## MORE MINISTRIES TO MEET NEW METHOD OF ADMINISTRATION

### Bringing To Bear On All Sections Better Sense Of Responsibility

Winning 91 seats by the principal party in itself could have made any ambitious party leader constitute a Cabinet on exclusive lines; but Premier Srimavo Bandaranaike however chose to keep herself strictly to the policies declared by her and selected Ministers to represent every allying party. Here was statesmanship of a high order and the promise of a broad-based Cabinet.

Without losing time in deliberations the Coalition Premier immediately recommended the appointment of a Minority Tamil to the House of Representatives. This was a very praiseworthy step which previous Governments had ignored. In the very business of setting up a new Government Premier Srimavo Bandaranaike has given proof of her intention to translate into action all that she and her party had been promising during the past few months.

POLITICAL PARTIES AND THE PRESS

With the return to power of Mrs. Srimavo Bandaranaike in a memorable and mighty victory at the 1970 polls, the question of the relationship between the press and the Government is being asked and answered by everyone interested in the subject of journalism. The real situation is not so startling as to create unnecessary alarm of any direct action by the Government to exercise full control over the press. What is agitating some of those who are intimately connected with the publication of newspapers in this Island is the prick of conscience that keeps on reminding them - the few - that journalism has been deliberately allowed to drift towards creating sensationalism with a view to seeking support for political parties. Election to a seat in the House of Representatives has all along depended on the performance by newspapers for and against contestants. The emphasis has been so overlaid that the voice of the newspapers appeared to become more powerful than ever the candidates themselves. Reports of speeches, of news relating to the cross over from one party to another, caricatures and other exciting features collectively functioned to sway the mind of the voter even if such publications were based on untruths and half truths, falsehood and fabrications. Thus there has been a degeneration in some instances in the conduct of newspapers. It is this situation that requires to be remedied. It is not enough that there is sufficient provi-

sion in the Ceylon Penal Code for punishing mischievous journalists who cause the publication of defamatory statements or pictures tending to disturb the peace of the land or give libellous opinions of supposed facts. Slanderous statements during periods of Parliamentary Election often mar the mind of the masses in favour of or against some leader or party. These are all risks that are unnecessarily and unknowingly taken by over-enthusiastic journalists who become involved in political partisanship losing complete sight of the code of conduct that governs writers. Said Cicero "we should never so entirely avoid danger as to appear irresolute and cowardly. But, at the same time, we should avoid unnecessarily exposing ourselves to danger, than which nothing can be more foolish."

The danger of becoming dragged into a criminal charge of defamation always lurks behind the care-free journalist who goes all out to make his readers intoxicated with the spirit of sensationalism. Writing on the canons of journalism, a society of foreign newspapers observed thus

"A newspaper should not invade private rights or feeling without sure warrant of public right as distinguished from public curiosity."

The time at the disposal of the censoring staff of a newspaper is certainly limited particularly in view of the competition among publishers to release reports at the earliest. Yet the law of the land is such that inadvertence or carelessness can be pleaded as a reasonable excuse. The peril of any publication becoming the subject matter of a suit for criminal libel must haunt the journalist even if such a feeling would be tormenting. However the cautious approach should not be such as to justify Benjamin Franklin's witticism "If all the printers were determined not to print anything till they were sure it would offend no body, there would be little printed."

The Coalition Government, we are sure, will not curb the freedom of the press, the freedom construed in the dignified form of patriotic effort. But the new Government would and must set up a Press Council that will be capable of cautioning mischief-mongers and miscreants who abuse the sacred office of journalism and bringing them to book so that impurity in the

sphere of newspapers might be cleansed advising the Government in true patriotic fashion.

We are proud to reiterate that we belong to the old order of journalism in which true knowledge and lofty culture play the primary part. The art of writing is as old as the most ancient achievement of man. The grammar and the literature of every language constitute a cultural background of intellectual integrity and moral magnificence. Hence no writer could ever err even unwittingly. The 'Hindu Organ' was established by religious leaders of exceptional ability, high thinking and noble living. The purpose of this newspaper has been to help the people understand the problems of life, material and spiritual, in the accepted tradition of enlightenment that formed the cultural heritage of the nation as flowing from the Scriptures, the Thirumurai, the 'hastras' the Paranas and the Epics. Our duty has always been solemn and devoted to disciplined thinking and instructive writing. And this treasured tradition will be maintained.

PATHETIC FLIGHT OF PERU

Fifty thousand perished in the worst destructive fury of an earthquake in Peru. Here was a war on a peace-loving country by nature in revolt. A whole nation has been reduced to ruins. Horrors there had been but none so horrifying as the Peruvian devastation. Humanity stands shocked. The rest of the world has to rush to the rescue of this disaster-hit country where several towns and villages have been completely destroyed. Aid must be in the form of supply of food and also medical attention that is necessary to prevent the outbreak of epidemics.

(Continued from page 1) He was educated in Jaffna College and was employed as a licensed fiscal surveyor under the late Sir William Twycroft. He came to Malaya in 1885 at the request of Mr. Ford Waitlingam (father of Sir Waitlingam Doraisamy) who was Inspector of Roads in Singapore. He traced almost all the existing roads in Negri Sembilan (Malaysia) and surveyed tobacco, gambier and pepper plantations, the manure lands Goleba belonging to the Straits Trading Company, the original site of Port Dunson and Goleba which were virgin jungle and unmarked with several roads and buildings. # SAIVA SIDDANTHA LITERATURE

( Sivagnanabotham  
- T. CANAGARAYAR )

Saiva Siddhanta is a philosophy of Saiva religion. Siva worship began from time immemorial among the Tamils of the ancient land now called South India, being the northern portion of the submerged continent—Kumari Kandam, now the basin of the Pacific Ocean. Saiva Agamas were produced by ancient sages called Arrivars or Siddars (mystics) and most of them were lost in the deluge, and what remained were translated into Sanscrit, and preserved. That Siddhanta is based on Agama can be testified by the meaning of the word Agama. A = Pasa, ga = Pasu, ma = Pati. Agama is a book treating of the three centre, verities, matter, Soul and God. The sages known as Santana Kuravar of Kailaya tradition, taught the substance of the Agamas unto the people. Siddhanta philosophy is founded on the Jnana Kandam, called Agamantam of the Agamas.

Vidhyesar, the first of the Santana Kuravars taught the Agamas to Anandadevar who in turn handed down the Agamas to Seikanda Rudrar who handed the same to Nandi Peruman. Nandi Peruman instructed Sanatkumara Munivar who in turn instructed Satyajnanadarisani who instructed Paramjothy Munivar. Saint Paramjothy Manivar instructed Meykandar (discoverer of Truth) of Tiruvennai Nallur in the essence of Sivagamas. Saint Meykandar produced the first philosophical book called Siva Jnana Bodham in Tamil which contains twelve aphorisms with a short summary and commentaries thereon. It is an original work and not a translation of Raurava Agamas, though it is based on the Agamantam.

The oldest works embodying Siddhanta ideas and the philosophy are "Tholkappiam" and "Tirumandiram" by Saint Tiru Mular (200-300 A. D.). In the third century Saint Manikkavasagar composed the sacred outpourings of Tiruvagasam a work which has no equal in its expressions of love and heartfelt inner feelings of deep piety and faith in God. None in the world can listen to the hymns without the depths of his soul being stirred (his deepest impulse being

moved) to extremes of feeling, of being himself immersed in the overwhelming love of the Supreme Absolute.

Saint Appar, Saint Tirujanasampanthar in the seventh century and Saint Sundarar in the early ninth century who followed the tenets of Saiva Siddhanta Philosophy, upon realisation of the spiritual Truth, worshipped Lord Siva in all the sacred Temples and sang hymns of praise unto Him in each temple, reciting their devotional experiences in their lives and the Spiritual bliss they obtained, and pouring forth from their hearts the inner feelings of love unto God. These hymns collected by Saint Nambi Andar Nambi are contained in the first seven sections of the canonical literature called Tirumurai.

Tiruvagasam forms the eighth section of the Tirumurai. The ninth section is composed of poems called Tiruvissaya sung by nine authors. Tirumandaram is a work of 3000 poems by Tirumalar. This is the tenth section; and the eleventh section is a collection of forty poems by twelve authors including Pattinathu Pillai and Nambyandar Nambi.

The philosophy of Siddhanta in those hymns as well as in the Tevarams of the three Nayanmars above referred to Nambi Andar Nambi who collected the Tevarams into the first seven sections lived during the eleventh century Vagisar is the author of Jnansmirtham which embodies the Jnana Kandam or Agamantam of Saiva Agamas. It treats of God Soul and pasam and their attributes and of the means or ways of obtaining release from Pasam Vagisar lived during the reign of Rajathirajan II (1163-1179)

Kalladam is a work replete with Saiva Siddhanta ideas, written by Kalladar in the sixth century. The literature of the last academy affords ample testimony to the antiquity of Saiva worship in India as a whole and particularly in South India.

Tirukoral by Tiru Vallava Nayanar a classical work, called the Tamil Vedam, contains ideas of the living philosophy of

Periapuranam or Tiru Thondar Puranam is another important work composed by Saint Seklar of the twelfth century and it contains the history of the lives of seventy two Saiva devotees called Nayanmars. The poems contained therein describe the lives of the saints and are a form of prayer unto Lord Siva.

The above works abound in expressions of love and devotion unto Lord Siva, as different forms of prayer.

There are fourteen works of scientific or philosophical nature and they are:

1. Thiruvundiyar, is a short and cryptic work of forty five verses written by Tiruvyalur Uyyavanda Deva Nayanar in 1147 A. D. It treats of God, Soul, and the world, and their attributes, of emancipation of Soul, and of the means or ways of obtaining redemption. This work expresses his experiences, as they occurred to him and does not follow a logical sequence.
