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THE NATIONAL LANGUAGE QUESTION

"The National Language question - linguistic problems of newly independent states", is the title of a book published recently by Oxford University Press and issued under the auspices of the Institute of Race Relations. The author is Professor R. B. Le Page, Professor of English at the University of Malaya.

It is not intended to give a review of the book in the usual manner. A mention of the five chapters and some words of the Professor would help to give some idea of the scope of the book and the relevance for us. In the introduction the author says: "It is generally recognised that the language problems facing new nations are not in themselves new by any means; parallels can be found from all periods of history and all parts of the world". He then goes on to say: "No attempt has been made to prescribe an answer to the problems. The book is directed to an understanding of the factors involved."

In the introduction he has another statement which interests us:

"Many people would feel that these - the political and economic questions - are the basic questions. And yet in many ways as I shall try to show in this book, the cultural questions are the most fundamental. The reason is that so many of these new states owe their frontiers to the old colonial regime which, for the motives of their own, administrative convenience, or the geography of white exploration and settlement - gave sometimes spurious unity to regions which had little otherwise to recommend them as national entities. One of the first problems therefore which the states have to resolve is whether they exist as anything more than artificial entities."

The first chapter is on the Function of Language

and he mentions three important functions. First, "as an individual grows up in or lies in a speech-community, the acquisition of the speech-habits of that community allows him to become a full member of the society, contributing his responses to the common stock in such a manner that they will be easily recognised and stimulate responses from others which he in turn can understand. He can thus identify himself with and become part of a larger unit, making his contribution to its resources and drawing from its resources." Secondly he says, "The most important function that language fulfills for the individual is that it allows him greater possibilities of self-expression than he would have without it.... Thirdly, language provides the individual with a tool for the exploration and analysis of his own conceptual processes."

The second chapter deals with "Language in Society" under the following headings:

Government and the Law

Education: Primary, Secondary and Higher Education

Religion

Culture

This chapter also makes a brief reference to the Ceylonese situation and says: "With the coming of independence the Buddhist monks sought to regain their ancient political influences, and in doing so strengthened the unwillingness of the Sinhalese generally to treat the Tamils as equal citizens... The English-speaking professional classes have generally been squeezed out. Ceylon has thus incidentally provided a reservoir of English-speaking professional men, no longer satisfied with conditions in the island, on which other developing countries have drawn to their advantage."

The third chapter is on "The Colonial Hangover"

Elders' Blessings Vital on Auspicious Occasions

Among the several Vedic commands, observance of which will result to individual welfare, one is asked to take the blessings of elders on all auspicious occasions. They are endowed with an intellect to analyse a critical situation and suggest the correct course to be adopted. Their character will be blemishless and their habits austere. The consent of such noble men is particularly important in bringing about a marriage as they will tender proper advice regarding the match. The wedding of Sri Rama and Sita as part of the Divine Drama, was arranged by Viswamitra, the king-turned sage.

In his Ramayanam discourses at West Mambalam, Manjakkudi Sri Rajagopala Sastri said, on their onward journey to Mithila, Viswamitra narrated several episodes to the Divine prince, Sri Rama and Lakshmana and at Sage Gauthma's hermitage, his wife, Ahalya, who remained under a curse, was brought back to life. This incident revealed the efficacy of chanting Sri Rama's attributes. It also highlighted the significance of the mantras uttered in marriages. Where there was a blatant violation of the prescribed rules and where short-cut methods were adopted in the rites there was bound to be some flaw and in Ahalya's case there was such a lapse.

The fifth chapter, "Conclusions," lists six factors which affect the choice of a national language, and which ought to be considered by the authorities before they take a decision. These were arrived at by "one of the working groups of the Symposium of Multilingualism held in

The creation of the Department of Education gave a certain amount of freedom. This may be considered as a starting point of the Buddhist, Hindu and Muslim revivals. The mission schools which were controlled and aided by state, obstructed the establishment of schools to propagate Buddhist, Hindu and Muslim traditions. The Portuguese destroyed the Hindu shrines and temples. Their vandalism led to destruction of Buddhist, Hindu and Muslim culture. The Dutch did not allow room for either the development of either Buddhism or Hinduism or the Buddhist or Hindu Culture. The British were more liberal. But their organised efforts suppressed the Buddhist and Hindu tradition.

The last two decades of the 19th century formed an active period of revival for both Buddhists and Hindus. Lack of active leadership was the cause for the hapless plight of the Ceylonese of that day.

The Buddhist Revival:

The Pirivena and temple schools which formally received Royal patronage from the Sinhalese kings suffered very much during the Western rule. The Kandyan Convention of 1915 gave them assistance that government will give patronage and protect Buddhism. But that assurance was never put into practice. In 1853 the British government asked the Buddhists to look after their own affairs. This ill treatment and neglected condition paved the way for Buddhist revival in the latter half of the 19th century.

Reverend Velivita Saramankara Thero was one of the Buddhist revivalists. His enthusiasm was continued by Venerable Velane Siddhartha Thero, who established the Parama Dhamma-chetiya Pirivena at Ratmalana. Two of his pupils Ven. Hikkaduwa Sri Sumanhala founded the Vidyodaya Pirivena and Ven. Ratnapala Dhammaloka founded the Vidyalandara Pirivena.

The third quarter of the 19th Century was important for religious controversies. Buddhists and Christians published controversial view points in journals, books, and newspapers against each other. Religious controversies were held publicly between Buddhist monks and Christians clergy. The famous religious controversy at Panadura may be cited as an example. In 1877 the Buddhist party led by Rev. Mohottiwatte Gunananda Thero and the Protestant party led by Rev. David de Silva took part in the controversy. This controversy was so interesting and renowned that John Capper published a full report of this controversy in a book. The book had a large circulation and found its way to Europe and America. This book was read by an American Theosophist Colonel H. S. Olcott. Olcott fought in the Northern army in the American civil war of the 1860's. Henry Steele Olcott was one of the co-founders of the "Theosophical Society of New York" in 1875. He was attracted by what was expressed in that book about Buddhism. He came to Ceylon in May 1880 and provided active leadership to Buddhists.

On 17th June 1880, the "Colombo Theosophical Society" was established with 47 members,

Sri K. Kanagarajah, Proprietor of Milk White Soap Company entertained the pilgrims at a tea party assisted by Mrs. Kanagarajah.

Mr. M. Mylvaganam, Religious Propaganda Secretary of the Sabhai proposed a vote of thanks.

Brassville in July 1962... report (not yet published). The author then mentions three possibilities and consequences:

- i) To use one or more of the indigenous languages for all purposes
- ii) To give equal status to one or more local languages and an international language.
- iii) To adopt an international language for all purposes.

He concludes: "Decisions about a national language policy are normally

made by politicians, and not by linguists; and for political reasons which may seem valid at one moment but may have lost much of their force ten years later.... Given the opportunity, however, the linguist can make his contribution to resolving problems that may arise from whatever decision has been reached. Any decision is likely to involve bilingualism for many — probably most — of the population. The linguist can carry out the basic research, describe the various languages involved in a given situation, prepare contractive studies, forecast the difficulties that speakers of one language are likely to have on learning another and guide the preparation of teaching materials which pay special attentions to these difficulties."

kinds of Saivam, viz; Pashanavadam, Bethavadam, Sivasamavadam, Sankiranthavadam, Ishwara Avikara Vadam and Sivadwaitham (or Nimitta Karana Parinama Vadam). These go to form the first or orthodox group (அசும்) and have a good deal in common with Saiva Siddhantam, the difference consisting in the delineation of the general and special characteristics of the Tri-padarthas and in matters of minor detail. On the top of these 4 X 6 (or 24) systems, (அசும், அசும்புறம், புறம் and புறம்புறம்), and covering all in its broad folds, stands Saiva Siddhantam, the system proved and finally upheld.
