SRI LANKA'S FUTURE

By S. SIVASUBRAMANIAM

The pronouncement of the Venerable Panditha Madine Passaseeka Maha Nayake Thero at the sessions of the All Ceylon Buddhist Congress at Gampola is, a very important one. He has rightly drawn the attention of the public to the greatness of the revered Maha Sangha, of Sri Lanka, which has always occupied and continues to occupy even during our so called modern era a unique place in the national life of the country, which I believe, is not occupied by any similar body in any other country. That position is rock-like. He has among other things, said that Buddhists should organise themselves well to safeguard their interests without

detriment to other denominations or sections of the people in the country. The sublime philosophy of Lord Buddha and the ideals of state craft and Religion as enunciated by Emperor Asoka who was once a Hindu and there after a Buddhist are illuminating guides for Governments and peoples. With regard to the various problems affecting the country, these are matters where the Maha Sangha could give a lead to Parliament and to the public. Parliamentary representatives both from Government and the Opposition and lay and other religious leaders from the public could confer with the Maha Sangha and try to arrive at some sound and ac-

ceptable ways of overcoming the Nation's difficulties. It is needless to mention that almost all countries are having their own problems, some of which are more serious than ours in Sri Lanka. Our leaders including the Prime Minister and the Leader of the Opposition greatly merit the co-operation of all sections of the public. It is also trusted that the leaders also on their part would welcome such co-operation and actively take steps to obtain such co-

operation. The future of our dear country depends on such close co-operation which does not seem to be evident in sufficient measure just now. Two handicaps are preventing progress namely, the Cabinet form of Government and the rigid application of the Party System both of which are unenitabable to the genius of the people of Sri Lanka, of all communities, and are positively harmful at this stage of our political evolution. Steps are neces-

sary to reduce the dead weight of these twin anachronisms if headway is to be made for the happiness of the country. The late respected leader Mr. S. W. R. D. Bandaranaike in a spirit of very great discernment suggested ways to remove them. Among Tamil leaders, Sir W. Duraismamy, Mr. K. Balasingham, Sir Arunachalam, Mahadeva, and Mr. S. Natesan (former Minister and son-in-law of Sir Ramanathan were in favour of a system of Government by Committees and were opposed to the Cabinet system. It is time that our leaders and the general public address their mind to this all important subject along with other problems.

Smoking and Your Heart

Though tobacco has been used by man for hundreds of years the greatly increased smoking of cigarettes, has been a significant development of this century. In the past 25 years to 30 years it has been shown that parallel with this increase in cigarette smoking, there has been a rapid rise in the incidence of death from coronary artery disease, lung cancer, chronic bronchitis and emphysema.

Extensive studies done in various developed countries have proved beyond any doubt that cigarette smoking plays a major role in causing these diseases.

These carefully planned and executed tests have shown that cigarette smokers as a whole, have about 30 to 50 per cent high mortality than non-smokers. The increase in mortality was shown to rise with the increasing number of cigarettes smoked.

Worst Effects

The worst effects were felt in the 45 to 55-year age group. That is when the individual is at the

peak of his career and also when his personal responsibilities are great. These studies further revealed that the effects were worse when smoking was started at an early age.

Once smoking was stopped, it was found that the mortality and morbidity rate dropped. It was further shown that smoking of pipes and cigars did not have this high mortality and morbidity rate. This difference was due to the fact that whereas cigarette smokers inhaled the smoke, pipe and cigar smokers did not.

This shows that the ill effects were due to the cigarette smoke entering the lung itself.

Cigarette smoke contains a large number of volatile compounds. Though most of these are burnt out nicotine is not; an average cigarette contains about twenty milligrams of nicotine. Of this amount about two milligrams are absorbed into the blood stream from the lungs. Nicotine releases a group of substances called catecholamines, chiefly from the adrenal glands.

Actions

The catecholamines have the following ac-

tions:—
1. Increase the adhesiveness of the blood platelets. This increases the risk of thrombosis.

2. The blood lipids (fats) that is substances such as cholesterol and triglycerides are increased. This also increases the risk of thrombosis.

3. Increases the rate of beating of the heart and also induces irregular beating of the heart. On an average the heart rate is increased by about 15 beats a minute.

4. The blood pressure is also increased on an average by about 10 mmg.

5. The output of blood by the heart, called the cardiac output, is increased by about 10 per cent.

6. There may be changes in the electrocardiogram (ECG) in about 10 per cent of the people.

All these facts not only chronically increase the work of the heart but also make it work more inefficiently, thus causing an overload on the heart and increasing the chances of a heart attack.

AND AT LAST!

It is heartening to learn that the Authorities have now sanctioned a scheme to extend the existing Omnibus Stand in the Jaffna City. Without commenting on the undue delay to which this proposal has been subjected, we feel it necessary that the Authorities should discuss the plan and the scheme with Representatives of the people in the National State Assembly and delegates of the various Passengers' Associations and Bus Operators' Unions so that the new establishment will be one that befits the status of the Northern City and meets the demands of both travellers and workers

In any event it must be borne in mind by the designers and planners that the present improvised sheds which are a little better than cattle sheds and do not afford any protection from sun or showers have been a disgrace to the entire traffic system of the country. The fact that several thousands of passengers daily use the Central Bus Stand must not be lost sight of. Ample accommodation, with easy facilities for exit and entrance must be made available.

More important is the need for sufficient space for buses to be halted. Attention must be paid to the need for the movement of buses cautiously and at slow speed within the stand as passengers walk about hither and thither often to spot the particular bus for their travel. The instalment of a public address system is another requirement. Every change in the time table such as unavoidable delays of departure of buses owing to break down should be announced.

The importance of the timetable being exhibited with the numbers of bus routes included need not be restated. In addition Bus Routes must be sufficiently described when there are deviations and diversions. We wish to point out that the Passengers' Associations must meet in conference with the Authorities and discuss this subject before the scheme is finalised.

mountain and the pig-mountain; afterwards, by the favour of Siva the waters disappeared and Brahma caused all beings and things as before to re-appear, when also the Chola, Chera and Pandian Kings were restored.

Vankiyasegara Pandian of the race of the Moon was swaying the sceptre in some villages not far when as the number of mankind increased the King besought the Lord to show the boundaries of a town which might receive these as inhabitants. In consequence the Lord came forth from the ancient Lingam, in the form of a religious ascetic with his usual ornaments and with serpents for jewels and stood before the Pandian. To the serpent bound round the wrist of His front hand' He said, "Shew to the Pandian the boundaries of his town." The serpent worshipping the Lord said "Let this town bear my name" which request being granted it fixed its head at the East and evolving its tail, brought it round to its mouth, thus showing to the King the boundaries and then again returned to the wrist of the Lord. The King now built a town having four principal gates or entrances. And to the town was given the name of Alavai (ஆலவாய்) (or Venom mouth). The king built a temple with all usual accompaniment as also the King's streets and streets for the people and ruled like Kulasegara Pandian who first cleared the forest of Kadumbu trees.

If Awakened India needs such a searching analysis, our country requires it still more.)

Cultivate a Spirit of Manliness and Self-Reliance

Stand up, be bold, be strong. Swami Vivekananda urged men everywhere. Take the whole responsibility on your own shoulders, and know that you are the creators of your own destiny. He was a man-maker and his message was strength and manliness. An independent nation, especially one like India which was long enslaved, acutely needs this message. 'What freedom really confers', said Michael Manley, 'is the opportunity to be totally responsible for one's own fate.' We must look within ourselves for the causes of our failures. To hunt for scapegoats is weakness and unmanliness. To insinuate that some outside agency is torpedoing all our constructive

plans for eradication of poverty shows not only political inefficiency but lack of honesty to ourselves. Our countrymen must be brave, manly, and adventurous. 'It is our laziness, quarrelsomeness, greed and selfishness which are responsible for the backwardness and stagnation of our country and economy. Let us overcome our weaknesses and usher in a new era through hard work and discipline' — that should be the type of our approach to national problems. We should drastically limit the receiving of foreign monetary assistance if not altogether stop it. 'Nations like individuals,' wrote Swami Vivekananda to one of his close associates at Madras, must help themselves. This is real patriotism. If a nation cannot do that its time has not yet come. As far as the national economy is concerned, the private sector is as important as the public sector and there should be wholesome cooperation and friendliness between the Government and the private sector. As one eminent economist recently said, 'The Government and the people should think of only one sector and that is the national sector'.

also indirectly affect the heart by its action on the lungs. In the lungs in addition to cancer smoking causes chronic, bronchitis, that is a chronic cough with sputum. When this goes on for a number of years the air sacs in the lungs are damaged giving rise to a condition called emphysema. This condition is serious and may affect the heart in two ways. It reduces the amount of oxygen absorbed by the lung and it increases the pressure against which the heart has to work. When this goes on for a number of years heart failure is the result.

In summary it may be said that it has been proved beyond all doubt that cigarette smoking affects the heart both directly and by its action, the lungs.
