The movement to celebrate this great centenary in Ceylon is very praiseworthy—Many countries in the world are making arrangements to do so and it is fitting that Ceylon too which is so close to the Mahatma's country in many ways and which has been enriched by his life and services does likewise. In so doing, there are some important factors among others which could be given special attention to—Firstly, the Mahatma's life and ideals could be held up as an example to improve ourselves individually in all spheres of activity, viz: religion, nationalism, and statecraft, ethics, social conduct, economic welfare, duty to society and country, and duty to humanity and all living beings. Secondly, the occasion could be utilized for all communities and races and creeds to further the cause of mu-

tual help, toleration, national harmony and unity. Thirdly, in relation to other countries, Ceylon could take advantage of the spirit involved and engendered by the celebrations to foster greater co-operation with them based on the principles of co-existence and non-alignment and open diplomacy, all of which ideals were dear to the Mahatma's heart. Fourthly, considering the fact that Ceylon has many cultural and religious and other ties with India, an improvement in the relationship between India and Ceylon could be sought after and the already existing fund of good will augmented without detriment to existing goodwill between Ceylon and other countries.

It is trusted that suitable and comprehensive programs will be drawn by various associations and each association carries out its program and at the same time joins other associations and the general public in having a common program as well in addition. For the purpose of implementing a common All Ceylon program without prejudice to the efforts of individual organisations an All Ceylon ad hoc organisation fully representing all communities and all sections of the people and all parties would be very helpful. High personages including his Excellency the Governor General, the Prime Minister, the Leader of the Opposition (Mrs. Bandaranaike), the Chief Justice, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, Parliamentary and other leaders from various walks of life, all combined, could in conjunction with religious dignitaries of all religions, constitute a worthy machinery to give a lead to the country in this matter, to pay tribute to the cherished memory of a sublime

TAMIL MAGAZINES

Sir,

There is an urgent need for a Tamil weekly magazine which can match South Indian publications like Ananda Vikatan, Kalki and Kalai magal (a monthly) in size, quality of contents and price. There is a growing demand for good reading matter and factors like Free Education, higher incomes and modernisation have contributed to the spread of the reading habit in all parts of Jaffna and this need is satisfied more by publications from across Paik Straits than by Ceylonese efforts. Soon exchange quota cuts will lead to further curtailment of import of foreign magazines. There is a wealth of local writing talent languishing for want of suitable outlets for expression and recognition and an ever-growing world of trade and industry with advertising needs. However Jaffna will always have its quota of readers who show it off with borrowed reading matter and if this class of semi-literate parasites can be convinced that money spent on good reading matter is money well spent, it would go a long way towards support for a local magazine venture.

I have gone through random issues of two monthlies published in Colombo which cater

mainly for the teenage reading public. However there are pioneering efforts and the more recent issues of them show improvements in the quality of get up and one should not grudge reader support for these in the form of occasional issue purchases. The young Editors of these publications, which are good in patches, may have their own problems connected with the economics and technicalities of magazine production but as reader I am only concerned with the quality of the end product.

We may not have men like S. S. Vasani or Sathasivam in our midst to edit and produce or a Rajaji to give us those brilliant comments as he does in Kalki but we live in Jaffna, a recognised homeland of good Tamil. We should go all out to have a Tamil weekly magazine which besides providing entertaining and decent reading matter will also help to improve our command of Tamil. There can be more than one such publication and I hope by the time the Education Department of Ceylon celebrates its centenary (in 1969) Jaffna will have a well circulating Tamil weekly magazine.

STARTING A STORM IN A TEA-KIOSK!

The tea-cup acquired a place in the book of idiomatic proverbs by the persistence of prankish mischief-mongers in employing their skill to disturb the composure of a decoction of tea-leaves. And now the tea-kiosk has been promised a similar recognition by political Bhikkus who are on a propaganda mission in the Peninsula. Normally the tea cup does not have the capacity to create a little effervescence. But the tea-kiosk or even a tea party can produce that stormy weather in which the effervescing effects of spirited revellers find pleasure. These conditions exist and can never cease to exist in that variety of inns of entertainment conveniently called tea kiosks and do not require the spiritual assistance of political priests for starting socialistic storms. However, we wish to suggest to these determined Bhikkus, a handful in number who, we can confidently assert, do not represent Buddhist opinion in this matter, that their yearning for helping the needy could be profitably directed to certain matters that require immediate attention.

Criminal activities that speedily tend to disrupt the country and destroy its culture have reached a climax and require to be stopped at any cost. In the alarming extent of homicides — fratricides and similar killings of kith and kin have reached a formidable scale. Highway robberies and kidnapping are rapidly increasing. The base of these atrocious happenings is the unchecked illicit manufacture of alcoholic ales and the spread of the drink habit like the stubborn growth of Salvinia. It is reported that at a recent meeting of the Ceylon Congress of Religions the question of electing a patron from the ranks of the Hindus arose. It was suggested that as the Hindus were not an organised body there was no head for the group and the election was put off. Later on Swami Prematmanandaji of the Ramakrishna Mission was elected Patron. The Swami is a good Hindu, one of the best products of Jaffna but does he represent the Hindus of Jaffna and Ceylon who follow the Saiva Siddhantha faith and have their own mode of worship? We are not sure what this Congress of Religions stands for, but if a true representative of the Hindus of Ceylon has to be consulted there is no organisation more authentic for the purpose than the Saiva Paripalana Sabha, an incorporated body which has existed from 1889 and represented the Saiva faith with credit in the past. There is no one better than the President of the Saiva Paripalana Sabha to represent the views of the Saivas.

The history of Saivism is full of crises. One such crisis is the threat of the minority community to embrace Buddhism. We have no cause to find fault with the Buddhist Sangha if there is a genuine demand and desire to change their faith. Is the rank and file supporting the move or is it the selfish desire of a few self-appointed leaders to edge a few teaching jobs in the schools? The thinking section of the group are still Hindus and wish to remain so. In the last century quite a number became rice Christians. A few may become Rice Buddhists now. They would have the Hindu tradition behind them. The Saivite leaders need not get
