Democratic process of parliamentary government includes full and free discussion of debatable disputes between the Government and the Opposition. We have before us the classic example of the return of Sheik Abdullah of Kashmir to Parliamentary procedure after a very acute divergence of views has been solved at the lofty level of statesmanship that was made possible by the Premier of India.

There may be several issues of divergent claims to be settled in our country. But the expedience of a General Election to solve the problem would be the nearest approach in such circumstances Notwithstanding the provisions of the Constitution, the desire of the people to express their present views by means of the accepted medium of parliamentary poll calls for attention of the Government.

Members of the Opposition need not resort to the indirect way of compelling the Government to call for a General Election by resigning their seats in the Assembly either individually or en b.oc. Nor need the Government explore the ways of nullifying such efforts of the Opposition by introducing Legislation to prevent Members who voluntarily resign their membership from seeking re-election at by-elections that follow such resigna-tion.
