Bringing To Bear On All Sections Better Sense Of Responsibility

Winning 91 seats by the principal party in itself could have made any ambitious party leader constitute a Cabinet on exclusive lines; but Premier Srimavo Bandaranaike however chose to keep herself strictly to the policies declared by her and selected Ministers to represent every Here was statesmanship of a high allying party order and the promise of a broad-based Cabinet.

Without losing time in deliberations the Coalition Premier immediately recommended the appointment of a Minority Tamil to the House of Representatives. This was a very praiseworthy step which previous Governments had ignored. In the very business of setting up a new Government Premier Srimavo Bandaranaike has given proof of her intention to translate into action all that she and her party had been promising during the past few months.
