Dowry System Decried in Diamond Jubilee Speech

Statue in Jaffna For Sir P. Ramanathan

A very large gathering of old girls and present pupils including their parents listened attentively to Dr. S. Ananda Rajan as he emphatically pleaded for the abolition of the practice of dowry being insisted on as a pre requisite for bringing about alliance of marriage. The learned Doctor went on to describe how the happiness of a married life is denied to girls merely because their parents cannot find the necessary money to meet the excessive demands of suitors.

Shrimathi Sri Kantha presiding over the third day function of the Diamond Jubilee Celebration at Ramanathan College saw in her Alma

Gurus in their inspired teachings and stated that Ramanathan College as a Temple of True Learning was a divine gift to the people of Sri Lanka. She concluded her speech referring to Sir Ramanathan as a national hero who worked for the entire nation and as pioneer in making Ramanathan a vast paddy field.

"The people of Jaffna and the persons who lay claim to leadership are guilty of rank ingratitude as they have so far during the last forty years not thought of remembering their Greatest Leader either at All Jaffna Public Meeting or by erecting a statue for him" Thus re-

marked Sri R. N. Sivapirakasam. He added that public meetings were held in every nook and corner to urge the erecting of statues for every Dick, Tom and Harry but not a word had been said about a statue for Sir Ramanathan. He, however, remarked that they should console themselves by the thought that the great patriotic and philanthropic gifts of Sir Ramanathan, the two eminent colleges and the several Saiva Shrines stand as so many statues.

Shri S. Ambikaipahan referred to the holy back ground behind the greatness of Sir Ramanathan particularly the contact Sir Ramanathan had with Sri La Sri Ikkana Swamigal Shri Sivapragasapillai, Secretary of the Parent Teachers Association proposed a vote of thanks.

Fourth International Conference Seminar of Tamil Studies

The Fourth International Conference of the International Association for Tamil Research (IATR) is to be held in Jaffna, Sri Lanka from 3rd to 9th January, 1974.

The Conference is being organized by the Sri Lanka National Unit of the IATR. More than 150 research scholars from 45 countries abroad who had sent in the preliminary Registration Forms for the Conference in order to present Papers or otherwise to participate, have been sent the Final Notices etc.

It is estimated that more than 600 scholars, both foreign and local, will be attending the Academic Sessions, while more than two lakhs of members of the local public will be attending the Cultural Programmes, Exhibitions, etc.

A considerable sum of money is expected as foreign exchange by way of registration fees, travel payments, and sale of

souvenirs. Effective steps are being taken to hold the Conference in an atmosphere of national and international unity and cultural interchange devoid of politics.

More than a hundred Papers are under preparation by local researchers engaged in all aspects of Tamil Studies, with a view to presenting them at the Conference.

The last three Conferences in the series were held in Kuala Lumpur, Tamil Nadu, and Paris respectively.

Following established traditions, the President of Sri Lanka, Mr. William Gopallawa, as constitutional Head of the Government of the Host Country, is being invited

to ceremonially open the Conference.

Steps are being taken to obtain the co-operation of the Sri Lanka Ministries of Defence & External Affairs, Finance, Education, Cultural Affairs, Tourism, Broadcasting, Posts, Communications, and Public Administration, the Foreign Embassies and others interested in Tamil Studies, regarding arrangements for the Conference.

A copious Souvenir Volume is under preparation to commemorate the occasion. Unlike the last three conferences the Sri Lanka Conference is being organised on very modest and austere lines, in keeping with the economic and other difficulties now faced by the country.

FIRST THINGS FIRST

Reverting back to the most pressing problem of the moment we are now able to say that the reaction of the people to the changing circumstances of economic stress is one of realization of the need to throw in the whole weight in a bold all out effort to produce what the country requires. The people feel it their national duty to pay their full attention to problems that demand immediate action.

Producing articles of food must necessarily be a long term program. However, the nature of the present crisis calls for short term endeavours of sustained attention in order that grains, yams, roots and fruits may be made available at the shortest time. Such a food drive to be a sure success calls for priority. Consequently all other questions will have to wait for a while. We have, in these columns, full many a time and oft, suggested that all activities that require expenditure of large sums of money particularly for the provision of food and do not allow the participants the time needed for cultivation must be postponed for better times. Undivided attention has to be paid by each member of every household to the task of producing articles of food not merely for themselves but also for others. In this process more work has to be done as lands that have been lying fallow or that have been considered as unproductive must be brought under cultivation. Rocky lands, marshy plots, excavated hollow places, ditches, trenches all of them must be prepared for cultivation to be commenced almost immediately. This effort is a measure necessitated by what is commonly called Emergency which time is self-suggestive and excludes as long as that situation continues all work on other matters. The directive that functions in schools requiring entertainment at tea or lunch or dinner and effort on the part of the teachers and the students should not be organized is a correct decision. What applies to schools also must apply to other institutions. First things demand attention first.

Another suggestion we make bold to make in this context is that the Fourth International Conference Seminar on Tamil Studies which is scheduled to be held in Jaffna during the first week of January 1974 can be conveniently postponed to the latter part of 1974 as it will be unwise and inopportune to commit the entire population of the North and the East to a heavy, expenditure and exacting program that is spread over a week and participated by a large number of scholars and research students from all over the world. We also learn that several office bearers have resigned their offices and that even the eminent Tamil scholar who has been devoting his entire time and energy during the past decade on this Research Conference has himself tendered his resignation from the post of Secretary of the Sri Lanka Branch. If these differences of opinion exist, it is all the more necessary that the Conference should be postponed and a broad based new committee should be formed to handle this subject to the satisfaction of all.

Resolutions that were unanimously Adopted at the Annual General Meeting of the Jaffna Saiva Paripalana Sabhai on October 11, 1973

Kathaprasangam Over the Radio

1. This Sabhai requests the Sri Lanka Broadcasting Corporation to restore to the Tamil program the item "Kathaprasangam" Musical Discourses as had been the practice till 1972. These Musical Discourses bring out an exposition of Saiva Tenets and are set to music. They had been in vogue earlier and were very popular.

Saiva Magazines from South India

2. This Sabhai requests the Government to permit the readers of Saiva Magazines such as Siththantham, Gnana Sambantham, Kumarakuruparan, Thirukoil, Thiruppugal, Amirtham and Arudkatal subscribe to them and obtain them in Sri Lanka and further requests that foreign exchange permit for this purpose be sanctioned.

Navar Kovil

This Sabhai resolves that immediate steps be taken to complete the buildings for the Navar Shrine in the premises of the Navalar Ashram on the foundation laid by Siththam-Viththakar Kayapakkam, Shri M Somasundaran Chettiar on 28-5-1969 and that further donations in addition to the sum of

Navalar Culture Centre

4. The Sabhai requests the Government to make early provision for the construction of the Navalar Memorial Culture Centre for which the foundation stone was laid last November in the premises where Sri La Sri Arumuga Navalar was born. The Centre is intended for the purpose of preserving the historic land, the several publications and writings of the Great Navalar and his personal belongings.

'Stop Animal Sacrifice' Move

5. The Sabhai resolves that the sacrifice of animals in shrines now prevailing in a few Temples should be completely stopped and for that purpose invites the co-operation of all Saiva Organizations in that social and religious service and for setting about this campaign in a planned manner.

Ban Liquor and Meat on Religious Holidays

6. The Sabhai resolves that the Government should be requested to declare the Maha Sivarathiri day and the day following to be Public Holidays and also to ban the sale of liquor and meat on those days.

Sanitation and Health Strictures must be Observed

Incidence of Cholera Outbreak Should be Immediately Controlled

Unheard of in recent years, the reported outbreak of cholera in certain parts of Karsinagar and adjoining areas calls for the most careful and immediate medical attention and public precaution.

The Health Authorities have already commenced a total onset against this dreadful disease. The public will have to respond to the administrative demands with a sense of human responsibility. Carelessness, neglect, indifference on the part of the people will hinder the efforts of the Administrative Authorities.

The people must be cautioned against insanitary habits, failure to get inoculated against infectious diseases, travelling to prohibited places, eating outside their homes drinking water from wells in proclaimed areas, over the radio. The Government Agent, the Medical Authorities and the Police also must make necessary arrangements for proper information to be placed before the people.

More important is the responsibility of the people to report to the proper authorities suspected cases without loss of time.

Prevention and cure must go together. Prayer to the Almighty must accompany all these efforts.
