#### Indo Ceylon Tobacco Talks

We understand that the Prime Minister had sanctioned the proposal to send a delegation to meet the Prime Minister of India about the Jaffna Malayalam Tobacco Trade. The delegation to India would consist of Mr. S. Natesan Minister of Post and Information, Mr. V. Coomaraswamy Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Food and Agriculture, Mr. T. C. Rajaratnam President of the Jaffna Malayalee Tobacco Co-operative Sa'es Society and Mr. R. C. S. Cooke Assistant Registrar of Cooperative Societies of Jaffer

The Government of India has restricted the import of Jaffna Tobacco to 1,800,00 candies in 1950 and an annual reduction of 10 per cent of the quantity at concessional rates and by 1961 this society will have to cease functioning automatically.

Therefore this delegation is going to plead with the Prime Minister of India to permit this society to import an economic quantity annually for the benefit of its members who are small cultivators in the Jaffna Peninsula.
