Thiru Gnanasambanthamoorthy Swamigal

Thirugnanasambanthamoorthy Swamigal one of the four illustrious saints who added to the lustre and the propagation of Vedas and Agamas was born in Seergali which is a village near Chidambaram and which was known by eleven other names in times of old. His father a staunch and broad-minded Brahmin was called Sivapathaviruthayar and his mother was called Pakavathiyar. The ancestors of his father and his mother were for many generations nurtured in the salient precepts of the Saiva Agamas Saiva culture and traditions. At that time the Chola country was in the grip of Jainist culture and learning. The greatness of the Saiva religion and the knowledge of the ingredient precepts of the Saiva religion were on the wane. The pujahs in Saiva temples and the greatness of Holy Ash and Rudthiradsba were discarded. Sivapathaviruthayar and Pakavathiyar who performed immense penance in the previous births worshipped Sivaperuman and Umathevi at Seerkali temple with all their heart and all their piety, devotion and steadfast dedication. Sivapathaviruthayar and his wife were of one mind and one temperament. They surrendered themselves to the feet of God and evoked the Grace of the Almighty to bless them with a son who could stem the tide of Jainist culture which was eating into the vitals of the Saiva culture of the people Sivaperuman who resides in the hearts of all his devotees with all His Brilliance and who rules the destinies of one and all granted their praiseworthy request. It was on a Thirvathirai day that a precocious child with all his brilliance and potentialities was born to Pakavathiyar. His birth signified the

dawn of an era of Shaiva renaissance of Vedas and Siva-Agamas and the ushering in of an era of the birth of saints, poets, sages, musicians and artists. It also signifies the era of the regeneration of Shaiva culture. With all the accumulated penance, Sivapuniam and super-human powers, the child grew up and became the cynosure of the parents and of those who lived in the neighbourhood of his holy residence.

Thirugnanasambanthar was three years old when one day he accompanied his father to Seergali temple in spite of his father's repeated request to stay back at home. Sivapathaviruthayar his father left his beloved son on the step leading to the sacred Theertha-kulam. The father was absorbed in prayer and bath according to Vedic rites. In the meanwhile the child began to cry out of loneliness or separation from the Father of Fathers (God) whom he in his previous birth served as a fervent devotee in Mount Kailash. At that opportune moment Lord Siva with Umai the Mother of Mothers descended in the heavens and gave the child His Holy Darsan. Umatheviyar gave the child Her divine milk in a golden bowl and asked the child to drink and stopped him from crying. Sambanthar's father came out of the tank and seeing lips full of milk took a stick nearby and asked the child who gave him the milk. The precocious child pointed to the heavens and said that Umatheviyar gave him milk. The father did not see that rare brilliant sight. Gnanasambanthar sang a Thevara Pathikam beginning with the words "தோடெய செவியன் விடையேறி". The child had a thrilling experience felt in all his

nerves, bones throughout the body. With the drinking of Umai's milk the child became completely free from the clutches of Maya and there dawned in him an unsurpassable wisdom and Gnanam. He became a repository of all learning and culture without the least mark of schooling. Who on earth had this rare privilege and Grace to receive the milk of Umai, the Mother of mothers. Such an event of paramount importance never took place in any land. It was Tamil Nadu alone which gave birth to such a saint of a rare phenomenon. Gnanasambanthar spoke like an angel. Words of wisdom began to flow from his divine lips and a new era dawned in the Tamil country. By his birth poetry, music and drama began to flourish; devotees, sages and saints gathered round in groups for prayer in temples. Even a tinge of Maya was rooted out from him. All his mundane desires were annihilated and his only thought was on God. Sambanthar became completely absorbed in devotion. His words were oracles and his deeds were divine. He became God's vehicle of all good actions and heavenly thoughts. His thoughts were circling in South Maya Pranam. He saw God in everything man or bird or beast or insect or blade of grass or petal of a flower or an atom. He saw that the universe functioning at God's command. He saw that the whole universe is a puppet in the hands of the

The Rudraksha-Jabala Upanishad

They get reminded if they see any one who wears sacred ashes on his forehead and Rudraksha beads (round his neck); they feel delighted when they see such persons, they rejoice pondering over their devotedness (to the Lord). they look at them with great joy they worship the Lord steadfastly contemplating on His Greatness without allowing their minds to waver with thoughts of this god and that god,—such are the saints in whose hearts we can see the well-planted (changeless) Pillar (God) of Tirukanrapoor.

The Rudraksha-Jabalam is another of the Pancha-Jabalopanishads. It is attached to the Samavaadam and is generally counted as one of the 108 important Upanishads. It speaks, as indicated by its name of the Rudraksham (உருத்திராக்ஷம்), its origin and significance. The Rudraksham, as we had occasion to mention in a previous article and as clearly indicated in the above quoted Devaram Hymn, is one of the two outward symbols of a religious man; the Vibhuti or Tirumaeu (sacred ash) which is indicative of Pasatchayam (பாசஞ்சயம்), the burning or removal of Malam (impurity) and the Rudraksham (sacred bead) indicative of the bestowal of Divine Grace. The word Rudraksham literally means Rudra's eye,

and the bead is so called as, according to the Puranic story, it arose out of the tears of compassion that fell from the Lord's eyes when He heard of the woes of the Devas who were vanquished and oppressed by the Asuras (or evil spirits) of the Tripuras (or triple cities indicative of the three kinds of Pasam, Anavam, Karmam and Maya) உருத்திராக்ஷமாவது தேவர்கள் திரிபுரத்தகரர்க ளாலே தங்களுக்கு நிகழ்ந்த துன்பத்தை விண்ணப்பித்து செய்த கோண்ட பொழுது திருக்கைவாசபதியுடைய முன்று திருக்கண்களிலி ன்றும் பொழிந்த நீரிற்றோன் றிய மணியாம் ... உருத்திராக்ஷதாரணம் சிவபெருமா னுடைய திருக்கண்ணிற் றோன்றும் திருஅருட் பேற் றிற்கு அறிவுறி, thus we read in Saiva Vinavidai.

There is another Upanishad which deals with the same subject attached to the Rig Vadam called Akshamalika Upanishad, literally the Upanishad relating to garlands, (Malika, மாலிகை, மாலி) of eyes (Aksha) or beads. This is also included as another of the 108 important Upanishads. It seems hardly necessary to add here that these garlands of Rudraksha beads are highly venerated and worn by adherents of other religions too. It is used, for instance, by followers of the prophet Mohamed in telling their prayers. Apart from its religious significance, the wearing of the Rudraksham is said to have certain salutary effects on the person of the wearer. It serves as a sort of talisman.

The Rudraksha-Jabala Upanishad is in the form of sermons by the Lord Kalagni-Rudran to the Rishies Bhusudra, Sarast-kumarar and others who approached the Lord on different occasions and prayed for enlightenment as to the origin of the Rudraksham, its different varieties, their nature, the rules of Rud-

Sivaperuman blessed him with a golden Thalam (காளம்) with the letters of Panchadacharam inscribed on it. He received a gift of பொற்கிழி and gave it to his father to perform yagnam. From the ashes of Poompavai He made her revive into a full-fledged divine girl of matchless beauty and magnificence.

raksha Dharanam (உருக் திராக்ஷ தாரணம் wearing of Rudrakshas), the benefits that accrue to the wearer, &c. The following is a summary of the Lord's replies. We shall be as brief as possible and give the salient points only.

The Lord said: when for the purpose of destroying the Tripuras, I closed (? opened) my eyes, from them fell drops of water in the ground and became the Rudraksha for the salvation of all (sruti 3).—Then there are also the following slokas regarding this: I closed my eyes for the period of a thousand celestial years. From the closed eyes, drops of water fell down on the ground. The tear drops assumed vegetable form and grew into big Rudraksha trees for the salvation of the devotees (sruti 6).—In the world they say that the Rudrakshas came forth from Rudra's eyes. At the time of involution, Rudra closed his eye of destruction (the upper or third eye) after finishing the function of destruction. From that eye came forth the Rudraksham and hence is it said to be of the nature of Rudra's eye. It is also called Bhasma Jyoti (பஸ்ம சோதி), the light of the sacred ash (sruti 42).
