MR. G. G. PONNAMBALAM AND PRESENT POLITICAL SITUATION

In an earlier communication, I ventured to draw the attention of the public to the desirability of obtaining the advice and assistance of Mr. G. G. Ponnambalam, Q. C. President of the All Ceylon Tamil Congress which organization is said to be a constituent member of the Tamil United Front — Mr. Ponnambalam's record of service has been long and distinguished. Years have elapsed since his entry into the political arena.

He now belongs to a generation, whose services may not be known well to all of the present younger generation.

It appears to be a duty on the part of an ordinary citizen like the humble undersigned to recall that Mr Ponnambalam along with the late Sir Arumugabalam Mahadeva. Mr. Narsinga Sivadurai, Gate Mudaliyar G. S. Subramaniam and Mr. A. V. Kulasingham were among those greatly responsible for the lifting of the Boycott of Parliamentary seats by the

Northern Constituencies and the holding of bye elections for those constituencies about forty one years ago. Thereafter, he was one of the Chief Founders and the first President of the All Ceylon Tamil Congress which position he is continuing to hold even now without any break.

The Tamil Congress was the parent of the Federal Party.

For years, he was acclaimed as the accredited representative and Leader of the Tamil Community

in Ceylon. In addition to his invaluable services both in and out of the Legislature, characterized by extraordinary independence and courage, he went to the United Kingdom at his own expense at least on three different occasions to urge upon the British Parliament and people the cause of the Tamils and for a proper Constitution for the entire country. He was successful on two occasions and enlisted support for the cause in

and out of the British Parliament among all political parties in the United Kingdom.

His activities on his first trip were such as to evoke the praise of an eminent person and a trusted old-time colleague and an early biographer of Mahatma Gandhi like the late H. L. S. Polak who wrote to late Mr G. R. Motha, former Member of the State Council and one of the great leaders of the Indian

Community in Ceylon that Mr. Ponnambalam's services were performed single handed and splendid and were of an inspiring nature.

For years, Mr. Ponnambalam in his single personality embodied the spirit of Tamil manliness and unbending Independence against the unwise chauvinism on the part of others. As Minister, he rendered very useful service of constructive nature. He also spoke in an official capacity at the United Nations on behalf of Sri Lanka.

The whirling of time brings its chances and Mr. Ponnambalam suffered

Flower From West Germany

The Government of Sri Lanka, which has recently been buying wheat flour in Europe, to build a buffer stock for difficult days ahead, is shortly to receive a gift of nearly 10,000 tons of flour from the Federal Republic of Germany.

Sri Lanka's own ships will be used for bringing part of this gift to this country. The first two shipments, during the current month, will be on German ships, and the next two, in September and October, will be on Sri Lanka's vessels.

Sabhai's Appeal for People's Co-operation to Meet Rising Cost of Living

"In the context of the request of the Government that the people of this country should be prepared to meet the crisis in the supply of articles of food that is consequent on the soaring rise in the cost of living and the added circumstances of failure of rains and the lack of foreign exchange, the Jaffna Saiva Paripalana Sabhai humbly appeals to all the people of Sri Lanka fully to cooperate among themselves without distinction of race and religion in order to tide over the serious situation and suggests that short term subsidiary and substitute foodstuffs should be produced to make up for the short supply of rice and flour and that extreme precaution should be taken to use grains austere and preserve balance stocks for future use"

This resolution was moved by Shri V. Ragnathamudaliyar and seconded by Shri S. P. Kandiah at the monthly meeting of the Committee of Management of the Jaffna Saiva Paripalana Sabhai held on September 16, 1973 with T. Somasundaram President of the Sabhai in the chair. It was unanimously adopted.

UNSOLVED

The question of the demands of the Tamil speaking people for their legitimate and due rights has not been answered. The problem remains unsolved—These are facts; and facts are indisputable. But facts must be faced. No longer can this matter of paramount importance be allowed to be ignored.

Here arises the subsidiary question how and by whom has this to be resolved. Without delving deep into the political history of this Island since the day it lost its independence to foreign rulers let us confine our attention to the events after the withdrawal of alien rule. Almost a quarter of a century has passed without any final and workable formula having been found for the just aspirations of the Tamil speaking people to be realized. Political agitation have been continuous, there have been bickerings, struggles almost became skirmishes. The climax of the conflicting situation had been reached when the New Constitution was adopted without the consent of a large majority of the elected representatives of the Tamil speaking people. After this major event that has placed the Tamil speaking people in a handicapped position, the prospects of the problem being solved even in a minor way have receded owing to sharp differences of opinion among the different political parties that represent the Tamil speaking people. But this dissension, this disagreement, this disunity should not be allowed to damage the vital cause of the Tamil speaking people. The formation of the Tamil United Front and the sustained efforts of some distinguished non-party men to effect a concerted effort for resolving the question however will go a long way to find a way out of this impasse.

The launching of the 'Fasting Campaign' by the Youth Front brings into the spotlight of public attention the misgivings that are worrying the mind of the youth. Such patriotic campaigns will certainly be able to evoke a sense of true service to the country.

At this juncture we feel proud to refer our readers back to the suggestions we had made in the past on several occasions that outstanding political problems of this nature and importance can be solved only by collective thinking and that Conferences of all parties and personalities must be held summoned by someone who is above party politics. We had ventured to suggest the name of the President of our Republic for this purpose. And we repeat here the suggestion and we wish that non political associations and persons take immediate steps in this direction. Unsolved problems can yet be solved.

CULTIVATE MORE - CALL OF THE COUNTRY

We continue to lay stress on this subject, the supreme need of the nation. That there is a crisis in the economic front cannot be denied; and that it is existing all the world over is admitted. Why and the wherefore of this strange and sudden development should be left to scientists and statisticians for their study and scanning. But there is a great duty cast on those who have to bear the brunt of this misfortune. It is futile and childish to try to place the blame on someone or to trace the adverse development to the activities of previous Governments. The people and even politicians know well and fully that agricultural and industrial progress has been made since the attainment of freedom from foreign yoke. It is now left to us all to strive to make new and greater strides in the march to agricultural self sufficiency. Every responsible person has suggested to the people that they should put their shoulders to the wheel of production and make it move forward. The soil is there, the man-power is there, natural resources in the form of tanks and rivers are there; all that remains to be done is a nationwide effort to harness all available resources and to tap mother earth for her bounty. Nature may become now and then hostile; monsoons may fail, droughts may bring distress; but the courage of the countrymen need not be completely convulsed.

In this connection we refer to the resolution that was unanimously adopted at a meeting of the Committee of Management of the Jaffna Saiva Paripalana Sabhai calling upon the people to the need for more cultivation. Religious Associations have rightly decided to make this patriotic appeal as the country's economic stability is a prerequisite for spiritual progress and religious propaganda. We wish to point out to the people that in as much as there is compulsory enthusiasm for increased and full cultivation, there is comparatively no attempt to be austere in the matter of living. Several thousands of rupees are wantonly wasted on entertainments, feasts and frivolities. Mass feeding should not be undertaken except in the restricted sense of the poor and the holy devotees being distributed alms.

Red-tapism has always been a dampening agent on the people's movement for progressive works. Agricultural implements such as ploughs, tractors, water pumps, manure, seeds must be made available to the genuine cultivator. Every assistance must be given to him at all levels. The levying of taxes and the imposing of other levies on agricultural and industrial enterprises must be reexamined in the present circumstances. To sum up the scheme, there should be complete co-operation everywhere of the Administrative Authorities and the people, with the motto "each one must earn his food" before them.

ARMY AND ANNOYING EVENTS

What could be termed a pandemonium was suddenly released on a mass of unsuspecting spectators in the course of a football match in the Jaffna City last week. How it started and why the playground became a battlefield are questions for the Police to enquire into. But the second chapter of the unfortunate incident is a matter for the attention of the public. Did Army men run amok and were innocent people who were in the City subjected to severe assaults? That the Army men were ordered to remain in their barracks indicated that their presence in the City was not desirable. Army is always expected to be a protecting force. The only exception is when it is engaged in a declared war. Army men are also subject to discipline. How was it that they violated discipline?

They Harm the Heart

1. Coffee drinkers are more susceptible to heart attacks than even cigarette smokers—Coffee is believed to be a causative agent of heart diseases because it alters fats in the blood. The blood level of cholesterol is in direct proportion to the coffee intake of an individual.
2. Experiments conducted by the World Health Organisation show that soft water drinkers are more inclined to get heart trouble than those who drink hard water drawn from wells, reservoirs and rivers. Soft water which is low in calcium and magnesium salts is more acidic. Further it could absorb cadmium and lead from the pipes it flows through and this could make it dangerous.
3. Sudden vigorous activity without gradual warming up can be hazardous even for a healthy heart. In a Los Angeles medical experiment 3, out of 44 cases studies developed abnormalities in the electrocardiograph after abruptly engaging in a strenuous physical workout.
4. If you are overweight, don't starve. Complete starvation to lose weight while reducing excess fat in the body also severely damages important muscle tissue including those of the heart. A 20 year old girl fasted for 30 weeks to reduce her weight and died of a heart attack. The post mortem showed her heart muscles were severely damaged. In addition to such permanence and durability of the structure also comes in. Further, it has been said that the devotional spirit of worshippers undergoes a great change for the better by the reason of the psychic effects caused by a granite temple on the minds and hearts of worshippers. It has been said that granite has a certain element of life in it and is capable of influencing the minds and hearts of individuals; with the passage of time granite is said to get more and more saturated with the spirit of holiness in an increasing measure which is radiated in the atmosphere and on the worshippers. This virtue may not exist to the same extent in structures other than those of granite.
