### COMMON CAUSE

The people are being called upon to solve not a political problem but a vital question that needs immediate attention. Adversity has visited us. The country is being confronted with a condition of adverse fortune the force of which is something similar to the impact of distress by an act of God.

The introduction of the system of subsidy to relieve the financial stress on the people has proved to be a fatal misadventure by statesmen of the past. The very idea of enabling the people enjoy education free was inexplicable, particularly in this country that had broken the bond of alien domination only a few decades ago. This captivating term 'free' suddenly caught the imagination of all political parties and their leaders with the result that every Party in Power wanted to go a step further than that taken by the previous Government and to make the voters feel that ultimately everything would be supplied to them free of cost. Today the magnitude of this method of political misadventure is seen in the miserable state of the country in its economic condition.

The cost of subsidies in the form of the free pro-

vision of rice, medical facilities and educational needs have mounted high, and above the cloudy summit of Pedrutalagala as if the sky were the limit.

After several years of this self-imposed extra expenditure, the Authorities compelled by circumstances, have begun to consider what ways and means could be devised to meet this menacing situation.

The people in the enjoyment of an instant concession could not become aware of the ultimate implications that followed the subsidies that were so very willingly given by the Government. The deficit in the economy of the country had to be accounted for by way of additional or increased taxes, levies and duties all of which tended to increase the burden on the people.

Now that the limit of endurance has been reached both the Government and the people have been forced to adopt measures to find a way out of the impasse. Sacrifice is the one answer to this alarming situation.

There are several items of unnecessary expenditure that are eventually increased by the people and the administration in the form of entertainments, receptions, felicitations, tours, visits to foreign countries and similar undertakings. In the noble cause of the country's welfare let us cry 'halt' to such extravagance as a first step in the march forward.

The poor and the well-to-do all have to bear the brunt bravely in this haunting hour of financial crisis. The rich and the millionaires must, however, be compelled to contribute their share to the country's coffers. When that is done the common man may not groan under the sacrifices he has been called upon to make.

The removal of the Tree-tax system, a step long over due, is however, a boon to the people of Jaffna though the lesser evil of taverns will re-appear.

The five portals are blocked and guarded and the usurpers are dethroned and subjected they are now at his beck and call and this is the death of the senses.

The power that grows unconsciously within now enables the aspirant to fight out the rest of the battle with renewed vigour. It is said that those who control senses achieve a conquest unparalleled;

“He with firmness curbs the five restrains is seed for soil of yonder happy

plains”. Yet there is the possibility of a slip, for though our hero has left the objective world, left the world of the senses, there still stands unvanquished the arch-friend, the traitor of traitors, who can raise the world from their ashes, who can create his own objects of desire and traverse the whole universe in no time, the felon who has been collecting faces all the while the battle was raging on in the outskirts — it is the mind.

To one who has watched the vagaries of the mind, the tremendous world within will be quite apparent — how it whirls round and round, wanders hither and thither, how it constructs palaces and mansions, and lives in them, how it enjoys by itself every pleasure it needs. This world of thoughts is the curse of man, it is here that all the subtle forces work together and form his character, even his physical form is the outcome of this thought-word. It is even here the demons of lust (Kama), jealousy, avarice and the like reign.
