hold his own against other sections of Ceylonese society. Recent political developments have made him feel that he is a second class citizen in the land of his birth and many Jaffna Tamils are unable to utilize their talents for the betterment of themselves and the country at large. Where do we Jaffna Tamils go from here?

We cannot live in isolation from the rest of the island and cannot avoid contact with those passing through our home areas and a certain degree of modernisation is inevitable and essential for our progress but we do not destroy what is good and useful in Jaffna man's traditional way of life in the process. In satisfying our food wants we should not be ashamed to make use of what nature has generously given (I am referring to Palmyrah products.) We must see to it all this education and material improvement produces a better class of Jaffna Tamils with a high degree of socio-religious culture. Culture has been defined as mental refinement and without this no man is worthy of respect of fellow men. Religious instruction in schools should not be merely a burden on a student's memory but should enlighten his or her soul as well. Both old and young should learn to be more sober in dress, more sensible in spending habits, and learn to live together not in a spirit of jealousy and competition as they do now, but more amicably as joint inheritors of a socio-religious legacy which produced men of the calibre of Sri Arumuga Navalar, Sir Pon Ramanathan, Sir Ratanajothi Saravnamuttu, and Dr P. S., to name only a few. The

## THE HOLY ASH

(K. V. A. SARMA)

All who belong to Saiva Religion are called Saivites. The chief distinguishing symbol of the Saivites is the holy ash and it is the first of the three Saiva symbols. The other two are Rudrakham and Sree Panchaksharam. The Holy Ash is mentioned as "Vibhocthi" in Sanskrit and "Thiruneeru" in Tamil. All Saivites must not fail to wear the Holy Ash at least on the forehead. The glory and greatness of Vibhocthi is such that they cannot be expressed adequately in a few words. But anyhow all Hindus especially Saivites are bound to know the facts about the Holy Ash and how to make it.

Ash is the residue of any combustible substance. It is the final remains of any burnt out matter and it cannot be converted into any other form. The Creator of the universe, the Prarabrahma which the Saivites praise as Prameshwaran is the only one who wears the Holy Ash all over his body for the benefit of the whole universe. Hence the Holy Ash is the symbol of the God Siva. Each and every Saiva family who wear it must also know how to prepare and preserve the Holy Ash.

Cow is a domestic animal which gives us milk

and cow dung. It is the main support of all Hindus. Cowdung is a rich manure is a rich nature, an effective disinfectant and the most valuable matter which gives us the Holy Ash. Pure cowdung is preserved, mixed with husks of paddy, made into plates are heaped into a kiln with husks of paddy and burnt at least for three days till the plates become pure white in colour. Then the block of white ash has to be preserved in new pots made of clay or in big jars.

The name "Vibhocthi" means great wealth. All other kinds of wealth we earn perish, but "Vibhocthi" is the only wealth which is immortal or imperishable. So that it is divine and brings divinity to all who wear it.

Vethas, Agamas, Upanishaths and Puranas describe the holiness and usage of the Thiruneeru elaborately in many ways. The four famous monks Appar, Sambanthar, Sundarar and Manickavasagar of Saiva Religion have mentioned the greatness of the Holy Ash in their worthy songs known as Thevarams and Thiruvachagams. One of them is as follows:—

Selfishness, social jealousy and vanity must be banished from our midst above all we must turn ourselves into more intelligent voters so much so that power seeking career politicians will have to improve themselves or retire into political obscurity.
